The German wins by exiting 10 CVP between A3 and C1 included. Standard rules 13 CVP. Armor rules 16 CVP.

Mala zemlya

Stanichka, USSR, February 4, 1943

On February 4th a combined Soviet operation aiming to encircle German troops in Koban fails almost completely. Only a small party of marines successfully lands in the very heart of Novorossik haven. Major Kunikov (Translator's note: not sure about the rank in english) soldiers set position in a school in Stanichka and prepare to face the expected German counterstrike. A detachment of Grenadier Regiment 186 is sent to reduce the bridgehead but the Soviets efficiently stop their progress. The Germans then encircle the school. The defenders fight very hard buying time for reinforcements to land. The Soviets under commissar Brejnev will hold the bridgehead, christened "Mala zemlya" (the small land), until the end.

Only rows A-P are playable.

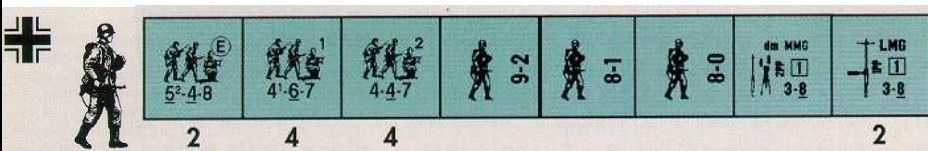
★ Russian sets up first ✚ German moves first

Special rules: weather is Wet with no wind at start.

Scenario designed by Jean Devaux and Philippe Naud

Standard version: Russians: add a 6-2-8, a Hero (A15.2), a DC (A23), five "?" (A12.1-A12.11) and two Fortified Locations (B23.9). Russian MMC are commandos (H1.24) and all of them have Assault/Spray Fire (A7.36, A9.5). **Germans:** replace the 5-4-8 with two 8-3-8 Assault Engineers (H1.22) and add two DC's (A23) and one FT (A22).

Armored rules: standard version plus **Russians:** add a 45L AT (Russian gun note 7), a 2-2-8 and an ATR (C13.2). Russians set up between B10 and P2 included. **Germans:** add a Pz 38(t)E (German vehicle note 8).
