PASSPORT RUBBER STAMPS & REVENUE STAMPS

Visas were usually rubber stamps, and sometimes a revenue stamp (similar to a postage stamp) was affixed to show that a fee had been paid.

If you are as insane about detail as some of us at the HPLHS are, you might want to consider having actual rubber stamps made. Many stationery stores and print shops provide this service, and it's not terribly expensive.

Print on ordinary white paper. Take any or all of the six designs at the top of the page and have actual rubber stamps made. Hand-write a date into the blank space in the top three designs.

Art or craft supply stores often sell special scissors that will cut an edge that looks like a postage stamp. **Cut out** revenue stamps at left, with such scissors, if desired, and glue them into passport.
