star fields

a stargazing game for the solo dreamer and wisher

requirements

- binoculars
- paper in a book with a solid cover or on a clipboard— Just something strong enough to write on while lying down and looking up
- pen that will be sufficiently visible in low light—perhaps a felt-tipped pen, but thicker than a regular ballpoint pen
- a dark sky on a clear night
- comfortable ground to lie on—or blankets, mats, or padding—and suitable clothes for lying still on it for a while
- 30 minutes or all night

how to play

- lie on your back on the ground with your equipment in reach
- 2 repeat the following steps four times
 - Look through the binoculars at the stars
 - •• Settle on a star field that appeals to you
 - •••• Stare at it until you feel you have it memorised
 - •••• Quickly get your paper and draw dots for the positions of the stars as you remember them
 - ••••• Turn the page one quarter turn anticlockwise
 - ••••• Use the stars as the basis for drawing of the following each turn—It could be joining the dots like a constellation or using them as inspiration for something more freeform
 - an animal
 - •• a building
 - ••• a person
 - •••• an object
- 3 tell yourself a story that connects these four images
- 4 look through the binoculars and scan the sky until you find a star field that feels like it suits the story
- 5 look at it for a bit longer than feels natural
