| 1 | Learning Of Our Kind: Arctic Dwarves | This white leather bound tome discusses the race of Arctic Dwarves that are found around the Great Glacier Area of Faerun. They tend to be smaller in stature than other dwarves, but also more physically powerful. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 2 | King Battlehammer: Legends and Lore Aengis Fang | This book is bound in orange rusty leather. In it, contains the story of Aengis Fang, the dwarven thrower that King Battlehammer made for son, Wulfgar. This book is written in Dwarfish and contains some of the prayers the Bruenor said to Moradin while making this weapon. |
| 3 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Clangeddin Silverbeard | This book is made of thinly hammered silver and discusses Clangeddin Silverbeard: Clangeddin is the dwarven deity of battle and honor in warfare. He is known as the Father of Battle and the Lord of the Twin Axes. His holy symbol is two crossed battleaxes. He delights in battle, although does not tolerate treachery or deceit, and expects his followers to do the same. Followers of Clangeddin hate giants and train their fellow dwarves in special ways to fight them. The book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 4 | Crafters Of Our People: Jemel Ganza | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This depicts Jemel working with various dwarven wizards to remove curses bestowed upon ancient dwarven weapons. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 5 | Dwarven Clan Law Vol: IV | This is a heavy slate binder that has each law engraved into the pages. This binder discusses the law: "A dwarf shall never act against any other dwarf, of any clan, by aiding or using the aid of non-dwarven creatures. This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |
| 6 | Gauntlgrym to Shadowdale | This rolled up map is tattooed on light purple skin and gives detailed directions from the main halls of GauntIgrym all the way to a cave near the Hangman's Knoll area of Shadowdale. The map provides for rest areas and provides details on fungus that is safe to eat that is native to the trail. This map is written in Dwarfish. |
| 7 | The Lost Cache Of Goink Toesplode | This book contains the random scribblings of the famous gnome alchemist, Goink Toesplode. Hidden inside the binding of the book, one finds a map to a hidden cache of Oil of Impact deep in the Underdark. The map is written in Gnomish. |
| 8 | Folio of Brass | Tellar Moendath of Luskan discuss the variety of ways to smelt copper and zinc to create brass at various purities. This book is written in Common. |
| 9 | Hammers By Our Hand: Delzoun's Fist | This book describes the legendary hammer Delzoun's Fist. Wielding this hammer gave the user strength greater than that of a Hill Giant and gave them the ability to cast certain spells from it. Wielders that used the hammer against opponents that were not of evil alignment started to feel negative side effects such as rapid ageing and poor health. This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |

| 10 | An Old Warrior's Way | Dathlance of Selgaunt writes about his staunch views of warriors using magic, outside of enchanted weapons and armor. This book is written in Common. |
| 11 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Thard Harr | The cover of this book is made from a deep green python skin and discusses Thard's role in the dwarven pantheon: Thard Harr is the dwarven god of jungle survival and hunting, and is the patron of the wild dwarves. He watches over them and works to ensure their continued survival. His followers revere the jungles they live in and do their best to live in harmony with and to protect the jungles from outsiders who would do it harm. His followers tend to be suspicious and isolationist, and are rarely willing to interact with outsiders. The book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 12 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Sharindlar | This book is made of thinly hammered bronze discusses Sharindlar: Sharindlar, also known as the Lady of Life and Mercy, is the chaotic good dwarven deity of healing and mercy. Sharindlar represents an aspect of dwarven life rarely seen by others. Her command of fertility expands her clergy's influence over animal husbandry along with developing new varieties of crops. The book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 13 | Great Big Book Of Battleragers | This book talks about the chaotic dwarven fighters known as the battleragers or Kuldjargh in their native Dwarvish, which literally translates to "axe idiot". Famous Battleragers discussed are Thibbledorf Pwent, Crunch, and Oretheo Spikes. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 14 | Hammerfoes Hardtack | This is a small paper chapbook that has a number of recipes for travel rations hastily written in Dwarvish. The chapbook smells faintly of bacon. |
| 15 | Hammers By Our Hand: Runehammer Faerindyl | This book describes the legendary Runehammer Alhalbrin. A user of this darksteel hammer could strike their opponent, giving a large shower of flames as if the hammer could cast the Burning Hands spell. This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |
| 16 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Haela Brightaxe | This book is made of thinly hammered iron that has been painted yellow with a sword embossed into the cover and discusses Haela's role in the dwarven pantheon: Haela Brightaxe is the matron of good-aligned dwarves who love battle and who live to cleanse Toril of evil monsters. Haelan clerics fight monsters whenever they find them, either to destroy the evil beast, or just for the thrill of battle. Haela, as a goddess of luck, takes great risks in the battles she fights. Most of her clergy are women and are called "blood- maidens". The book is written in Dwarfish. |

| 19 | Map Of The Fardrimm | This is a one foot by one foot quartz slab about an inch thick. This provides a map of the ancient road of the Fardrimm, the network of tunnels built by the Delzoun that scrolls, shrink and enlarges based on the users finger movements upon it. The names however, are in Netherese. |
| 20 | Crafters Of Our People: Azan Stonesplitter | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This tome depicts Azan Stonesplitter, the owner and proprietor of Ironhand's Arms, a weapon shop in Highcastle. His store offers quality weapons at fair prices for the local Dalesmen and travelers who often pass through on the road between Cormyr and Sembia. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 21 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Martham- mor Duin | This book is made green leather with a fur lined inner jacket and discusses Marthammor's role in the dwarven pantheon: Marthammor Duin is the young dwarven god of wanderers and patron of dwarves who leave their clan holds to explore the world. He is also known as Finder-of-Trails, Watcher over Wanderers and the Watchful Eye. The book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 22 | Learning Of Our Kind: Duergar | This black leather tome is written in Dwarfish and discusses the origins of the Duergar. In -8100 DR, Clan Duergar separated themselves from their brethren and eventually were captured by Mind Flayers. During their captivity, which lasted for generations, the mind flayers performed many cruel and unusual experiments on the dwarves. It was during this harsh period of their history that the duergar emerged as a distinct subrace. |
| 23 | Learning Of Our Kind: Dream Dwarves | This earth brown leather tome discusses Dream Dwarves. Dream Dwarves are very rare in Faerun, and although what they lack in traditional dwarf aptitude in craftsmanship, they more than make up for in attunement to the earth when they are able to enter a state of consciousness known as the earth dream. They usually end up becoming druids who hold Moradin as well as Chauntea in high regards. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 24 | Of Sigurd | Sigurad of Earthfast writes about his love of firewine and strong ales found in the country of Rashemen. This book is written in Common. |
| 25 | The Gods Of Our Stock: The Fallen Abbathor | This book is made of thinly hammered iron that is has been burned and is sooty to the touch: Abbathor, also known as the Great Master of Greed, was the neutral evil dwarven god of greed before becoming an exarch of Bane. He was an intensely greedy deity and was both desirous and envious of others' riches. Abbathor and his followers believed in the acquisition of all forms of wealth by any and all means necessary. The book is written in Dwarfish. |

| 26 | Briantmantie | This brass clockwork book opens up and turns its own pages when the key is wound up in it's spine. Dugmaren Brightmantle is also known as the Errant Explorer, and is the dwarven deity of scholarship, discovery and invention. Dugmaren Brightmantle signifies the exploratory striving to blaze the trails of creativity by using accumulated knowledge to create that which is new and good. Brightmantle represents the progressive elements of a race that sometimes prides itself to adhering to old ways. The book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 27 | Bromm and Harnoth: The Two Brothers Of Citadel Adbar | This book discusses the twin rulers of Citadel Adbar: Bromm and Harnoth. When Bromm, the elder brother was slain, Harnoth ruled alone. This book is written in Common. |
| 28 | Kings and Queens Of Mithril Hall: Garumn Battlehammer | This is 3 ring binder made of mithril with then sheets of the same material engraved with text. Garum Battlehammer was the sixth king of Mithril Hall, and led the mining expedition into the Underdark that ultimately released Haerinvureem, better known as Shimmergloom, a shadow dragon who arose from the depths of the Underdark and ultimately took over Mithril Hall, causing the Battlehammer dwarves to flee. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 29 | Battered Bones and Scattered Skulls: The Life of a Dwarven Champion Vol I | Rauthglur Ormyndake writes of Regart Stoneshield, the earliest of dwarven champions born around 300 DR. In this volume, the time of Regart's birth to when he joined his first battalion is documented. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 30 | King Battlehammer: Legends and Lore The Kings Shield | This book is bound in orange rusty leather. In it, contains the story of the kings shield, which after it was blessed by Moradin, was able to produce dwarven beer that provides strength to the drinker. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 31 | Learning Of Our Kind: Aquatic Dwarves | This is a blue leather tome that is slightly damn to the touch and discusses Aquatic Dwarves. Aquatic Dwarves are thought to be extinct and have not been since a time in Faerun's history known as the First Flowering. Aquatic Dwarves were known to have dark green or blue skin, with webbed feet and hands. Although the gills in their necks and ribs enabled them to breathe in water, they also had the ability to breathe air as well. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 32 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Berronar Truesilver | This book is made of thinly hammered gold and discusses Berronar's role in the dwarven pantheon: Berronar is Moradin's bride and as such the matriarch of the dwarven pantheon. The Revered Mother acts as an authority figure for the other dwarven gods and uses her skills in negotiation as a way to keep the pantheon unified if tensions may rise. The book is written in Dwarfish. |

| 33 | Hammers of Moradin | This book has the holy symbol of Moradin on the cover and discusses the warpriests known as the Hammers of Moradin. Different than defenders, Hammers actively sought the dwarves' enemies, namely goblinoids, drow elves and evil giants, and destroyed them within their respective realms. |
| 34 | Maerin Of Illusk | This dusty, crumbly tome describes the acts of Maerin of Illusk and her cooperation of the Delzoun dwarves to build GauntIgrym around the legendary fire primordial, Maegera. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 35 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Moradin | This book is made of thinly hammered platinum and contains the creed of Moradin: "Moradin is the father and creator of the dwarven race. Honor him by emulating his principles and workmanship in smithing, stoneworking, and other tasks. Wisdom is derived from life and tempered with experience. Advance the dwarven race in all areas of life. Innovate with new processes and skills. Found new kingdoms and clan lands, defending the existing ones from all threats. Lead the dwarves in the traditions laid down by the Soul Forger. Honor your clan leaders as you honor Moradin." The book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 36 | Hammers By Our Hand: Dumathoin's Wrath | This book describes the legendary Dumathoin's Wrath throwing hammer. A goodly follower of Dumathoin received a number of benefits from this hammer, including combining the effects of a Dwarven Thrower and Holy Avenger (but against giants) per the Dungeon Master's guide. In addition, the wielder also could walk wearing platemail but have not have any of the penalties to stealth associated with this armor type. This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |
| 37 | Crafters Of Our People: Tred McKnuckles | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This tome depicts Tred, who was known for the twin throwing hammers (Nixxie and Trixie) that he wore on each of his shoulders. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 38 | Crafters Of Our People: Krystryd Mithralforge | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This tome depicts Krystryd, a blacksmith in the village of Quaervarr who fought undead such as phantoms and ghosts. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 39 | Learning Of Our Kind: Wild Dwarves | This book is caked in mud and is difficult to open. Wild dwarves live in the jungles of Chult and wear very little, if any, clothing, and grease their tattoo-covered dark skin to keep away insects and make themselves slippery. They often plaster themselves, skin and hair, with dried mud, which serves as a surprisingly effective armor. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 40 | Treaty of Garumn's Gorge | This treaty was signed in 1372 DR by the dwarves and the orcs of the Garumn's Gorge area to recognize the orc Kingdom of Many Arrows and outline rules for maintaining peace in the area. This treaty is written in Dwarfish, Orcish, and Common. |

This tome depicts Rhundorth, a blacksmith who was captured by the Cult Of The Black Earth during the Elemental Evil Crisis who eventually breaks free. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 42 | Battered Bones and Scattered Skulls: The Life of a Dwarven Champion Vol II | Rauthglur Ormyndake writes of Regart Stoneshield, the earliest of dwarven champions born around 300 DR. In this volume, Regart leaves the military ranks of his clan and goes on a life of adventuring. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 43 | Underdark Caravans | This book is a manifesto of items coming in from other dwarven citadels and holdings to trade with Citadel Adbar. The list included fresh fruit, grains, and vegetables which were not readily available in Adbar. This book is written in Common. |
| 44 | The Lost Cache Of Bobongo Felsmasher | Inside this scroll case is a map that leads to a small treasure chest hidden in the cubby hole of a cave in Mithril Hall. Inside there is a small locket that alerts the wearer if a demonic presence is near. This map is written in Dwarfish |
| 45 | Caring For Dwarven Children | This small leather reader provides instructions on how to make wooden swords, shields, axes, and hammers for small dwarven children. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 46 | The Story Of Maegera | This red leather tome tells the story of Maegera, the fire primordial that powers the forges of Gauntlgrym. The story reveals that after the last war between gods and primordials, Maegera, tired of fighting and uninterested in following its fellow primordials to the world of Abeir, entered in a coma-like sleep beneath the Crags in Northwest Faerûn in the area that would be known as Gauntlgrym centuries later. The remaining pages in the book are burned and illegible. This books written in an old dialect of dwarfish. |
| 47 | Ores Book | This is a blank chapbook that glows faintly of magic. When ever one writes the name of a particular metal in Dwarfish in the book, the ink for that word changes to match the type of metal described (writing the word 'gold' will change the ink for that work into gold). |
| 48 | The Lost Cache Of Bobert Ironsmelt | This false book contains a miniature halberd that the author describes as a toothpick. However when the magical phrase "Iron Stag" is mentioned, the halberd grows in size that is appropriate to it's wielder. This book is written in Common. |
| 49 | Hammers By Our Hand: Avenging Hammer | This book describes the legendary Avenging Hammer. This book discusses a legendary hammer that when thrown or swung against and opponent who is wearing metal armor, sometimes the hammer shatters that metal armor, exposing its wearer . This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |

This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 51 | Schematics Of Citadel Felbarr | These blueprints are rolled tightly into a leather tube. In common, each blueprint is clearly labeled for each piece of the fortress: The Hammer, The Anvil, The Runegate, The North Vigil, The South Vigil, The Hall Of Ceremony, and The Cemetery. |
| 52 | Hammers By Our Hand: Runehammer Thundaril | This book describes the legendary Runehammer Alhalbrin. A user of this darksteel hammer could strike their opponent, and transform them into either a snail or a toad. This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |
| 53 | Crafters Of Our People: Hada Forgebreath | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This depicts Hada fighting the Cult of The Crushingwave in Mulmaster. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 54 | Learning Of Our Kind: Gold Dwarves | Light brown leather binds this book and discusses the race of dwarves known as Gold Dwarves. Gold dwarves tend to be distinguishable by their light brown or tanned skin, significantly darker than that of most dwarves, and their brown or hazel eyes. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 55 | The Lost Cache Of Aerie Peaksmasher | Inside this scroll case is a map that leads to small nest of baby griffins that the author was raising shortly before he died in the mountains near Arabel. This map is written in Dwarfish |
| 56 | Crafters Of Our People: Berl Cuttler | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This depicts the adventures of Berl Cutter, working to instill reform against Hillsfar's laws against non humans. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 57 | Learning Of Our Kind: Urdunnir | This book appears to be very weathered and has not withstood the tests of time. This book discusses creatures of legend created by Dumathoin from the shield dwarves that lived in Shanatar. After their creation, the urdunnirin went into the depths of the Underdark, never to be seen again. Urdunnirin are said to be similar in statue to shield dwarves, with stone gray skin and eyes of silver. This book is written in Dwarvish. |
| 58 | The Gods Of Our Stock: Tharmekhûl | This book is made of thinly hammered cobalt and discusses Tharmekhûl. Tharmekhûl is the personal assistant of Moradin, and the dwarven demipower of the forge and the destructive properties of fire. Tharmekhûl is of a very narrow focus, and mainly task his followers with the kindling of new forges with elemental fire or with retrieving relics from ancient dwarven forges. The book is written in Dwarfish. |

Sharindlar represents an aspect of dwarven life rarely seen by others. Her command of fertility expands her clergy's influence over animal husbandry along with developing new varieties of crops. | 64 | The Dirge of Delzoun | This book is very heavy and requires a Strength of 13 or more to lift it. Inside is The Dirge of Delzoun: an epic dwarven ballad that tells the grim tale of the shield dwarves of the North. When this tome is read by a bard a they would assess that performing this ballad would take nearly thirty hours. |
| 65 | Ironmaster | This white leather bound tome discusses Ironmaster: an isolated towered city built into the rocky walls of a valley in the Frozenfar. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 66 | Hammers By Our Hand: Hammer Of Thunderbolts | This book describes the legendary Hammer Of Thunderbolts. Reading this tome provides the same lore and information as the entry for this weapon in the Dungeon Master's guide. This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |
| 67 | The Words of One Dwarf | Salhmitarr "Sage" Sorndar discusses his life of orc slaying, drinking dwarven mead, and chasing down foes. |
| 68 | Dwarven Clan Law Vol: III | This is a heavy slate binder that has each law engraved into the pages. This binder discusses the law: "A dwarf shall not conceal personal injury or illness from fellows of the same clan. This book is written in Common and Dwarfish. |
| 69 | Crafters Of Our People: Cromwell | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This depicts the adventures of Cromwell, making superior quality armor out of the scales and hides of animals. The novel depicts Cromwell making plate armor out of an ankhegs shell and scale male from red dragon scales. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |

Banank took an injury fighting goblins and spent the rest of his life in a wheel chair designed by gnomes. When Bruenor Battlehammer faked is his death in 1409 DR, Banak was made the eleventh king of Mithril Hall. Within a few decades, he passed away and his son Connerad took his place as king. This book is written in Dwarfish. |
| 71 | Crafters Of Our People: Helda Silverstream | This is a colorful graphic novel is printed on cured deep rothé leather. This tome depicts Helga, who was a dwarf blacksmith that usually wandered from Waterdeep to Icewind Dale to sell her works. This graphic novel is written in dwarfish. |
| 72 | Kings and Queens Of Mithril Hall: Bangor Battlehammer | This is a false book that opens up to reveal a small statue of Bangor as the seventh king of Mithril Hall. Bangor was slain beside his father fighting Shimmergloom and abdicated his crown to Bruenor before he did. The carvings on this statue are in Dwarfish. |
| 73 | Kings and Queens Of Mithril Hall: Connerad Brawn- anvil | This is a hefty leather scroll that tells the story of Connerad Brawnanvil, twelfth king of Mithril Hall. Connerad was part of the Gutbuster Brigade and trained as a formidable warrior. During the Tyranny of Dragons, he was chosen as an ambassador of the Lords' Alliance dwarves at the Council of Waterdeep. This book is written in dwarfish. |
