Unlike the map of the City of Jakálla, these are *not* done in a “semi-representational” style, i.e. important structures shown on the map would appear much larger (and therefore take up more room) than they actually do in a physical and geographic sense. The projection has not, however, been adjusted for curvature of the globe of Tékumel.
