Camp Death is even campier and deadlier when you use

Before starting, remove the four +5 positive and negative Outcome cards, and replace them with four special Camp Death Outcome cards. You will know them by the blood spatter!

Whenever a special Outcome card is chosen to resolve a Scene, someone dies. It can be a player's character (with their consent) or a side character that totally deserves it, but it cannot be the recipient of the Outcome card!

Make the death happen off-screen and relish in the uncertaintyyou never know when someone might make an unexpected reappearance.

Special cards serve as perfectly normal Tilt elements and count as points in the Aftermath as usual.

Slasher tilms are notorious for late-movie revelations and plot twists, and Camp Death is no exception. If it isn't transparently obvious who your killer is, the player of any character who received one or more special Outcome cards might be the killer.

Just before the Aftermath, shuffle the special Outcome cards together and draw one to reveal your killer.

Your character and someone else's need to make a life or death decision. What is it? How does that work out for you?

Your character and someone else's have a plan to unmask the killer. What is it, and why is it foolish?

Everyone gets together around a bonfire to tell spooky stories, but your character has one about this very camp.

Your character and someone else's slip away for some alone time, but another character interrupts you. What's going on?
