# INTRODUCTION

Field of Glory is a historical miniature tabletop wargaming rules system for anyone interested in recreating the battles of the ancient and medieval eras. This companion is designed to be used alongside the Field of Glory rulebook and covers the armies of Western Europe from 1300 to 1500 AD.

European warfare in this period was characterised by a rise in the role of infantry and a decline in the role of mounted knights. The Flemish, at Courtrai in 1302, showed that steady foot could defeat mounted knights. The Hundred Years' War, between England and France from 1337 to 1453, raged through France and spilled over into the Low Counties and Spain. The English tactical system of massed longbowmen and dismounted men-at-arms deployed in defensive positions

dominated the pitched battles of the war. The French knights were themselves forced to fight on foot to stand any chance, and even then they usually lost. Nevertheless, by avoiding pitched battles and concentrating on sieges, the French eventually won the war and expelled the English from the whole of France, except for Calais.

Meanwhile, the Swiss cantons were asserting their independence from feudal rule. Their massed infantry, initially halberdiers, later mostly pikemen, trounced the Austrian chivalry on several occasions, and later smashed Charles the Bold's "perfect" Burgundian army. As the merits of the Swiss military system became apparent, pike formations were adopted in Germany and elsewhere, and became the dominant close fighting infantry type of the early Renaissance.

The term "men-at-arms" is used in these lists to include knights and other fully equipped menat-arms and also less well-equipped sergeants, valets, coustilliers et al, filling in rear ranks.

Equipment often varied widely in Medieval armies, even within a body of troops. Modern illustrations often show only the very best equipped men. We assume that many men, especially amongst the foot, were less well-equipped. Accordingly, we have classified troops on the basis of their probable average level of equipment.

As far as possible, we have organised the army lists into geographical groups.

# HUNDRED YEARS' WAR ENGLISH (CONTINENTAL)

This list covers English armies on the Continent from 1320 to 1455. This period was dominated by the Hundred Years' War between England and France. The Hundred Years' War lasted from 1337 until 1453 with intermittent pauses.

# THE LONGBOW

The English longbow of the Hundred Years' War period has a fearsome reputation. It was a self bow, made from imported yew by preference, about 2 metres in length. The inner side of the stave was of heartwood, which resists compression, and the outer of sapwood, which performs better in tension. Thus, although the

bow was made from a single piece of wood, it used the same principle as eastern composite bows. Surviving 16th century examples from the Mary Rose probably had draw weights of 72–82 kgf (160–180 lbf). For comparison, a typical modern longbow has a draw weight of 27 kgf (60 lbf) or less. In order to draw such bows, archers had to train constantly from childhood. The skeletons from the Mary Rose testify to the extreme muscular development of the upper torso and arms required.

The main advantage of the longbow over the crossbow was a much higher rate of shooting. This allowed large bodies of archers to lay down a withering barrage of arrows against attacking enemy. Crossbows were more useful in static

situations such as sieges, where their slow rate of shooting was not an issue. The main advantage of the crossbow was that it did not require such long and athletic training to use with reasonable efficiency. At Crécy, however, the English longbowmen decisively out-shot the Genoese crossbowmen of the French. Although the arrow storm laid down by English longbowmen was extremely effective, it was not considered enough on its own to stop a charge by mounted men-at-arms. The English invariably tried to form up in defensive positions, with their flanks secured by woods, hedges or other difficult terrain, and their front also

protected in one way or another. At Morlaix (1342) and Crécy (1346), for example, they formed up on a ridge behind concealed pits, at Mauron (1352) on a ridge partly protected by tangled brambles, at Poitiers (1356) behind hedges and amongst thickets and thorn bushes, at Agincourt (1415) behind muddy ploughed fields and stakes, and so on. After 1415, the use of stakes in front of the archers became standard practice, soon copied by the Burgundians and, later, by the French. At Patay (1429), however, the English archers were ridden down by mounted French men-at-arms who managed to charge them before they could emplace their stakes.

The usual formation was for the army to be divided into 2 or 3 battle groups, each consisting of a centre of dismounted men-at-arms with bodies of archers on each side.

# TROOP NOTES

English and Gascon men-at-arms almost invariably fought on foot. The proportion of wellequipped men-at-arms to less well-equipped diminished as time went by, and billmen later supplemented the men-at-arms. As they fought in mixed battle groups, they are graded according to the proportion in the mix. English men-atarms did occasionally fight mounted, though not

particularly well, so count as Average when mounted. Longbowmen were armed with a variety of weapons including swords, hatchets, axes and mauls, which they were not afraid to use. We treat them as equivalent to Swordsmen. Similarly, their armour varied widely, from none at all to half-plate armour. We treat this mixture as equivalent to Protected.

# BUILDING A CUSTOMISED LIST USING OUR ARMY POINTS

Choose an army based on the maxima and minima in the list below. The following special instructions apply to this army:

- Commanders should be depicted as mounted or dismounted men-at-arms.
- English mounted men-at-arms can always dismount as Superior, Heavily Armoured, Drilled Heavy Foot – Heavy Weapon.
- Gascon mounted men-at-arms (whether graded as Superior or Average when mounted) can always dismount as Superior, Heavily Armoured, Undrilled Heavy Foot – Heavy Weapon.
- Hobilars can always dismount as Average, Protected, Drilled Medium Foot – Defensive spearmen.

- Dismounted men-at-arms and billmen can interpenetrate longbowmen and vice versa.
- Gascons cannot be used with German or Flemish allies. If a Flemish allied contingent is used, a German allied contingent must also be used.

# HUNDRED YEARS' WAR ENGLISH (BRITAIN)

This list covers English armies in Britain from 1320 to 1455. Several battles were fought in this period against the Scots. The English were victorious at Dupplin Muir (1332), Halidon Hill (1333), Neville's Cross (1346) and Humbleton Hill (1402), their combination of dismounted men-at-arms and archers proving too much for the Scots schiltrons to cope with, particularly when deployed defensively. At Otterburn in 1388, a surprise night attack on the Scots by the English proved no surprise and the English were defeated. Battles were also fought between rebel and royalist forces at Boroughbridge (1322), Radcot Bridge (1387) and Shrewsbury (1403).

# TROOP NOTES

Troops were raised for specific, usually short, campaigns and would not have time to come up to the drilled standard, the possible exceptions being mounted longbowmen and men-at-arms and those who had seen service in foreign wars. These could be numerous, such as the 3,000 mounted archers said to be in the army mustered before the Battle of Neville's Cross.

Men-at-arms usually fought on foot, though a small number were sometimes kept mounted. The grading of dismounted men-at-arms battle groups varies according to the proportion of wellequipped men-at-arms to lesser men-at-arms or billmen and the proportion of experienced men.

Hobilars were primarily mounted infantry, so count as Poor while mounted though they dismount as Average.

# EDWARD IV (1442-1483)

Heir of Richard, Duke of York, Edward Earl of March succeeded to the Yorkist claim to the throne when his father was killed by the Lancastrians at the Battle of Wakefield in 1460. Despite his youth, he proved an able general, defeating the Lancastrians at Mortimer's Cross in 1461, following which he was declared king by his supporters. At Towton, later the same year, he consolidated his rule by decisively defeating the main Lancastrian army. Edward's Lancastrian cousin, King Henry VI, was deposed and fled into exile with his wife, Queen Margaret - although Henry was later captured in 1465 and imprisoned in the Tower of London. Between 1469 and 1471, Edward's principal supporter, Richard Neville "The King-Maker", Earl of Warwick, turned on him and switched to the Lancastrian side. In 1470, Edward was forced to flee to the protection of his brotherin-law Charles, Duke of Burgundy. Returning in 1471 with a small force, he rapidly raised an army and defeated and killed Warwick at Barnet. Three weeks later he defeated Queen Margaret's army at Tewkesbury. Henry VI was murdered shortly after. Edward then reigned without serious opposition until his death in 1483. He had never been defeated in battle.

Continental mercenary troops were supplied at various times by France and Burgundy.

# MEDIEVAL WELSH

This list covers the army of Owain Glyndŵr (Owen Glendower) and his supporters from 1400 to 1409. During this period, Wales rebelled against English rule. The Welsh rebels captured or destroyed most of the English-held castles and lands in Wales, formed their own parliament and made alliances and treaties with foreign powers. There were several battles, most of them relatively small, but none the less significant. They include the Battle of Bryn Glas (1402), also known as the Battle of Pilleth, where a Marcher army of around 8,000 men under Sir Edmund Mortimer was virtually annihilated by Owain's force of around 5,000. The battle began with the English army attacking up a steep slope on which the larger part of the Welsh army was deployed, suffering severely from Welsh archery as they climbed the hill. When they were fully

engaged, the rest of the Welsh army, which had been hidden in woods on the right flank of the English army, attacked them in flank and rear. Welsh contingents in the English army then defected, completing the English defeat. Allegedly many of the English dead were subsequently mutilated by the Welsh camp followers, in retaliation for rapes committed by English forces the previous year.

In addition, there were two major actions where Owain's forces could potentially have fought: The battle of Shrewsbury (1403) was fought before Hotspur's Welsh allies could arrive. A battle almost took place near Worcester in 1405 – Owain and his French allies stood off the royal army of Henry IV for 8 days, but no battle ultimately occurred and both sides withdrew.

# TROOP NOTES

Wales was lacking in arms and armour at the beginning of the revolt. As the revolt grew, however, funds became available through raiding, and captured equipment was added to the Welsh arsenal. Most of the actions were guerrilla actions fought by highly mobile, possibly entirely mounted, bodies of troops. Where they fought on foot, hit and run attacks were the order of the day.

As the Welsh successes became known, Welshmen fighting for other nations in Europe returned to aid the rebellion. Some of these men brought their own bands of experienced soldiers with them.

# LATER MEDIEVAL SCOTS (BRITAIN)

This list covers lowland Scots armies in Britain from 1300 to 1500. Significant battles against the English during this period include victories at Loudon Hill (1307), Bannockburn (1314) and Otterburn (1388); also defeats at Dupplin Muir (1332), Halidon Hill (1333), Neville's Cross (1346) and Humbleton Hill (1402). Significant battles against Isles/Highland armies include a hard fought draw at Harlaw (1411) and a defeat at Inverlochy (1431).

# TROOP NOTES

At the start of this period men-at-arms mostly fought on foot in the front ranks of the spearmen – they are assumed to be included among the spearmen. Scots contingents in France from 1418 were made up along similar lines to contemporary English armies and this appears to indicate a

change in the structure of Scots armies and an increase in the importance of archery. This can probably be dated to the years following Humbleton Hill. In France, the men-at-arms fought dismounted and we assume that they would be supported by spearmen or similar. We assume that home armies would still contain a significant number of spearmen. We can find no evidence of Scots archers using stakes. The archery reforms rapidly collapsed after the death of James I in 1437 and armies reverted to mainly spearmen.

# TROOP NOTES

Records show that unlike Scottish "home" armies these contingents were made up along the lines of contemporary English armies with archers outnumbering men-at-arms by 2:1. Fighting was undertaken on foot. The option for Armoured men-at-arms allows for the possibility that their numbers were made up by a significant number of lesser men-at-arms and spearmen in incomplete harness. Discipline in Scots contingents appears to have been variable.

The maxima of this list assume that large armies will include a French allied contingent.

Battle accounts from this period and later suggest that the wealthier Highlanders were equipped with mail, bow, targe, sword and/or axe. Lesser followers, equipped only with targe, sword or knife made up the rear ranks.

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# GALLOGLAIGH

Galloglaigh (foreign warriors), or "galloglasses" as they were also known, were originally mercenary warriors from the Western Isles and west coast of Scotland, serving under their own chieftains. Several clans of galloglaigh settled permanently in Ireland, notably the MacSúibhne (MacSweeney), MacDomhnaill (MacDonnell/MacDowell), MacSíothaigh (MacSheehy), MacDubhgaill (MacDougall), MacCaba (MacCabe) and MacRuari (MacRory) clans. They were employed both by the Irish and the Anglo-Irish. By the 15th century, galloglaigh came to include native Irishmen. As solid infantry, with a reputation for steadiness, galloglaigh were at the forefront of the Irish revival in the 15th century, allowing the Irish to match the heavier troops of the Anglo-Irish. They became the mainstay of Irish warfare, supported by mounted nobles and lightly equipped kerns.

The principle galloglaigh weapon was the two-

handed axe, though not all were so armed. They aspired to a mail coat, but grave effigies make it clear that a high proportion wore only a helmet and the textile cotun (akheton).

# THE HUNDRED YEARS' WAR

The period was dominated by the Hundred Years' War between England and France. The Hundred Years' War lasted from 1337 to 1453 with intermittent pauses. At the height of Angevin power, in the late 12th century, the King of England ruled larger territories in France than the King of France himself, including Normandy, Maine, Anjou, Touraine, Gascony, Saintonge and Aquitaine. By the start of the Hundred Years' War, however, English possessions had been reduced to Gascony, with its capital at Bordeaux. When Charles IV of France died in 1328, leaving only a daughter, King Edward III of England was, in fact, his closest living male relative. By English law, this made him heir to the throne of France. The French nobility, however, could not face the prospect of an English king, and invoked the ancient Salic law by which the royal inheritance of France could not pass through a woman. They therefore declared Philip of Valois, the nearest relative in the male line, to be the heir to the throne, and crowned him king as Philip VI. In 1331, Edward gave up his claim to the

French throne in return for confirmation of his possession of Gascony. In 1337, however, Philip declared Gascony forfeit, and Edward, in response, reasserted his claim to the French throne and declared war.

The first phase of the war lasted from 1337 to 1360. During this period the French countryside was devastated and the English won a series of victories against French armies. Having proved at Crécy in 1346 that their mounted knights could not prevail against the English combination of longbowmen and dismounted men-at-arms deployed in a defensive position, the French began to dismount most of their knights to fight on foot. At Poitiers, in 1356, the French main battle fought on foot. However, the English were deployed behind hedges amongst thickets and scrub, and the battle once again ended in disaster for the French. In 1360, the Treaty of Brétigny was signed. By the terms of this, Edward once again renounced his claim to the throne of France, but the English held Aquitaine, Calais, Ponthieu and half of Brittany.

In the second phase of the war, from 1369, the English were progressively pushed back until a truce was signed in 1389.

#### STORM OF ARROWS

In 1415, Henry V of England once again declared war. At the battle of Agincourt, the same year, the French were once again defeated. This time the English formed up in muddy ploughed fields, and also used a barricade of 2 metre (6 foot) sharpened stakes in front of their archers. The initial mounted French attacks were repulsed with heavy losses, and the main attack by dismounted men-at-arms also met with disaster. By the resulting Treaty of Troyes, Henry held most of northern France and was recognised as the heir to the French throne, the dauphin (later Charles VII) being declared illegitimate. Needless to say, Charles did not agree to this and continued the fight. Henry died in 1422 while still in France, and was succeeded by his infant son Henry VI. English fortunes continued to be good, however, until 1429, when the French, inspired by Joan of Arc, forced the English to lift the siege of Orleans. Shortly afterwards they defeated another English army at Patay. A mounted French charge contacted the English archers before they could emplace their stakes and rode them down. Despite the capture and execution of Joan of Arc the following year, French fortunes continued to improve. By avoiding open battle, the French were able to gradually retake their towns one by one. After the defeat of Castillon in 1453, the English were left holding only the area immediately around Calais.

### TROOP NOTES

There is a school of thought that once French menat-arms became used to fighting on foot, they lost much of their élan when mounted. We therefore allow the option to grade them as Average when mounted – they are still Superior when dismounted. Brigans were lightly armed infantry equipped with a variety of weapons. Ribauds and pillards were armed principally with knives and were fit only for slaying unhorsed enemy men-at-arms.

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# ORDONNANCE FRENCH

This list covers French armies from the Ordonnance reforms of 1445 until 1500.

### TROOP NOTES

The Ordonnance of 1445 decreed the raising of 15 ordonnance companies, each consisting of 100 lances. Each lance consisted of 6 mounted men, comprising a man-at-arms, a coustillier, a page and, depending on which source is believed, either 3 archers or 2 archers and a valet de guerre.

Coustilliers were somewhat more lightly equipped cavalry that filled the rear ranks behind the men-atarms, so are included amongst the men-at-arms, as are valets de guerre. The archers normally rode to battle, but fought on foot. Later in the period, however, they sometimes operated as lance armed cavalry, so can be fielded as such from 1466. From 1480, the Kings of France regularly employed Swiss mercenaries, numbering around 6,000 throughout the remainder of Louis XI's reign.

# FREE COMPANY

This list covers the Free Companies of unemployed soldiery arising during the various intervals of peace during the Hundred Years' War between 1357 and 1444 and operating in France, Spain and Italy. Individual companies usually numbered no more than a few hundred men, but army-sized conglomerations numbering over 10,000 were not uncommon, usually in the service of an employer, but occasionally, as in the case of the 16,000 strong Grand Company in the early 1360s, operating independently.

### TROOP NOTES

We have assumed that conglomerations of mixed nationalities would initially retain national characteristics, but would tend to become homogenized and more disciplined (in battle, though very definitely not off the battlefield) if embodied for a longer period.

# NAVARRESE

This list covers the armies of King Charles the Bad of Navarre during the Hundred Years' War, from his accession in 1350 until 1378 when the loss of his Norman possessions forced him to capitulate to the King of France. The forces of the Kingdom of Navarre itself were small compared with those of its neighbours. Charles supplemented his Navarrese forces with troops from his Norman possessions, and with English and Gascon mercenaries.

# LATER LOW COUNTRIES

This list covers the armies of the Low Country communes from 1300 to 1477, and also the armies of Maximilian of Austria in the Low Countries from 1478 to 1500.

Low Countries communal armies could win frontal battles against mounted men-at-arms when terrain secured their flanks. They won thus against the French at Courtrai (1302). If, however, the enemy were able to threaten them from several directions, they could pin them in position. Like the Scots, they were then very vulnerable to archery. At Mons-en-Pevele (1304), the French were able to get the bulk of their forces behind the Lowland phalanx, but the Lowlanders had taken the precaution of protecting their rear with their baggage wagons, so the battle ended in a bloody draw. At Cassel (1328), an initial surprise attack by the Lowlanders on the French camps was repulsed with difficulty, thereafter the Lowlanders were surrounded and eventually routed. At Roosebeke (1382), the French mounted attack enveloped the Flemish flanks and broke the phalanx. At Othée (1408), the Burgundians surrounded the Liègeois phalanx and eventually routed it. At Rupelmonde (1452) the Gauntois were eventually broken by the archery of the Burgundian longbowmen.

At Gavere (1453), a Burgundian archery barrage followed by a determined charge by mounted men-at-arms broke the Gauntois. At Brusthem (1467), the Liègeois were defeated by the Burgundian combination of dismounted men-atarms and longbowmen.

After the defeat and death of Charles the Bold at Nancy in early 1477, the Low Countries rump of Charles's former territory resisted French attempts at annexation in the name of Charles's daughter Marie, who married Maximilian of Austria later that year. In 1478, new Ordonnance Companies were formed along the lines of those of Charles the Bold. In Maximilian's armies Swiss and German mercenaries replaced many of the Communal pikemen.

#### TROOP NOTES

Low country spearmen used very long spears but did not form up in especially deep formations at least until the mid-15th century. We therefore grade them as Offensive Spearmen rather than Pikemen. The plançon a picot was a long tapering club with an iron head and spike at the end. Several statutes were passed banning it, and it went out of favour at the end of the 14th century.

MEDIEVAL BURGUNDIAN

This list covers Burgundian armies from 1363 until 1471, when Charles the Bold applied his Ordonnance reforms.

In 1363, Philip de Valois, fourth son of King John II of France, was granted the Duchy of Burgundy as Philip II (the Bold) thereof. In 1369, he married Margaret, Countess of Flanders, thus uniting these two rich territories. He later also acquired the County of Charolais. During the minority and subsequent insanity of his nephew Charles VI of France, he shared the regency with his brothers. In 1402, however, the King appointed his brother, Louis, Duke of Orléans, as regent instead. The latter's misrule resulted in Philip being appointed regent again in 1404, shortly before his death. His son John I (the Fearless) succeeded him. Almost immediately he came into conflict with Louis of Orléans. In 1407, on the orders of John the Fearless, Louis

was assassinated in Paris. He was attacked after mounting his horse by a party of men who rendered him defenceless by cutting off both his arms. In 1418, with the English holding much of northern France, John seized control of Paris from the Dauphin, the future Charles VII. In 1419, at a parley on the bridge at Montereau, John was assassinated by the Dauphin's followers. He was succeeded by his son, Philip III (the Good), who in 1420 allied himself with Henry V of England. The English alliance lasted until 1435. During his reign, Philip added many territories to his ancestral domain, including Namur, Hainault, Holland, Frisia, Brabant, Limburg, Antwerp and Luxembourg. He died in 1467, succeeded by his son Charles the Bold who would attempt to consolidate his legacy into a kingdom, with ultimately fatal results for himself and his inheritance.

The provision for feudal men-at-arms to lose their Lancers capability is based on Philippe de Commynes' eye-witness account of their performance at the battle of Montlhéry in 1465: "I do not believe that amongst the twelve hundred men-at-arms or thereabouts who were there fifty knew how to lay a lance in the arrêt....because of the long peace."

# CHARLES THE BOLD (1433 – 1477)

Duke of Burgundy from 1467 until his death in 1477, Charles the Bold appears to have had two main ambitions: To consolidate his scattered territories into a Kingdom of Burgundy between France and Germany, and to have the best and most modern army in the world. He almost succeeded in both. He issued a series of ordinances resulting in the creation of a standing army intended to take the best of the tactical systems of western Europe and combine them into an unstoppable military machine. Drawing on Italian, English, French and German as well as Burgundian recruits, the intended army, as set out

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in the ordinance of 1472, comprised 3,600 menat-arms (fully armoured "knights" and their more lightly armoured coustilliers and pages), 3,600 mounted longbowmen (who rode to battle but fought on foot), 1,200 foot longbowmen, 1,200 pikemen and 1,200 hand-gunners. The actual army raised was short by 600 mounted longbowmen and 600 hand-gunners, the shortfall being made up with crossbowmen and extra pikemen. Unfortunately, Charles' generalship did not match his organisational skills. In 1476 and 1477 he suffered a series of three disastrous defeats at the hands of the Swiss, who were allied with his enemy René, Duke of Lorraine. (See p.56). In the last of these, at Nancy, he was killed. His ambitions for a kingdom of Burgundy died with him. His possessions were divided between France and the Holy Roman Empire, and fought over for the next two centuries.

#### TROOP NOTES

The Ordonnance of 1473 specifies a mixed formation for pikemen and longbowmen. The pikemen were to advance in front of the archers so that the archers could fire over them as if over a wall. This formation was used by at least part of the foot at the battle of Grandson. A woodcut shows a unit of roughly equal numbers of archers and pike/voulge armed men behind a row of stakes. Accordingly, Ordonnance pikemen and longbowmen can be deployed in mixed battle groups of 6 bases, with a front rank of pikemen (counting as Defensive Spearmen) and rear rank of longbowmen. Philippe de Commynes in 1465 commented on the inability of the Burgundian feudal men-atarms to use their lances properly. Low countries pikemen were unenthusiastic levies.

# SWISS

This list covers Swiss armies from 1291, when the Forest Cantons – Uri, Schwyz and Unterwalten – formed the Everlasting League, until 1500.

The Swiss fought in deep infantry columns. For the first hundred years of the period, they relied on their murderous halberds and their native terrain. At Mortgarten (1315), they ambushed the Austrians while they were in column of march along a lake-side path. The Austrians were massacred. At Laupen (1339), the Swiss adopted a defensive position on a hill. The Burgundians and allies attacked this position. The allied foot were easily defeated by the Bernese and other Swiss facing them. The mounted allied men-at-arms were initially successful against the Forest Canton troops facing them, but were ultimately defeated when the victorious Bernese contingent joined the fight against them. At Sempach (1386), the armies met while in column of march. The Austrians dismounted their men-at-arms and advanced in column on foot against the Swiss vanguard, the Lucerne contingent. The battle was going badly for the Swiss when the rest of their force, mainly from Uri, arrived. The battle then swung in favour of the Swiss and the Austrians eventually fled. Vögelinsegg (1403) and Stoss (1405) were successful ambushes against Austrian forces.

Around the turn of the century, the Swiss began to replace their halberds with pikes, which appear to have been more effective against both mounted and dismounted men-at-arms in open ground. By the time of Arbedo (1422), about a third were armed with pikes, the remainder still having halberds. Initial mounted attacks by the Milanese men-at-arms were repulsed with heavy losses. Carmagnola, the Milanese commander, then ordered his men-at-arms to dismount. A severe struggle ensued, in which the Swiss came off worse. The timely arrival of 600 Swiss foragers, however, was mistaken for major reinforcements by the enemy. They pulled back, allowing the Swiss to retire from the field in good order.

By the mid-15th century, the Swiss had largely switched to pikes, attacking rapidly in huge columns. Each such column had a core of halberdiers who could sally out to cause mayhem if the column was halted. There were usually three such columns, the Vorhut (vanguard), Gewalthut (centre) and Nachhut (rearguard), attacking in echelon. The Vorhut usually included most of the army's crossbowmen and handgunners.

At Grandson (1476), against Charles the Bold of Burgundy, the action started accidentally between the Swiss Vorhut and the Burgundian vanguard. Several attacks by mounted men-atarms were repulsed by the Swiss. Thinking that the Vorhut was the whole Swiss army, Charles then started to redeploy his army in an attempt to draw the Swiss into a pocket with archers and artillery shooting into each flank. Unfortunately, while this redeployment was in progress, the Swiss Gewalthut and Nachhut arrived. The Burgundian troops, misinterpreting the redeployment as a retreat, panicked and fled. At Morat (1476), Charles deployed his forces behind a ditch and palisade in expectation of a Swiss attack. On the morning of the battle, however, not realising that the Swiss were close, he stood down most of his forces. When the Swiss arrived, the forces remaining under arms proved inadequate to stop them and the rest of the Burgundian forces, coming up piecemeal, were easily defeated. At Nancy (1477), Charles adopted a strong defensive position with his foot

and dismounted men-at-arms in the centre, and mounted men-at-arms on each wing. Rather than attack this formidable array frontally, the Swiss sent their Vorhut to attack the Burgundian left from the front, and their larger Gewalthut to hook round through wooded hills and attack the Burgundian right from the flank. The Nachhut, consisting only of handgunners, screened the gap between the two main Swiss bodies. Decisively outmanoeuvred, the

Burgundians were defeated again, and Charles himself was killed in the rout.

From the early 15th century, the Swiss hired themselves out en bloc to neighbouring states as mercenaries. The first example of this was in 1424, when Florence hired the services of 10,000 Swiss for 3 months. From 1480, the Kings of France hired Swiss mercenaries on a regular basis, numbering around 6,000 in the reign of Louis XI.

### TROOP NOTES

Halberdiers in the centre of pike blocks are treated as pikemen. We rather generously allow the stones

thrown by the "enfants perdus" at Laupen to be treated as javelins. Letzinen were stone barricades used to block roads so that the enemy could be halted and ambushed.

### TROOP NOTES

Danish and Union armies made much use of German mercenaries. Scandinavian armour styles were somewhat old-fashioned in the 14th century, but caught up with more modern European styles in the 15th. The select levy were armed with halberds or other pole-arms. The general levy were mostly armed with short spears.

# TROOP NOTES

Swedish peasant militia were particularly well armoured and effective, fighting in mixed units of men with crossbow or longbow and men with pole-arms, axes, spears etc. The proportion of polearms increased as time went on. The crossbow was far more common than the longbow. As it seems unlikely that crossbows and longbows were deployed in separate units, the mixture is treated as crossbows. Scandinavian armour styles were somewhat old-fashioned in the 14th century, but caught up with more modern European styles in the 15th. Ambushes were popular, timber barricades being used to block routes through woodland.

# CONDOTTA ITALIAN

This list covers Italian armies from 1320 to 1500. It differs from other lists in having special sections to represent the additional options available to the major Italian states.

### TROOP NOTES

Most men-at-arms were raised by contracts (condotte) with mercenary captains, though some (lanze spezzati) were hired individually by the state. Traditional communal militia infantry were neither enthusiastic nor highly regarded, and only Florence's out-of-date army made much use of them in the later part of the period. By then, most infantry were provisionati, paid soldiers hired directly by the state, though some were raised by condotte. Militia pavisier and crossbowmen battle groups represent several ranks of crossbowmen with a rank of speararmed pavisiers in front. They are best depicted as front rank bases of pavisier figures and rear rank bases of crossbowmen figures.

### MEDIEVAL CROWN OF ARAGON

This list covers the mainland armies of the Crown of Aragon from the coronation of Pere IV of Aragon (III of Catalonia) in 1336 until dynastic union with Castile in 1479. The Crown of Aragon ruled over a proto-federal state that reached its maximum expansion during this period. It included the Kingdom of Aragon, the Principality of Catalonia, the Kingdom of Majorca, the Kingdom of Valencia, the Kingdom of Sicily, Sardinia and the Kingdom of Naples, each one of them with its own independent political and juridical status. This list covers only its mainland armies.

French allies in 1365 represent Bertrand du Guesclin's White Companies, hired by Pere of Aragon for his war against Pedro of Castile. During the Catalan Civil War of 1462 to 1472 between King Juan II and the Catalan government of the Generalitat, French troops sent by Louis XI helped the king until 1466, when the Generalitat offered the Catalan crown to René d'Anjou and Louis XI changed sides.

#### TROOP NOTES

Aragonese men-at-arms rarely fought on foot. Drilled militia from the cities used pikes from the 13th century, but deep formations were not introduced until the arrival of foreign mercenaries in the second half of the 15th century. Almughavars were recruited from the border lands and are described as lightly armoured and equipped with a couple of iron darts, spear and short sword or dagger. Classification of their fighting style presents a problem – therefore we give a choice of

classification. Their numbers and quality decreased as their main recruitment areas disappeared. A proportion of the army's spearmen, crossbowmen or archers can be Mudejars (Moslems) or Jews conscripted from the formerly Moslem areas.

### MEDIEVAL CASTILIAN

This list covers the armies of the kingdom of Castile from the accession of Pedro I the Cruel in 1350 until the reform of the army and the creation of the Santa Hermandad Nueva by Ferdinand and Isabella in 1476.

#### TROOP NOTES

Castilian men-at-arms rarely fought on foot, though the Order of the Sash accompanied the French dismounted knights at Najera (1367). French and Free Company men-at-arms in Spain usually fought on foot. A proportion of the spearmen, crossbowmen, archers or javelinmen can be Mudejars (Moslems) or Jews conscripted from the formerly Moslem areas. Javelinmen were armed with javelins and a long thrusting spear. A Castilian ordinance of 1385 specifies spear, javelin and shield as the required equipment for those with an income of 400–600 maravedis, and spear and javelin for those in the lowest bracket of less than 400 maravedis. Those with an income of 600–2,000 maravedis were to muster as crossbowmen, those with 2,000–3,000 maravedis as spearmen with helmet, shield, spear and sword.

### SANTA HERMANDAD NUEVA CASTILIAN

This list covers the armies of Castile from the creation of the Santa Hermandad Nueva in 1476 until its disappearance with the ordinance of 1497, which for the first time reorganized the infantry into thirds of differently equipped troops, starting a series of reforms that would end up with the Tercios that began modern warfare. This was the army that finally conquered Granada, the last Moslem state in Spain, in 1492.

#### TROOP NOTES

Infantry became more and more important, accounting for up to <sup>5</sup>/<sub>6</sub> of the army that finally took Granada. In parallel, the number of men-at-arms was reduced in favour of extra light cavalry, and by the end of the war there were up to ten times as many jinetes as heavy cavalry. The ordinance of 1488 organized the Santa Hermandad Nueva into 12 companies of 720 spearmen and 80 arquebusiers, plus 24 officers, 8 drummers and a standard-bearer. Some of those companies were equipped with pikes instead of spears, and operated in the manner of the Swiss and Germans. Other Hermandades had equal numbers of spearmen and crossbowmen, and sword-and-buckler men were used specially for assaults during sieges. The military orders were still present in the War of Granada; the master of the Order of Calatrava was killed at Loja in 1482, and the master of

the Order of Santiago commanded the rearguard of the army that had to withdraw from the mountains of Malaga in 1483. Other troops included almughavars and Swiss mercenaries. Classification of the fighting style of almughavars presents a problem – therefore we give a choice of classification. The artillery train was a very important part of the army and

played a decisive role in the different sieges that took place over the War of Granada.

#### LATER GRANADINE

### LATER GRANADINE

The Kingdom of Granada was the last surviving remnant of Moslem rule in the Iberian peninsula. This list covers Granadine armies from 1340 until the fall of the kingdom in 1492. Ruled by the Nasrid dysnasty, Granada was a major entrepôt for trade with North and Sub-Saharan Africa, particularly the gold trade. Granada was rich and heavily populated. Its borders were mountainous and protected by a chain of fortresses.

#### TROOP NOTES

Most mercenary foot were Black Africans from Sub-Saharan Africa or Berbers from North Africa.

### APPENDIX 1 – USING THE LISTS

To give balanced games, armies can be selected using the points system. The more effective the troops, the more each base costs in points. The maximum points for an army will usually be set at between 600 and 800 points for a singles game for 2 to 4 hours play. We recommend 800 points for 15mm singles tournament games (650 points for 25mm) and 1000 points for 15mm doubles games.

The army lists specify which troops can be used in a particular army. No other troops can be used. The number of bases of each type in the army must conform to the specified minima and maxima. Troops that have restrictions on when they can be used cannot be used with troops with a conflicting restriction. For example, troops that can only be used "before 1450" cannot be used with troops that can only be used "from 1450". All special instructions applying to an army list must be adhered to. They also apply to allied contingents supplied by the army.

All armies must have a C-in-C and at least one other commander. No army can have more than 4 commanders in total, including C-in-C, subcommanders and allied commanders.

All armies must have a supply camp. This is free unless fortified. A fortified camp can only be used if specified in the army list. Field fortifications and portable defences can only be used if specified in the army list.

Allied contingents can only be used if specified in the army list. Most allied contingents have their own allied contingent list, to which they must conform unless the main army's list specifies otherwise.

#### BATTLE GROUPS

All troops are organized into battle groups. Commanders, supply camps and field fortifications are not troops and are not assigned to battle groups. Portable defences are not troops, but are assigned to specific battle groups.

Battle groups must obey the following restrictions:

- The number of bases in a battle group must correspond to the range specified in the army list.
- Each battle group must initially comprise an even number of bases. The only exception to this rule is that battle groups whose army list specifies them as <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> of one type and <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> of another, can comprise 9 bases if this is within the battle group size range specified by the list.

- A battle group can only include troops from one line in a list, unless the list specifies a mixed formation by specifying fractions of the battle group to be of types from two lines. e.g. <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> spearmen, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> archers.
- All troops in a battle group must be of the same quality and training. When a choice of quality or training is given in a list, this allows battle groups to differ from each other. It does not permit variety within a battle group.
- Unless specifically stated otherwise in an army list, all troops in a battle group must be of the same armour class. When a choice of armour class is given in a list, this allows battle groups to differ from each other. It does not permit variety within a battle group.

#### EXAMPLE LIST

Here is a section of an actual army list, which will help us to explain the basics and some special features. The list specifies the following items for each historical type included in the army:

- Troop Type comprising Type, Armour, Quality and Training..
- Capabilities comprising Shooting and Close Combat capabilities..
- · Points cost per base.
- Minimum and maximum number of bases in each battle group.

• Minimum and maximum number of bases in the army.

Special features:

- Feudal men-at-arms can be Superior or Average. The list specifies the different points costs. All the bases in a battle group must be of the same quality. The army must include between 4 and 16 bases of feudal men-at-arms, organized into battle groups of from 4 to 6 bases each.
- Select levy can be Drilled or Undrilled. All the bases in a battle group must be of the same training. A select levy battle group can either have all of its bases as heavy foot with heavy weapon, or half of its bases as heavy foot with heavy weapon and half as medium foot with crossbow. Each battle group must have from 6 to 8 bases in total. The army must include between 12 and 24 bases of select levy.
- Separately deployed mounted attendants can be Average or Poor. All the bases in a battle group must be of the same quality. The army is allowed from 0–4 bases i.e. 1 battle group.
- Mounted Handgunners can only be used from 1450. The army is allowed from 0–4 bases i.e. 1 battle group.
- The total number of bases of mounted attendants, mounted crossbowmen and mounted Handgunners in the army cannot exceed 8.
