



The job of the 1st South African Division during Operation Lightfoot was to advance along with the 2nd New Zealand and help create the southern of the two tank lanes through the minefields. The division was able to advance to its objective line in good order with few casualties. On October 26th, the South Africans were ordered to also cover the front that the 2nd New Zealand and 9th Armored Brigade had occupied as these units were pulled back into reserve to ready them for Operation Supercharge. The division had no role in Supercharge and its last order was to take over the position of the 51st Highland Division. The 1st South African took no further part in the fighting in North Africa. The division was disbanded in January, with some of the troops being absorbed into the new 6th South African Armored Division which was being formed.
