

## 2nd New Zealand Infantry Division

September, 1941





The New Zealanders were given the primary job of carving a 24 foot wide line five miles through the minefields so that the tanks of the 9th Armored Brigade and the other armored divisions could pass. A special minefield taskforce was attached to each brigade for this mission. After the battle stalled on October 26th, the division was pulled back into reserve and became the lead unit in Operation Supercharge on November 2nd. The New Zealanders successfully cleared a path for the 9th Armored Brigade, but as the 9th advanced, it ran into a screen of anti-tank guns and was counterattacked by German and Italian armor. Losing most of its tanks, the sacrifice of the brigade proved valuable as most of the Axis tanks were lost as well and they had no replacements for them. The 2nd New Zealand continued to have a key role in the pursuit of the defeated Axis forces.
