38 ski troops armed with Mosin/Nagant rifles, 2 LMGs, 2 SMGs, 13 horses.



Same as previous, on skis. Sissi platoons have engineer assault capabilities.



3-4 x 120mm mortars (wz. 09/31), 30-35 men. In production when war broke out.



40 men armed with rifles, SMGs, 2 LMGs, 13 horses. The number of SMGs steadily rose from under 200 to 500 per battalion from 1941-45.



6 men and communications equipment.



5 trucks of assorted varieties (mostly captured), 5 men.



Same as above, on skis.



38 men armed with Mosin/Nagant rifles, 2 LMGs, 2 or more SMGs, 38 horses, 1-3 wagons. Cavalry is an extension of the infantry, mounted.



6 Aerosans of various makes (mostly captured), 24 men.



40 men armed with rifles, SMGs, 2 LMGs, 13 horses. The number of SMGs steadily rose from under 200 to 500 per battalion from 1941-45.



Same as above, with a higher ratio of MGs.



6 Komsomolets tractors, 12 men. A Russian built Bren Carrier. 202 were captured and used to tow antitank guns and howitzers.



Same as above, on skis.



4 wagons, 6 men, about 16 horses.



7-8 BA-10 armored cars, 28-32 men.



8 men armed with Mosin/Nagant rifles, 4 SMG, 2 LMG, "1 special sledge squad", horses or reindeer.



6 heavy sleds (or sledges), 24-36 horses or reindeer, 12 men.



3 Landsverk Anti II anti-aircraft tanks, 15 men. Finland bought 6 Landsverk Anti II anti-aircraft vehicles from Sweden in 1942.
