The 3rd Panzer began the campaign fighting in Army Group Center and spent most of 1941 and early 1942 fighting there. In spring of 1942, 3rd Panzer was reinforced with a third panzer battalion (along with some of the newest Panzer III & IV models) and sent to Army Group South to participate in Case Blue. The 3rd survived the 1942 campaign and went on to glory during the Battle of Kursk in 1943 in which it achieved the initial breakthrough. Like many German divisions, the 3rd Panzer spent the last two years in the East fighting a general withdrawal. The battered division finally surrendered to US forces in Austria in 1945.
