INFANTRY WEAPONS

With the second edition of **Twilight: 2000**, the combat system and small arms were radically changed. Unfortunately, this necessitated scrapping the old weapons statistics. When the revision was issued, we decided not to try to include all the new ratings in the basic rules, but to include a wide enough selection of weapons to allow referees to recreate important armies. We also decided to publish new ratings for small arms as soon as possible. This booklet is the result.

The appearance of **Merc: 2000** and the imminent publication of **Dark Conspiracy** and **Cadillacs & Dinosaurs** means that players of these games (all of them based on the same basic system and thus using compatible weapons) will need a variety of weapons not necessary in the **Twilight: 2000** situation. **Infantry Weapons of the World** addresses the needs of all of these games, in addition to serving as a basic resource for world small arms.

Corrections: In rating the weapons for this book, Frank and Itook the opportunity to introduce a number of minor corrections, remove a few inconsistencies, and fine tune things a bit. These ratings are considered authoritative over the ratings in the basic game. One of the main differences was to increase damages for many pistol rounds, adjust some ranges for more realism, and introduce a little more distinction between some calibers (primarily between the .357 Magnum and .44 Magnum).

Folding Stocks: Weapons with folding stocks have two bulk ratings. The rating on the left is with the stock folded, the rating on the right is with it extended. Aimed fire is possible only with the stock extended. Folding or extending a stock counts as an action.

Quick Kill (New Rule): Any aimed shot which hits the chest or head may constitute a killing shot. Roll a D10. If the roll is less than or equal to the damage value of the shot, the target is instantly killed except on a roll of 10 exactly. If the hit was scored on an area protected by armor, roll versus the remaining damage value of the round. For automatic fire, roll only once per phase (regardless of the number of shots that hit). This rule should be applied only to NPCs. It is recommended that PCs who suffer a killing wound instead suffer enough damage to increase the wound level of the head or chest to at least serious if unwounded (and critical if already serious), and in addition take the normal damage inflicted by the round.

RATING FORMULAS

No matter how large we made this book, we would have to leave out some weapon or cartridge that someone, somewhere, considers vitally important. Rating firearms for **Twilight: 2000** and related systems is a combination of calculation and referee fudging. We have, as a convenience to our referees and players, included some notes on the system of calculation we used.

You will need a reference work which gives muzzle velocity, bullet weight (that's the weight of the bullet only, not the weight of the cartridge) and the weapon's weight. You will also need to know a couple of things about the weapon itself, such as the presence of folding stocks, magazine capacity, and so on.

Rate of Fire (ROF): Rate of fire is based on the cyclical ROF of the weapon. The various types of action are described. Simply pick the one that comes closest (bolt action, semiautomatic, double-action revolver, single shot, etc.). If a fully automatic weapon has a burst limiter, use that number as the ROF. Otherwise, slow-firing automatic weapons (those with a cyclical ROF of less than 700) have a rate of fire of 5; fast automatic weapons (those with a cyclical ROF of between 701 and 1000) have a rate of fire of 10. Extremely high rates of fire get even higher ratings (1001 to 5000 gets 50, over 5000 gets 100).

Damage (Dam): To calculate damage, you need to know the weapon's muzzle energy. Muzzle energy is determined by the following:

E=MV²

E is muzzle energy; *M* is the mass of the bullet in grams; and *V* is the muzzle velocity in thousands of feet per second (yes, I know we are mixing units of measure here, but it works). Once you have muzzle energy, you plug that into the damage formula:

D=(VE+2)×.66

D is the damage (Dam) value, and E is the muzzle energy determined above.

Penetration (Pen): There is no easy formula for penetration, so it's a judgment call. Compare the caliber of the round with one or more that have already been rated and extrapolate from those numbers.

Bulk (Blk): Bulk represents the handiness of the weapon and the speed with which it can be brought into action. Bulk is related to the length of the weapon, with a slight fudge factor. Weapons less than 15 cm are bulk 0; 16-30 cm are bulk 1; 31-45 cm are bulk 2; 46-75 cm are bulk 3; 76-90 cm are bulk 4; and 91 cm and up are bulk 5.

Magazine Capacity (Mag): For consistency, pick the most common magazine where there are several. We do not include the round in the chamber. The types of magazines are defined in the basic rules; simply find the description that fits (or comes closest).

Recoil (SS and Brst): The recoil value of a single shot is determined by the following formula:

R=√E+W

R is the recoil of a single shot; E is muzzle energy; and W is the weight of the loaded weapon in kilograms. In addition, weapons with particularly high muzzle energies have the following modifiers added to their recoil value:

√E	Modifier
10	+1
15	+2
20	+3
25	+4

After making this addition, double all singleshot recoils (except for pistols). For burst fire, plug the individual recoil value into a second formula:

B=(RN)+2

B is the recoil of a burst; R is the recoil value of a single shot; and N is the number of bullets in the burst.

Other factors change recoil. Abipod halves the recoil of a weapon. A tripod halves the recoil of the weapon, and the weight of the tripod is added to the weight of the weapon when calculating recoil values. Pistols (only) have their recoil halved when a *stock* is attached (and extended, if it is a folding stock).

Range (Rng): There is no simple formula for range. For consistency, compare the range of the weapon to be rated (in meters) to a few similar weapons we have rated and extrapolate from those numbers. Remember to consider the difference between effective and maximum ranges (effective range is the range within which 50% or more of the rounds will strike a man-sized target, while maximum range is as far as the bullet will carry when the weapon is at full elevation). We use effective range as long range for our purposes and recalculate the table value from there (halved for medium, halved again for close, which is the value given on the table).

The weapon has an integral internal magazine loaded from 10round disposable stripper clips. The stock is hollow and can serve as a holster.
