

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INTRODUCTION

The Emperor's realm reels in the wake of the Great Rift's opening. Everywhere, madness and mutation run riot and Imperial armies fight desperate battles for survival against nightmarish odds. Chaos is in the ascendant, and in few locations is this more true than amidst the flames of War Zone Cadia.

Long did the fortress world of Cadia stand against the furious assault of Abaddon the Despoiler and his Thirteenth Black Crusade. Yet it could not stand forever, and Abaddon left Cadia a shattered and blasted husk. As he swept on towards fresh conquests, the warp interstice known as the Eye of Terror expanded in his wake. Day by day it swallows more of the region known as the Cadian Gate, and as the tendrils of the warp spread like blood through churning waters, one planetary system after another is beset by massed psychic mutation and plagues of madness.

The core of Abaddon's Black Crusade forces might have accompanied their master towards War Zone Vigilus, but teeming hordes of heretics, renegades, daemons and opportunistic xenos still prey upon the isolated

Imperial enclaves that remain. Tides of anarchy and bloodshed sweep through War Zone Cadia, presenting to some a golden opportunity to further their own twisted agendas.

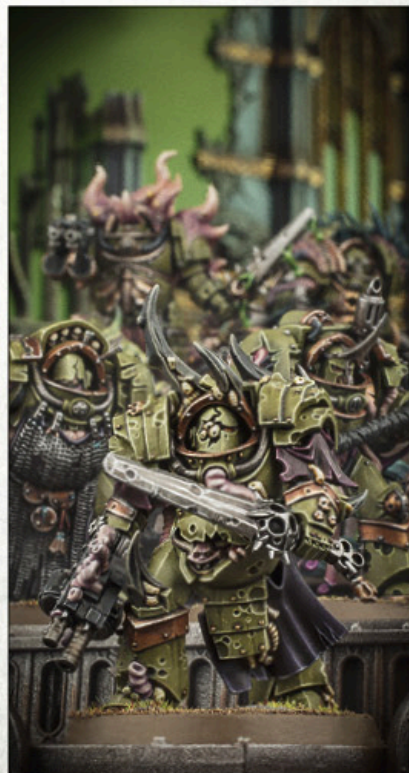

A CONVERGENCE OF PREY

Fabius Bile's campaign against the forces of the Death Guard and the Imperium took place amidst the war-torn ruins of the Cadian Gate. Its seeds were sown elsewhere, however, some in the benighted Scourge Stars and others upon the bloody soil of the world of Khassedur.

Khassedur had long been the Chapter planet of the Brazen Drakes. Noble and selfless defenders of Humanity, the Brazen Drakes had fought in the Emperor's name for over five thousand years. Amidst the darkness of the Noctis Aeterna, however, everything changed. Some believe their Chapter Master, Argento Corian, had been concealing latent psychic abilities for years. Others claim they manifested as a result of the Great Rift's baleful influence. Whatever the truth, by the time the Noctis Aeterna had ended, Corian and over half his Chapter had turned renegade.

Accounts of the brutal civil war that followed could fill a volume in their own right: how Corian renamed himself the Enlightener of his faithful disciples; how their conflict with their loyalist former brethren spiralled out to consume three entire Imperial systems; how at last the Brazen Drakes were defeated by the Torchbearer Task Force charged with delivering Primaris gene-tech to the once loyal Space Marines.

The Enlightener and the ragged remains of his warriors fled final retribution. They made for the Nachmund Gauntlet and the perception of safety offered by the lawless wilds beyond. In their wake, the Torchbearer fleet – commanded by Adeptus Custodes Shield-Captain Atal Tyvar – destroyed the gene-tech they had brought with them and executed the handful of surviving Brazen Drakes Greyshields, lest the taint of their Chapter's heresy run through their veins. Tyvar then vowed that he and his fleet would hunt the Enlightener to the ends of the galaxy, and set off in furious pursuit. Little did they suspect that news of the Brazen Drakes' perfidy had made it back to Terra by secret channels, and that another Imperial force was mobilising elite assets to track Corian down and slay him...

NEW SCHEMES

Fabius Bile's path converged with that of the Enlightener by chance, deep within the war-torn expanse of the Cadian

Gate. The Primogenitor was ever a master opportunist and soon turned happenstance to his advantage.

Bile was labouring in service to a grand new scheme, one he had conceived of even as the galaxy writhed with the opening of the Great Rift. Speculation was rife throughout the Eye of Terror and beyond as to what the Spider might be planning: another attempt at cloning or creating his own Primarch; the fashioning of some dread new altered army; development of a weapon that could lay low Roboute Guilliman or indeed any other similarly godlike being. Bile himself had revealed nothing of his schemes, even to his closest lieutenants, but he moved with a purpose through the mayhem and horror of the Imperium Nihilus.

That purpose had first manifested in the theft of a mighty arcane artefact that had originally been bestowed upon the Death Guard by none other than the Great Unclean One Rotigus himself. Named the Ark Cornucontagious, this gruesome gift of Nurgle seethed with a warp malady that triggered catastrophic and uncontrolled bodily regeneration in its victims. To the unnatural physiognomies of the Death Guard this was a boon, for the Ark's foul emissions allowed them to heal battle damage faster than their foes could inflict it. To any other being, however, the relic's effect was a monstrous blight that soon reduced even the mightiest warrior to a heaving mound of diseased flesh and ruptured, blubbery innards.

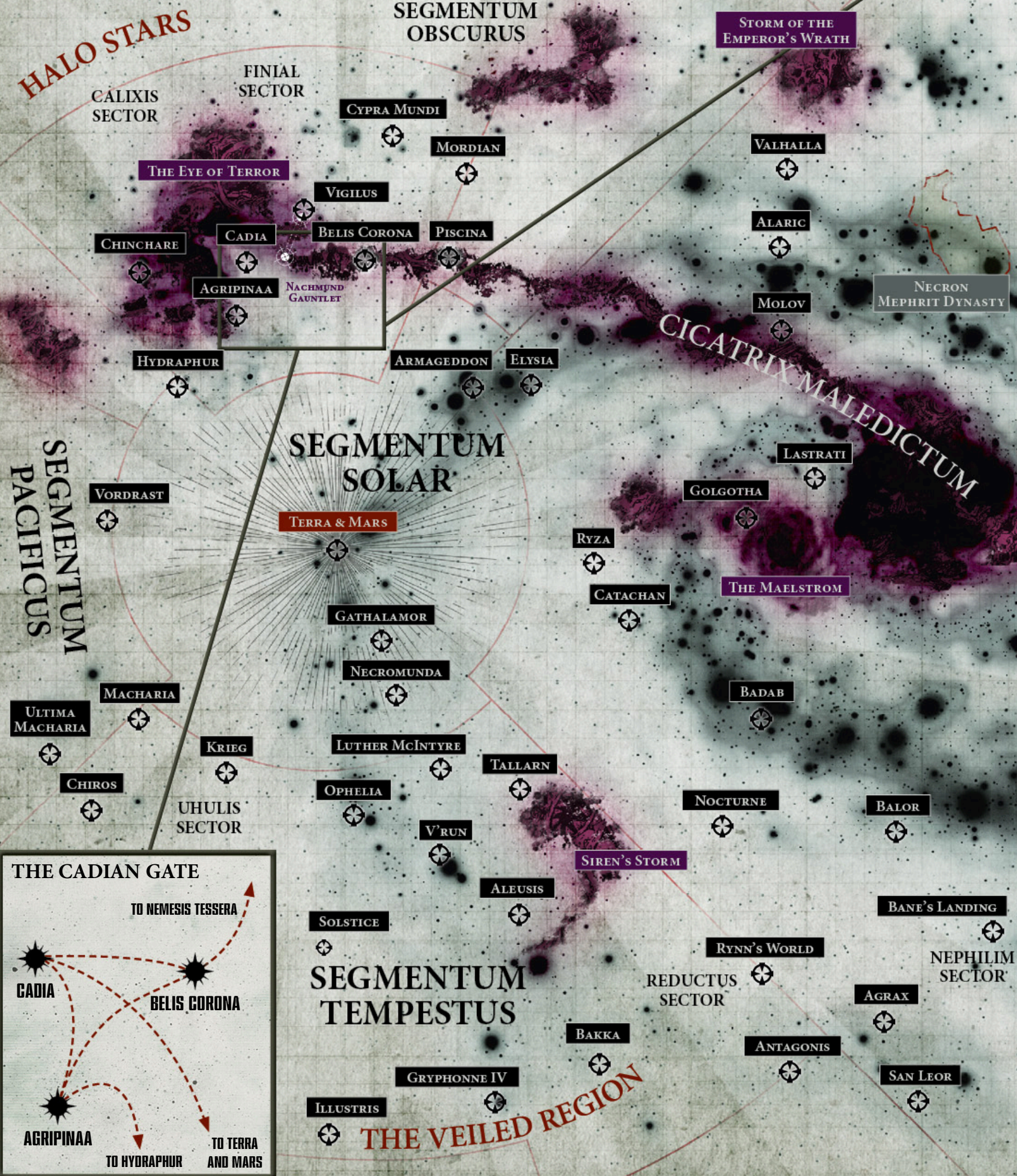

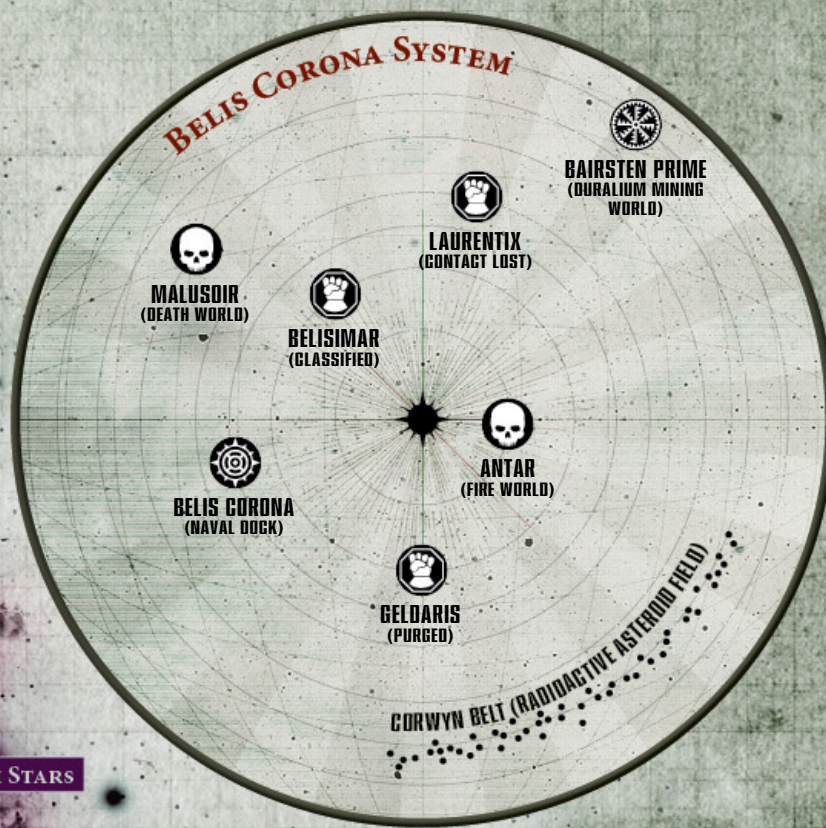
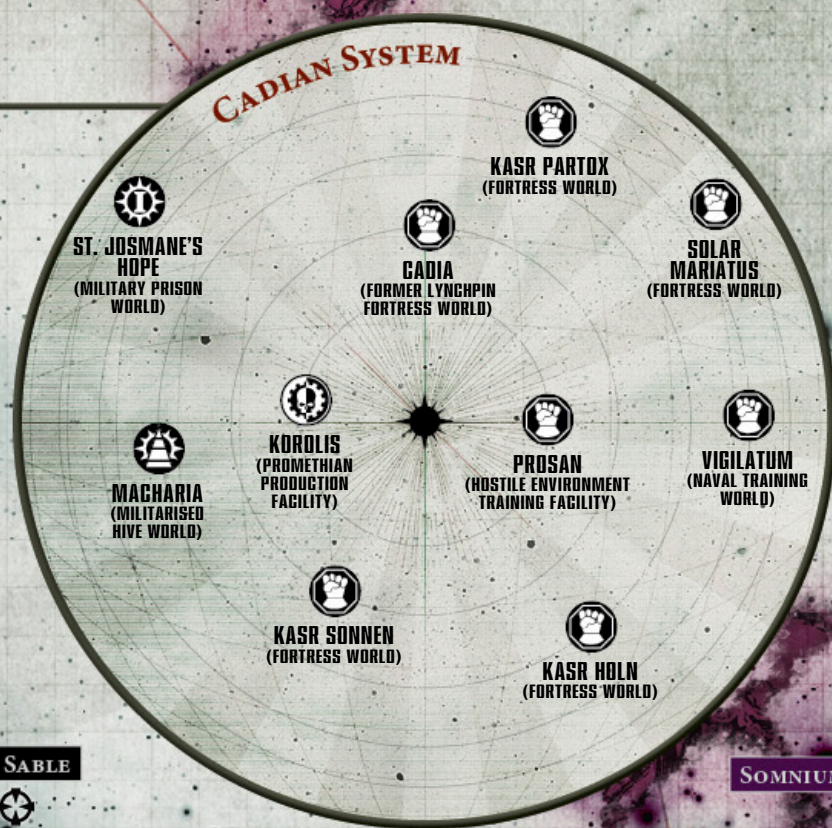

He had claimed the tainted fortress world of Dessah for his base and had reforged the Brazen Drakes into a warband calling themselves the Shriven, who now fought under the colours of Abaddon's Black Legion. Yet Corian had caught wind of the vengeful Imperial pursuit even now bearing down upon him. Thus, even as Bile saw in the Shriven an army he could turn against his pursuers, so they believed that with the Primogenitor's gifts they would be strong enough to crush the Imperial agents coming for their heads. It was a diabolical alliance of mutual mistrust, and one that Bile soon turned to his twisted advantage.

WAR ZONE CADIA

Abaddon's devastation of Cadia tore the keystone from the Imperial defences around the Eye of Terror. Even as those defences crumbled, the roiling energies of the warp rushed in through every gap. Much of the region is now feral and lawless, its sub-sectors carved up between warring heretic warbands while surviving Imperial worlds hold out amidst oceans of foes.

AMBUSH ON LIMAXIS

By the time Fabius Bile joined his forces to the Black Legionnaires of the Shriven, Typhus and his Plague Fleet were close on his heels. Recognising that swift action was crucial, Bile wasted no time convincing the Enlightener to mobilise his forces in exchange for certain 'gifts' of augmentation.

The poisonous light of a mutant star painted the brutish towers and redoubts of Dessah as Fabius Bile and Argento Corian cemented their alliance. Bile co-opted a sprawling suite of bio-warded vaults within which to continue his great works. He concealed the Ark Cornucontagious behind runic locks and servitor guns, then set his acolytes to work augmenting an initial wave of Shriven warriors. The Enlightener, it seemed, had lost none of the strategic cunning or charisma from his days as a loyalist Chapter Master. Bile saw evidence of not only a prodigious private army of Heretic Astartes serving at Corian's whim, but also hordes of cultists, mutants and rogue psykers as well as a menacing complement of traitor

warships that prowled the void beyond Dessah's orbital envelope. Bile knew he could do much with such resources, but time was of the essence. Even as he worked upon Corian's bio-augmentations in person, the Spider urged his new employer to swift action against the approaching threats.

Though he was initially fixated upon his Imperial pursuers, the Enlightener soon grasped the true scale of the more immediate peril represented by Typhus' Death Guard. He might have been expected to fly into a rage when he realised the size of the army that pursued his new ally. He did not. The elixirs Bile had injected him with had made Corian stronger, but had also plunged the hooks of

addiction and dependency into his soul. Coupled with certain subtle but invasive augmentations the Spider had wrought within his nervous system, the Enlightener was now Fabius Bile's creature whether he wished it or no.

Warp auguries by Corian's slave-sorcerers suggested that Typhus' flagship, the dreaded *Terminus Est*, was but days from exiting the warp above Dessah. Worse, the omens told of a fleet of plague ships sailing in his polluted wake, all of them packed to the gunwales with the diseased worshippers of Nurgle. If Typhus' force was allowed to attack the Shriven in such strength then the fight might well go ill for Bile and his new allies. Even if they prevailed against the Traveller,

The Enlightener thumped his fist against the runic access plate. He scowled as the armoured portal before him remained resolutely closed. Servitor guns in the corridor's ceiling swivelled, levelling their muzzles menacingly in his direction.

Corian stood back, his scowl deepening. The former Chapter Master was not used to doors within his own sanctum being locked against him. He found himself both angry and deeply disquieted. Corian was far from a fool; he knew that a deal with Fabius Bile was a dangerous bargain indeed. He also knew from experience that when one existed within the war-torn wilderness of the Cadian Gate, dangerous bargains were the only ones worth striking.

'Bile, a word if I might?' said Corian loudly into the corridor's still air. He knew the door had external vox pickups, and he was further certain that the Spider would have left them active. Surely even Fabius Bile was not so arrogant as to believe that he could burrow like a parasite into the Enlightener's fortress without being called upon to account for his actions.

Sure enough, the door hissed open. Sounds of whirring saw blades, splattering fluids and

agonised screaming washed out along with a strange-smelling vapour. Amidst the clouds stood Bile. The armatures of his Chirurgeon clicked and twitched menacingly, yet upon his face the ghost of a mocking smile clung to the corners of his mouth.

'My lord Enlightener, how may I serve my valued ally and master?'

'When you requested medicae facilities to proceed with your work, I did not realise you would fortify them against me. What are you doing in there, Bile?'

Fabius' smile broadened, though the action did not reach his eyes.

'My lord, it is merely that the works in which I and my acolytes are engaged require a certain... stability and peace... to achieve their best results. But of course, my lord, you are welcome to step within my sanctum and see for yourself what transpires within your walls.'

Corian was wary, but he could hardly shy away from entering chambers within his own fortress. He gave a curt nod and stepped through the gloomy portal, not at all liking the smile that Bile offered him in return.

the Shriven would be decimated, left powerless to stop the Imperial forces also drawing closer by the day.

A pre-emptive strike was required, to bleed Typhus' forces so badly that their attack would stall, or be called off altogether. The Enlightener suggested the world of Limaxis. Though Dessah shared its local space with a handful of gas giants and radiation-bathed hellscapes, Limaxis was the only nominally habitable planet that now lay between Typhus and his quarry. In the wake of whatever catastrophe destroyed its cities, Limaxis' oceans had risen to swallow all but one of its landmasses. This region, now known only as the Drowning Wastes, had become a swampy morass from which rose the rusting cadavers of dead hive cities and long-abandoned Imperial fortifications. Such terrain was hardly the ideal theatre in which to face the relentless Death Guard or their corrupting plagues, but with their strategic options limited, Bile and Corian elected to proceed.

Moving fast, the Enlightener mobilised almost half of his military assets. He and Bile led a formidable force into the void towards Limaxis, accompanied by the first batch of grotesquely altered Shriven – known as the Terata – and augmented with certain arcane technologies that Bile had accumulated over his long years. Their plan was set. The Spider was determined to drive Typhus from his trail, and cared little for what this would cost his allies.

DANGEROUS PREY

Since departing the Scourge Stars upon Bile's trail, Typhus and his vectoriums had been guided by the otherworldly senses of caged daemonic predators. The vile liquid entities had followed the Spider's psychic spoor with much ill-natured hissing and bubbling, but when they suddenly went into a rabid frenzy

Typhus took note. Surely, suddenly, he was all but on top of his prey!

The *Terminus Est* tore its way through the ectoplasmic meniscus of realspace like a putrid maggot bursting from the flesh of a corpse. Wallowing plague ships followed it out, all of them quickly detecting the frantic distress calls echoing across long-range vox. It was the work of moments to confirm the choral signifier as belonging to the *Wretch*, the warship aboard which Bile had made good his escape some weeks earlier; the vessel hung in low orbit over a nearby world, its warp engines dead, its blast-riddled hull bleeding atmosphere. There were life signs aboard, but they were faint.



Suspecting a trap, Typhus elected not to board the crippled craft. Instead he commanded carefully targeted salvos of lance fire that shot out the *Wretch's* remaining engines and sent it shuddering down into the planet's atmosphere. Let the ship crash down upon that marshy world, Typhus thought. The Ark was an artefact blessed by Nurgle himself, and would come to no harm. As for Bile and whatever followers he had left, Typhus doubted they would prove as durable.

It seemed as though someone survived aboard the *Wretch*, however. The ship fired emergency atmospheric thrusters that turned its plunge into a graceless glide and saw it splash down a few miles south of a toppled hive spire. The impact was enough to tear the *Wretch* in two and leave its innards strewn across a dozen miles of swampland. Typhus did not care; he ordered his ships to settle in orbit, then led a substantial invasion force down to the surface to claim his prize and, ideally, Bile's rotting head.

Rust-pocked landers and attack craft rumbled down through Limaxis' atmosphere, foul pollutants and unholy plague spores trailing behind them. One by one the noxious vessels settled in the planet's shallow waters and spread slicks of foulness across the surface. Thrumming clouds of plague flies boiled from the landers' noisome interiors as Plague Marines, diseased cultists and bloated Daemon Engines disembarked in great number. Plagueburst Crawlers threw up great fans of putrid mud as their treads churned in the filth. Led by Typhus' trusted lieutenants, the warbands waded through the mire and took up positions upon islands of comparatively solid ground around the crash site. Typhus and his entourage of Blightlord Terminators entered the wreck, following flickering energy signatures to where they believed Bile must have concealed the Ark.

Typhus was more than displeased when, instead of his precious relic, he found himself confronted with a rabble of half-dead slave clones and an extremely large bomb. The explosion sent rolling waves through the swamp water and blazing wreckage crashing down amidst the alarmed Death Guard. Before its echoes had even died away the traitors' vox channels filled with gurgling cries of distress from on high. The plague ships were under attack!

Slipping from behind the concealment of Bile's pilfered and retrofitted Commorrite night shields, four Shriven warships dove into the midst of Typhus' unsuspecting Plague Fleet. The dark of the void lit up with flickering lance fire and the rippling fire-blooms of broadside after broadside as the Black Legionnaires punished their diseased enemies for their incaution. The *Lamentation* was destroyed entirely, its blazing wreckage filling the Limaxian skies with streaks of fire as it broke up. The *Moribund*, the *Feculent Gift* and the *Rancid Blade* were all heavily damaged. Recognising that their position was untenable, the last three untouched plague ships broke orbit amidst flurries of diseased ordnance and drove for clear space in the hopes of re-forming and launching a determined counter-attack.

Dreadclaw Drop Pods and armoured gunships streaked down from the launch bays of the Shriven cruisers, bearing Bile, Corian and their followers to war. At the same time, advance bands of Terata – who had landed on the planet the day before and advanced under a blanket of sorcerous concealment – hurled themselves against the Death Guard defences. The thump of bolters and the boom of heavy artillery echoed across the foetid marshes as Typhus' forces let fly. Altered warriors dropped, thrashing and gushing boiling ichor as their wounded bodies self-destructed. Dreadclaws hit the mire amidst immense plumes of dirty water, disgorging squads of Black Legionnaires who hammered the Death Guard with close-ranged fire then charged their positions with chainswords howling. The Enlightener himself hovered from his transport's ramp surrounded by a furious psychic corona, drifting into the battle with beams of ravening warp energy leaping from

his blazing eyes. Bile, meanwhile, shadowed his puppet warlord, his clipped orders sending in howling bands of altered warriors to drive back any Plague Marines who looked to be staging a breakout.

The Death Guard positions recoiled and contracted like wounded molluscs. Plague cultists died in droves, herded mercilessly onto the ambushers' guns in order to give their masters the chance to stage a fighting retreat. Using the wreck of the *Wretch* for cover, Typhus' warriors dug in and kept firing. Other forces might have panicked or been overrun as the Shriven pressed home their attack, but the Death Guard are known for their tenacity above all things, and they displayed it now.

Their faith was rewarded as a terrible droning buzz filled the air and, wreathed in the daemonic insect swarms of the Destroyer Hive, Typhus led his surviving Blightlords from the burning heart of the wreck. Scorched, wounded, but very much alive, the Traveller rallied an armoured fist of Daemon Engines about him before launching a spearhead assault that butchered more than two dozen Terata and stalled the Black Legion momentum.

As the enemy pounded his warriors with harassing fire and probed for weaknesses, Typhus used the powers of a slave-sorcerer to contact his plague ship captains in orbit. What he learned gave the Death Guard fresh heart; successfully reforming their line, the plague ships *Filthmonger*, *Vermian Curse* and *Leper's Blood* had driven the Shriven cruisers back, mauling both the *Hand of Darkness* and the *Bloodied Talon* in the process. Typhus' captains requested permission to press their attack and smash the smaller Shriven fleet, but the Traveller refused. Instead he had the least damaged of his ships form a blockade to hold the Shriven craft at bay. Meanwhile,

the *Moribund* and the *Rancid Blade* settled low in Limaxis' atmosphere and unleashed carefully targeted creeping bombardments. As lance beams and plague bombs screamed down from on high, the outermost Shriven support elements suddenly found themselves in the midst of a devastating firestorm. Herded inwards by the encircling fire patterns, Bile and his forces found themselves caught between ruinous detonations to their rear and the thundering guns of the Death Guard to the fore.

Worse was to follow as fresh waves of Death Guard made planetfall amidst storms of fire to the north, south-east and south-west of the crash site. From their lowered ramps issued wave upon wave of plague-ridden Poxwalkers. The grinning, groaning zombies spilled from their landing craft like vomit and encircled the Black Legion with the horrible inevitability of a wasting sickness. It appeared that the ambushers were now caught in their own barbed web.

Shield-Captain Tyvar had led his Torchbearers through the war-torn Nachmund Gauntlet, through the fringes

of War Zone Vigilus and on into the very rim of the Eye of Terror. He and his comrades had remained strong, their purpose unwavering, but their road had been perilous indeed. Even with a full Cadre of Silent Sisters scattered across their craft, each warp jump through the storms of the Imperium Nihilus had been hellish. They had faced hostile forces time and again. They had suffered losses. Now, with their quarry close at hand and the moment of truth almost upon them, Shield-Captain Tyvar had elected to re-arm and repair his surviving forces before running his prey to ground.

Tyvar's hopes of refitting at the naval docks of Belis Corona were dashed; that mighty fortress was beset by myriad foes, and what resources it had were required to keep its own fleets operational. Instead, Tyvar's task force settled into high orbit above Bairsten Prime in the hopes that the Tech-Magi who ran its famed duralium mines could be prevailed upon to effect repairs.

In fact, the Torchbearers found a world abandoned and fallen into ruin. What catastrophe had overtaken Bairsten Prime was unclear, but repeating warnings cycled across every vox frequency, beseeching all to avoid this cursed world in the Omnissiah's name. Tyvar was in no mood to heed such ghostly deterrents, however; not when auspex confirmed vast quantities of refined duralium languishing in rusted silos within a complex signified as Refinery XVI. Leaving his own Tech-Adepts to make what repairs they could upon his warships, the Shield-Captain led his forces to the surface. They dove through its furious electrical storms to claim the resources they required.

Such was the Imperial disposition when the Enlightener and his fleet tore their way from the warp into the Belis Corona System. Swift and powerful though they

Presented with the sudden threat of an advancing Black Legion fleet, Shield-Captain Tyvar's ships could do little more than fend off the heretic ships with battery fire and do what they could to protect the vulnerable ore shuttles.

The Enlightener had little interest in the Imperial ships, however; his quarry lay on the planet below, for he had sworn before all his warriors that he would slay Atal Tyvar in single combat. The enemy's fleet could be dealt with later, once the warriors they transported had been slain. On Corian's orders, flights of armoured gunships and combat landers flurried from the embarkation decks of his cruisers. Escorted by flights of Black Legion Helderakes, they swept down upon Bairsten's equatorial mining plains and the isolated life-signs around Refinery XVI.

The leading Shriven dropships were met by ferocious anti-aircraft fire. Tyvar had awoken the servitor crews of the refinery's Icarus turrets; now the weapons tracked and span, barrels thumping as they fired clouds of flak shells up at the descending craft. Helderakes pinwheeled away trailing flames and wing fragments. A heavy lander detonated, raining wreckage and blazing bodies down upon the refinery. It was Bile who gave the order for the Shriven to redirect their assault, sending their dropships swooping away towards the small industrial spaceport a mile to the south.

Now they reared suddenly into view amidst the howl of powerful engines and subjected the Shriven to a punishing salvo of missiles. As they did, the retreating Custodes turned and let fly. Explosions tore Heretic Astartes apart. A Shriven Predator detonated with a fiery roar, chunks of its wreckage spinning away ablaze.



The Enlightener's furious oaths echoed across the lightning-lashed plains. The air quivered with empyric tension before the altered sorcerer unleashed a furious storm of psychic energies into the causeway. Even the vaunted aegis of the Emperor was not enough to stop this explosion of raw force, which hurled three of the Custodians from the causeway and sent two Dawneagle jetbikes spinning away to explode on the hard bedrock below.

Again the surviving Imperial forces fell back and again the Shriven gave chase. Again Bile hung back amidst the bulk of the assault force,

watching with detached interest as Corian and his Chosen warriors reached the railhead in the shadow of the refinery's towers. Shield-Captain Tyvar had gathered a formidable force of Custodians and Null-Maidens around him, Venerable Contemptor Dreadnoughts and even Land Raiders rumbling up in support. Yet Bile's twisted surgery had done terrible things to the Enlightener, and to many of his followers. Unable to restrain their psychotic battle-lust, they hurled themselves into a maniacal charge and battle was joined. As the fighting raged, none noticed the dark figure that crouched amidst the rusting walkways of a macro-silo high above. The figure stayed still as death, a long and deadly-looking rifle cradled in its hands.

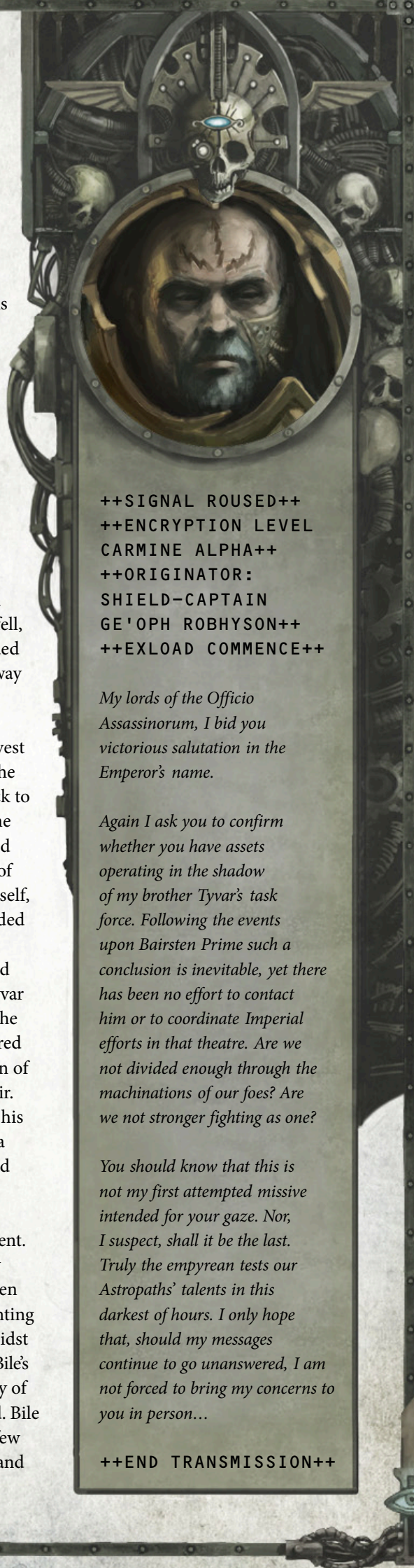

THE UNRAVELLING WEB

Bile and the surviving Shriven retreated to Dessah, falling back behind their fortress' high battlements and gun emplacements. The Shriven seers wailed of not one but two foes drawing closer with every passing hour. In desperation, some amongst the warband beseeched Fabius Bile to aid them, while others muttered darkly that the Spider had already done more than enough. For his part, Bile was satisfied with events. He had not predicted Corian's fall upon Bairsten and had some grave suspicions about its authors, but he had been quick to capitalise upon this unexpected boon. leave them untouched while driving the Death Guard and Imperial warriors into a murderous frenzy. With their enemies lost to madness and tearing one another apart, Bile and the remaining Shriven could flee aboard a swift frigate and slip away into the warp.

Frenzied preparations followed Bile's pronouncements, and the Primary Bastion was ready by the time Typhus' plague ships appeared above Dessah. The Traveller had not been idle. Piratical raids of neighbouring systems had yielded the resources to repair his vessels. He had gathered cultists from seven different worlds, and swollen his depleted ranks further by the addition of thousands upon thousands of Poxwalkers. Now he was coming for the Ark Cornucontagious, and for revenge.

The gilded gunships delivered Adeptus Custodes and Silent Sisters into the ruins, where they struck at the Daemon Engines still pummelling the fortress. Fighting raged through the ruins as Custodians hacked apart Myphitic Blight-Haulers, salvoes of blight shells laid gleaming Imperial heroes low, and one by one the Plagueburst Crawlers were blasted to scrap.

With the enemy guns silenced, the Adeptus Custodes and Null-Maidens turned for the breach. Their orders were to hack a path through the besieging hordes to where the Enlightener still fought and – now that the threat of plague bombardment had been removed – engage the turncoat sorcerer.

Meanwhile, a pair of Imperial gunships drew level with one of the

Primary Bastion's upper casemates. Spitting a vow to have his vengeance upon Bile, he chanted an incantation and was wreathed in a roaring storm of plague flies. When they dissipated the Traveller was gone, leaving the last of his warriors to face the fury of Tyvar and his companions alone.

At the breach, the Enlightener and his berserk warriors had torn and blasted so many foes that mountains of dead lay all around them. Yet their numbers too were dwindling. It was now that the Execution Force struck. First came

As one, the Heldrakes swept from their perches atop the mountain's peak. They screamed down upon the warriors battling furiously in the breach. The Enlightener was hammering the enemy hordes with one psychic blast after another, his Shriven laying down fusillades of fire as the last of their tanks fired again and again.

Still the Death Guard pressed forward, Poxwalkers in their hundreds clambering over their own fallen to totter into the fight. The neverdead buried the altered warriors with their numbers while Plague Marines raked the Black Legion lines with fire.

Further back, out amongst the ruins, the Imperial forces were cutting a gory swathe towards the breach, but their momentum was slowing in

the face of the relentless servants of Nurgle.

Now it was time to trigger yet more anarchy and bloodshed. One at a time the Heldrakes opened their jaws wide and, as they swooped low over the battle, breathed roiling clouds of mauve gasses across the combatants. Bile had possessed neither time nor inclination to tailor his toxins to his foes, but he had ample data concerning the altered biochemistry of his augmented Shriven. Thus, as the clouds drifted down and flowed into rebreathers and open mouths, it was the Enlightener and his warriors who were driven to new heights of berserk fury, not their foes. One last betrayal of his ill-fated allies by Fabius Bile; one last trick to ensure that they kept his pursuers busy long enough to cover his escape.

a rifle round, fired from atop a ruined spire. The Enlightener's head snapped up and he obliterated the bullet in mid-air with a psychic blast. The empyric bolt roared on, back up the shot's trajectory to impact with killing force. Amidst the explosion a ruined, black-clad figure tumbled blazing to its death.

Next came the Callidus, morphing into her true form as she suddenly emerged from amidst the Enlightener's shocked cultists. Her neural shredder howled as she blasted first one Shriven Terata, then another and another. Flipping over a fourth, the Callidus swept her phase sword around to decapitate the altered warrior, then drove the blade into the Enlightener's chest. The sorcerer roared with pain then blasted the lithe assassin backwards into a mound of corpses with another psychic pulse. Yet his bellow of triumph became a howl of agony as a beam of raw darkness hit him, banishing his psychic powers in an instant. The Enlightener looked up to see the eerie figure of a Culexus Assassin flickering towards him. Before the sorcerer could regather his powers the skull-masked figure of an Eversor Assassin tore through a knot of Terata like an artillery shell and ploughed into him. The frenzied assassin tore madly at the Enlightener. One hand was blown off by a bolt round from the Eversor's executioner pistol before the assassin's hypodermic talons sunk deep into the Enlightener's face. One eye punctured, flesh blackening with toxins, the altered sorcerer grabbed his assailant by the throat, lifted him high and snapped the assassin's neck with raw psychokinetic force.

The Enlightener enjoyed a moment of triumph before the Eversor's blood chemistry went into critical meltdown and his body exploded with the force of a demolition charge. As the dust settled, the ruptured corpse of the Enlightener finally twitched its last.

Their mission completed, the Culexus and wounded Callidus vanished into the anarchy of the battle. Yet in truth the conflict was done. A few tattered handfuls of Shriven remained, leaderless, lost to madness or fleeing wildly. As a warband they were utterly spent. Word had reached the Death Guard, meanwhile, that their master had returned to the Plague Fleet and had ordered them to fall back. Their quarry had escaped again. Full of bitterness and disgust, the Plague Marines quit the field.

Less than a quarter of Shield-Captain Tyvar's original forces remained to link up deep within the fortress and purge the revolting horrors remaining within Bile's

abandoned laboratory. With their targets slain but their comrades lost to Bile's clutches, Tyvar believed it essential that word of what they had witnessed should find its way back to the Imperial authorities. This would be his new duty. Thus the Imperial warriors collected their fallen, lamented their lost, and left the Cadian Gate behind them.

As for Fabius Bile, he was not seen again upon Dessah – his ship had slipped away, a light frigate ghosting through the orbital debris fields and the last flickering exchanges of the void war before punching into warp space and making good its escape. The Primogenitor had work to do upon Urum, and he did not mean for it to be delayed...



Echoes of Awakening

All across the galaxy, voices are raised in terror, confusion, bloodlust and dark praise as the Great Rift yawns wide. Even within the beleaguered bounds of the Imperium Sanctus this cacophony of horrors is enough to drown the minds of the Astropaths forced to decipher them. Deep within the swirling madness of the Imperium Nihilus, meanwhile, those screams ring louder still.

THE THRESHING FIELDS

The rules presented in this section allow you to play games set in locations inspired by those found in the narrative of this book, as well as play through some of the most dramatic moments from the battles on Limaxis, Bairsten and Dessah. Will you command the elite Imperial forces, the putrid ranks of the Death Guard, or the abominable creations of Fabius Bile himself?

INTRODUCTION

This section starts by providing a new Theatre of War, designed to represent the battlefields of the War of the Spider. Agents of the Officio Assassinorum lurk in the shadows, waiting for the moment to strike their designated target, and will silence anyone who tries to interfere with their directives.

While these rules are designed for recreating the War of the Spider, they can be used and modified to represent any location where the Officio Assassinorum has an active interest. This could be a war zone in which enemies of the Imperium are arrayed on both sides of the conflict, or one in which loyal servants of the Emperor learn at gunpoint that they have

made enemies amongst the High Lords of Terra.

On pages 26-31, three new Crucible of War missions are presented for narrative play. Merciless Ambush allows players to fight out the harrowing battle on Limaxis, Hostile Acquisitions pits players against one another in a conflict such as that which took place on the mining plains of Bairsten, while Unexpected Quarters is based on the brutal events on Dessah.



THEATRES OF WAR

As the Enlightener and his warband of corrupted Space Marines join forces with Fabius Bile, they draw the ire of both the Imperium and the Death Guard. Though the Spider remains always one step ahead of his pursuers, the agents of the Officio Assassinorum have numerous ways of reaching their quarry.

In this section you will find an exciting new Theatre of War to use in your games of Warhammer 40,000. Theatres of War offer new tactical challenges to enrich your games, and introduce new rules to represent many varied battle environments. Some modify the core rules (e.g. by altering the range of weapons). Some provide new rules for phenomena like dust storms, volcanic eruptions and earthquakes. Some grant additional abilities and Stratagems to certain units.

These rules are designed to reflect the dangers faced by agents of the Officio Assassinorum on the battlefield, but they are entirely optional and, so long as you and your opponent agree, can be used in any Warhammer 40,000 game.

Agree which, if any, Theatre of War rules will be used when you are setting up the battlefield, before deployment.

THEATRE OF WAR: HOSTILE OPERATIVES

Assassins have taken up positions around the battlefield. They lie in wait, their amplified senses honed on their targets, and will reveal themselves only when the success of their mission is placed in jeopardy.

Before the battle, the players must gather at least one **OFFICIO ASSASSINORUM** unit. We recommend using between two and six **OFFICIO ASSASSINORUM** units to ensure this environment is suitably challenging. These are referred to as Assassin units.

Lurking in the Shadows: Before either side deploys, you must first infiltrate the battlefield with lurking Assassins. To do so, you will need six objective markers: if there are fewer than six objective markers on the battlefield, after setting up any mandatory objective markers required for the mission, set up additional objective markers until there are six (these additional objective markers must be set up more than 9" away from any other objective markers and not within 6" of any battlefield edge. They have no effect on any victory conditions). The players then randomly select, one at a time, a number of different objective markers equal to the number of Assassin units, setting up a randomly selected Assassin unit within 6" of each of those objective markers. Once all of the Assassin units have been set up, remove any additional objective markers that were set up.

Assassin Units: Assassin units are treated as enemy units by both players, and Assassin units treat each unit in a player's army as an enemy unit. Assassin units treat other Assassin units as friendly units. In the Fight phase, Assassin units fight after all other units unless they have charged in their turn (see below). If possible, in the Fight phase, each Assassin model will target the closest enemy **CHARACTER** unit with all of its attacks. If two units are equally close, randomly select which they will target with their attacks. When resolving attacks or making saving throws etc. for Assassin units, we recommend your opponent rolls the dice. The Command Re-roll Stratagem cannot be used to re-roll dice rolls made for Assassin units.

The Assassin Turn: At the end of each battle round, the Assassin units have a 'turn'. In their Movement phase, each Assassin unit will move as far as possible towards the closest enemy **CHARACTER UNIT** (unless they are already within 1" of one), but they will not Fall Back or Advance. In their Shooting phase, each model will shoot at the closest visible enemy **CHARACTER** unit within range, ignoring the usual restriction on targeting **CHARACTERS**. In their Charge phase, if two units are equally close, randomly determine which they will charge. In addition, if they are within 12" of any enemy **CHARACTER** units in their Charge phase, they will attempt to charge the closest enemy **CHARACTER** unit. In their Fight phase, Assassin units behave as described

previously. If any sequencing issues arise, the players roll off and the winner decides the order in which the rules in question are resolved.

The following additional rules apply to each type of Assassin:

CALLIDUS

- This model's Polymorphine ability is not used.
- Treat both players as being affected by this model's Reign of Confusion ability.
- At the start of its Movement phase, if this model is within 1" of an enemy unit that is not a **CHARACTER**, it will Fall Back. It must end this Fall Back as close as possible to the closest enemy **CHARACTER** unit.

CULEXUS

- If possible, then, instead of the closest **CHARACTER** unit, this model will always move towards the closest **PSYKER** unit.
- If a **PSYKER** is in range and visible to them, if able, this model will always target this unit instead of the closest **CHARACTER** unit.
- In its Charge phase, if there is a **PSYKER** within 12" of this model, this model will always attempt to charge that model instead of the closest **CHARACTER** unit.
- In the Fight phase, this model will target a **PSYKER** unit with attacks made with melee weapons.

EVERSOR

If no **CHARACTER** units are within range or visible to this model in the Assassin's Shooting phase, and the closest enemy unit is a **VEHICLE**, if possible this model will attack with melta bombs instead of its executioner pistol.

VINDICARE

This model will never move in its Movement phase, unless it is within 1" of an enemy unit that is not a **CHARACTER**, in which case it will Fall Back. When it does so, it will move as fast as possible in order to end that move as far away as possible from any enemy models.

CRUCIBLE OF WAR

MERCILESS AMBUSH

The attacking force has lured their prey into a trap, and now look to press their advantage with a merciless assault. The defenders must regroup and hold firm, their resolve the only route to victory.

THE ARMIES

Each player must first muster an army from their collection. A player can include any models in their army, but this mission is most suited to armies that contain numerous units of **INFANTRY** and few, if any, **AIRCRAFT** and **TITANIC** units. If a player's army is Battle-forged they will also be able to use the appropriate Stratagems included with this mission (see opposite). Once the armies have been chosen, the players must decide who will be the Attacker and who will be the Defender.

THE BATTLEFIELD

Create the battlefield using the deployment map below and set up terrain. There should be cover across the battlefield, in particular within the Defender's deployment zone. There should then be line of sight blocking terrain and other forms of cover across the battlefield, in particular within the Attacker's deployment zone.

DEPLOYMENT

The Defender deploys their army wholly within their deployment zone. The Attacker does not deploy their army. At the end of their first Movement phase, they set up their army as reinforcements wholly within their deployment zone. Any **VEHICLE** units from their army must be set up wholly within 12" of the Attacker's battlefield edge.

FIRST TURN

The Attacker has the first turn.

DELAYED REINFORCEMENTS

Any of the Defender's units not set up on the battlefield during deployment cannot be set up in the first battle round, and such a unit

can only be set up in the second battle round on a D6 roll of 4+. They can be set up as normal from the third and subsequent battle rounds.

MERCILESS AMBUSH

In the first battle round, when resolving an attack made with a ranged weapon against a unit from the Attacker's army that is wholly within 1" of a terrain feature, subtract 1 from the hit roll. In the first battle round, models in the Defender's army cannot be set up or finish any kind of move more than 12" away from the Defender's deployment zone.

LOST MOMENTUM

At the start of the battle round, the Attacker loses momentum as follows:

- Third and subsequent battle rounds: Each time the Attacker wishes to use a Stratagem, they must spend one additional Command Point to use that Stratagem.
- Fourth and subsequent battle rounds: Models in the Attacker's

army cannot be affected by the aura abilities of friendly models.

- Fifth battle round: When resolving an attack made by a model in the Attacker's army, subtract 1 from the hit roll.

BATTLE LENGTH

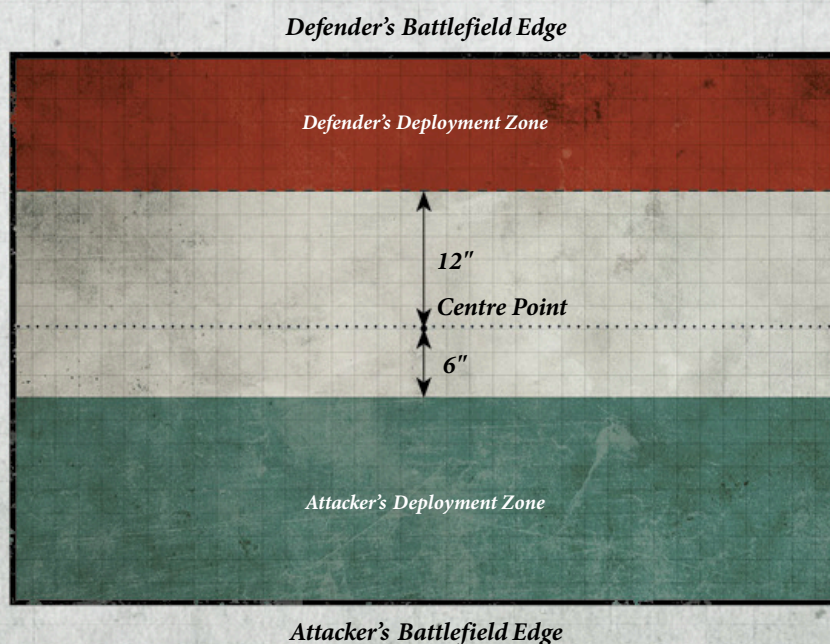
The battle automatically ends at the end of battle round 5.

VICTORY CONDITIONS

No Mercy: At the end of each battle round, a player scores 1 victory point if more units from their opponent's army were destroyed in that battle round than were destroyed from their own army in that battle round.

No Respite: At the end of the battle, each player adds up the total Power Rating or points value (using whichever method was used to build your army) of destroyed units from their army. The player with the lowest total scores 1 victory point.

Iron Resolve: At the end of the battle, the Defender scores 1 victory point if any units from their army are on the battlefield.



STRATAGEMS

In this mission, the players can use Command Points (CPs) to use the following bonus Stratagems:

1/2CP

DARING AMBUSH

Attacker Stratagem

With the enemy in sight, the ambushers rush forward to encircle their prey.

Use this Stratagem at the end of your first Movement phase. Select one **INFANTRY**, **BEAST** or **SWARM** unit from your army for 1CP, or two such units for 2CP. Those units can immediately move and can Advance, even though they were set up as reinforcements this turn. Those units must end that move more than 9" away from any enemy models.

1CP

COUNTER-ATTACK

Defender Stratagem

Surrounded and caught off guard, warriors rally together to bring the fight to their enemy.

Use this Stratagem at the end of your opponent's Charge phase. Select one unit from your army. If there are any enemy units within 6" of that unit, it can perform a Heroic Intervention as if it were a **CHARACTER**, and can move up to 6" when doing so.

2CP

RIGGED TRAP

Attacker Stratagem

Hidden explosives, psychic detonators or ravenous bio-vectors savage the enemy before a shot has been fired.

Use this Stratagem at the start of the first battle round, but before the first turn begins. Select one enemy unit on the battlefield that is not a **CHARACTER**. That unit suffers D3 mortal wounds. Roll one D6 for each other unit within 3" of that unit. On a 3+ that other unit suffers D3 mortal wounds. Until the start of the next battle round, halve the Move characteristic of any unit that suffered mortal wounds as a result of this Stratagem.

1CP

HEROIC LEADERSHIP

Defender Stratagem

It is only in the crucible of battle that commanders of great renown are forged.

Use this Stratagem during deployment, when you deploy a **CHARACTER** unit from your army. Add 3" to the range of that unit's aura abilities. You can only use this Stratagem once.

1CP

TAKE COVER

Defender Stratagem

When caught in the open, hillocks of rubble and the corpses of the dead can provide some measure of cover.

Use this Stratagem in any phase when a unit from your army within your deployment zone is chosen as the target of an attack. Until the end of that turn, that unit is treated as having the benefit of cover to its saving throw unless it has the **AIRCRAFT** or **TITANIC** keywords.

1CP

FIERCE ASSAULT

Attacker Stratagem

The carefully orchestrated hunt comes to a violent crescendo as the stalkers close upon their foe.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase or the Fight phase, when a unit from your army is chosen to shoot or fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made by a model in that unit against the closest enemy unit, add 1 to the wound roll.

CRUCIBLE OF WAR

HOSTILE ACQUISITIONS

For the canny commander, the battlefield presents a wealth of strategic resources to be seized. Some armies may concentrate on sites of tactical importance or stockpiles of valuable materiel. Then again, to some the plundered minds and dissected flesh of enemy heroes possess a worth all of its own...

THE ARMIES

Each player must first muster an army from their collection. A player can include any models in their army, but this mission is most suited to armies that contain numerous units of **INFANTRY** and few, if any, **AIRCRAFT** and **TITANIC** units. If a player's army is Battle-forged, they will also be able to use the appropriate Stratagems included with this mission (see opposite). Once the armies have been chosen, the players must then decide who will be the Attacker and who will be the Defender.

THE BATTLEFIELD

Create the battlefield using the deployment map below and set up terrain. If possible, there should be a ruin or building that each of the objective markers can be set up in, or on.

DEPLOYMENT

The Defender sets up each of their **CHARACTER** units wholly within their deployment zone and more than 9" from any battlefield edge. **CHARACTER** units from the Defender's army must be set up on the battlefield in this way, and cannot be set up in any other locations. The Attacker then sets up their army, wholly within their deployment zone. Once the Attacker has finished setting up, the Defender sets up their remaining units, wholly within their deployment zone.

FIRST TURN

The Attacker has the first turn.

TAKEN ALIVE

If a **CHARACTER** unit from the Defender's army is destroyed by an attack made with a melee weapon, instead of removing that model from the battlefield, the Attacker can choose to place it next to the unit that made that attack. If they do so, that model is said to have been captured by that unit. It is no longer treated as a unit, but as a marker instead. If the model would impede the movement of any other models, simply move it out of the way. If the unit that has captured that **CHARACTER** is destroyed, the marker is removed, and that model is no longer said to have been captured.

BATTLE LENGTH

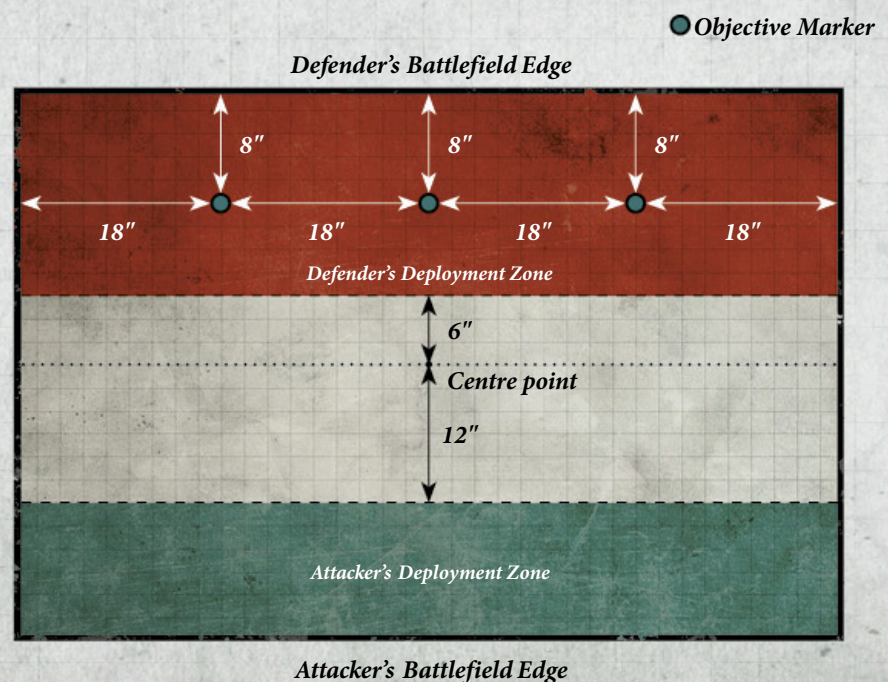
The battle automatically ends at the end of battle round 5.

VICTORY CONDITIONS

Vital Supplies: At the end of each battle round, a player scores 1 victory point if they control more objective markers than their opponent.

Captured Commanders: At the end of the battle, the Attacker scores 1 victory point for each enemy **CHARACTER** that is captured by one of their units.

Hold the Line: At the end of the battle, the Defender scores 1 victory point for each objective marker they control.



STRATAGEMS

In this mission, the players can use Command Points (CPs) to use the following bonus Stratagems:

1CP

SIPHON MATERIALS

Attacker Stratagem

Accompanied by non-combatant thralls and menials, these fighters know they can push onto the next objective while their subordinates concentrate on stealing supplies.

Use this Stratagem at the end of any battle round. Select one objective marker that you control. Until your opponent controls it, treat that objective marker as if 2 models in your army were within 3" of it.

1CP

FREED FROM THEIR BONDS

Defender Stratagem

Seeing their leaders carried away, some warriors will throw themselves into the fray to free them, heedless of any danger to themselves.

Use this Stratagem in your Charge phase when a unit from your army ends a charge move within 1" of an enemy unit that has any captured **CHARACTER** markers. Roll one D6 for each of those captured **CHARACTER** markers. On a 4+ that marker is removed.

2CP

ADVANCE SCOUTS

Attacker Stratagem

These forces have ranged ahead of the main force, locating the objectives and allowing the rest of the army to sweep in with precise intel.

Use this Stratagem during deployment, when you set up a unit from your army that has a Power Rating of 5 or less. That unit can be set up anywhere on the battlefield that is more than 9" away from the Defender's deployment zone, instead of wholly within the Attacker's deployment zone.

1CP

DETERMINED DEFENCE

Defender Stratagem

Through rousing oratory, grit and determination, these warriors will die rather than let the enemy capture this area.

Use this Stratagem at the start of the Morale phase. Select one unit from your army that is within 3" of any objective markers. When a Morale test is taken for this unit, do not roll the dice; it is automatically passed.

2CP

SEIZE SUPPLIES

Attacker Stratagem

In the event of a deadlock, your warriors grit their teeth and push the enemy back, however temporarily.

Use this Stratagem at the end of any battle round if you and your opponent both control the same number of objective markers. You are treated as controlling more objective markers than your opponent this battle round for the purposes of the Vital Supplies victory condition.

3CP

EVACUATE SUPPLIES

Defender Stratagem

Your forces have a supply of transport vehicles on hand to move these supplies to a new location should they come under heavy assault, assuming you can hold the foe long enough for them to be loaded.

Use this Stratagem at the end of any battle round. Select an objective marker that you control. If you still control that objective marker at the end of the next battle round, you can remove that objective marker from the battlefield. If you do so, that objective marker cannot be controlled at the end of any subsequent battle rounds, but at the end of the battle, your army is treated as controlling it for the purposes of the Hold the Line victory condition.

CRUCIBLE OF WAR

UNEXPECTED QUARTERS

The enemy have overrun your defences. The only thing left to do is to sacrifice your troops to buy you time to evacuate. However, as you make your way from the battle, another force unexpectedly arrives to cut off your escape...

THE ARMIES

This mission can be played with two or three players. One player will be the Defender. Another player will be the Attacker. If there is a third player, that player will be the Assassin. Otherwise, the Attacker will control a second force as the Assassin. Each player must muster an army from their collection. The Assassin should control a force that is approximately half the Power Level of that controlled by the Defender. If a player's army is Battle-forged, they will also be able to use the appropriate Stratagems included with this mission (see opposite).

THE BATTLEFIELD

Create the battlefield using the deployment map below and set up terrain. There should be more terrain features in the Defender's deployment zone than there are in the other half of the battlefield.

DEPLOYMENT

The Defender sets up their Warlord wholly within the Warlord's deployment zone. The Attacker and Defender then alternate setting up units, wholly within their own deployment zones. The Assassin's army is not set up on the battlefield, but if they have any units that can be set up in other locations (teleportariums, in the sky, in the webway etc.) they can declare which of their units will be set up in these locations.

FIRST TURN

The Assassin has the first turn, followed by the Attacker, then the Defender.

ASSASSINATION FORCE

At the end of their second and each subsequent Assassin's Movement phase, the Assassin player can roll one D6 for each unit in their army; on a 4+ that unit can be set up on the battlefield, anywhere within 6" of the Assassin's battlefield edge and more than 1" from any enemy models.

ESCAPE!

The Defender's Warlord must try to escape the battlefield. To do this, at the end of the third or subsequent battle round, that model must be within 1" of the Assassin's battlefield edge. If it is, the Warlord model is removed from that battlefield. It is then said to have escaped.

BATTLE LENGTH

The battle automatically ends at the end of battle round 5.

VICTORY CONDITIONS

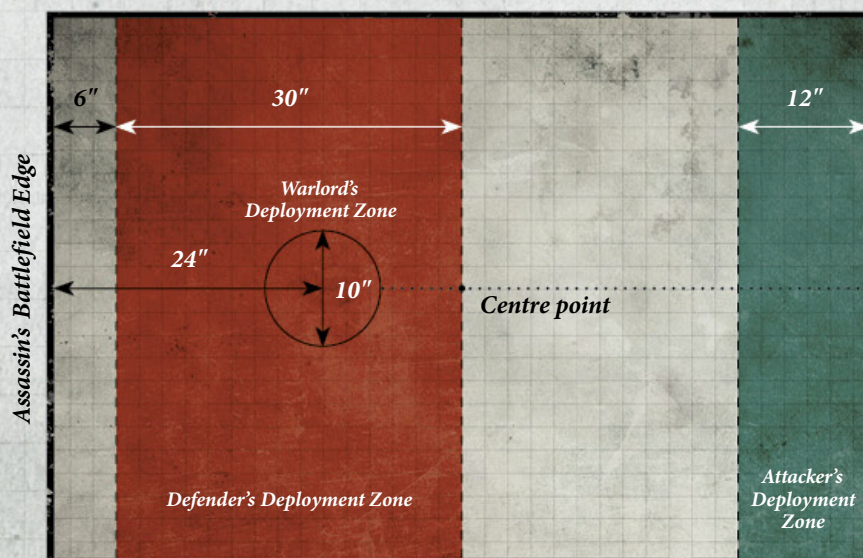
The Attacker wins if the Defender's Warlord is destroyed by an attack made by one of their models or a psychic power manifested by one of their PSYKERS.

The Assassin wins if the Defender's Warlord is destroyed by an attack made by one of their models or a psychic power manifested by one of their PSYKERS.

The Defender wins if their Warlord has escaped at the end of the battle.

If the Defender's Warlord is destroyed by anything other than an attack made by one of the Attacker's or Assassin's models or a psychic power manifested by one of the Attacker's or Assassin's PSYKERS, the Assassin and Attacker draw and the Defender loses.

If the Defender's Warlord has not been destroyed and has not escaped at the end of the battle, the game is a draw.



STRATAGEMS

In this mission, the players can use Command Points (CPs) to use the following bonus Stratagems:

1CP

ASSASSIN SHOT

Assassin Stratagem

Some warriors wait a lifetime for that one perfect shot, where it seems as if the whole flow of battle has placed the target in your sights.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase when you select a model to attack with a ranged weapon. That model can only attack with one ranged weapon they are armed with in this phase, and can only make one attack with that weapon, but can ignore all other enemy units for the purposes of targeting **CHARACTERS**.

3CP

OUT OF SIGHT

Defender Stratagem

Sometimes, when fleeing for your life, you just need to get into cover and re-evaluate your options.

Use this Stratagem at the end of your Movement phase if your Warlord is wholly within a terrain feature. Until your next Movement phase, your Warlord cannot make attacks with ranged weapons, but cannot be selected as the target of an attack made with a ranged weapon by an enemy model.

1CP

LOCATION TRIANGULATED

Assassin Stratagem

Now that the location of the target has been ascertained, the full power of your strike force can be brought to bear.

Use this Stratagem at the end of your Charge phase if a unit from your army is within 1" of the Defender's Warlord. Select one unit from your army that has not yet been set up on the battlefield. Set that unit up on the battlefield anywhere that is within 6" of the Assassin's battlefield edge and more than 1" from any enemy models.

1CP

PROTECT YOUR COMMANDER!

Defender Stratagem

Sometimes an inspirational word is all that is required to convince your subordinates to sacrifice their lives to save yours.

Use this Stratagem at the start of your opponent's Shooting or Fight phase. Until the end of that phase, each time your Warlord would lose any wounds as a result of an attack made against that Warlord's unit, you can select a unit from your army that is within 3" of your Warlord and roll one D6. On a 4+ that model does not lose those wounds and the selected unit suffers 1 mortal wound for each of those wounds. Only one attempt can be made to intercept each attack.

2CP

GET TO THE TARGET

Attacker Stratagem

Your warriors must get to the target at any cost. Whether by athletic means or pure power, nothing will stand in their way.

Use this Stratagem in your Charge phase when you declare the Defender's Warlord as the target of a charge by a unit from your army. Until the end of that phase, the charging unit can move over enemy units as if they can **FLY**.

2CP

RAPID ASSAULT

Attacker Stratagem

Your forces are making all speed for the objective, its elimination all that matters at this point in the battle.

Use this Stratagem at the start of your Shooting phase. Select one unit from your army that Advanced this turn. Until the end of that phase, you can shoot with that unit as if it had not Advanced.

THE TEN THOUSAND

The rules in this section supplement those found in *Codex: Adeptus Custodes* and can be used in any open play, narrative play or matched play game. With them, you will be able to forge your brotherhood of legendary heroes into a shield host trained in specialised ways of war and wielding ancient Terran relics.

This section is a supplement to *Codex: Adeptus Custodes* – you will need a copy of that book to use the rules in this section.

This section contains Relics, Warlord Traits and Stratagems to allow you to field a force representing specific shield hosts of the Adeptus Custodes. You will also find additional Stratagems that can be used with any Adeptus Custodes army, a Stratagem that can be used to upgrade your **SHIELD-CAPTAIN** with an additional rule to represent the leader of a shield host, and a name generator with which you can personalise your characters.

SHIELD HOSTS

Multiple shield companies gather into larger forces known as shield hosts in times of dire need. Sometimes boasting hundreds of Custodians, shield hosts possess tremendous martial might. The greatest of them have long and established histories, unified heraldry and duties uniquely theirs to discharge.

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any ADEPTUS CUSTODES Detachments, you can select which shield host each of those Detachments belongs to from the shield hosts listed on the following pages. If you do, all ADEPTUS CUSTODES units from that Detachment (excluding Captain-General Trajann Valoris) gain the relevant <SHIELD HOST> Faction keyword.

For example, if your army includes an ADEPTUS CUSTODES Detachment containing a Shield-Captain, Captain-General Trajann Valoris and three units of Custodian Guard, and you decide that Detachment is from the Shadowkeepers, those units (excluding Captain-General Trajann Valoris) would gain the SHADOWKEEPERS Faction keyword.

An ADEPTUS CUSTODES Detachment that belongs to one of the shield hosts has access to the following rules:

RELICS OF TERRA

If your army is led by an ADEPTUS CUSTODES <SHIELD HOST> Warlord, you can give the relevant <SHIELD HOST> Relic of Terra to an ADEPTUS CUSTODES <SHIELD HOST> CHARACTER model from your army, instead of one from *Codex: Adeptus Custodes*. Note that named characters cannot be given a Relic of Terra.

Note that some Relics are weapons or items of wargear that replace one of the model's existing weapons or items of wargear. Where this is the case, you must, if you are using points values, still pay the cost of the weapon or wargear that is being replaced. Write down any Relics your models have on your army roster.

WARLORD TRAITS

If an ADEPTUS CUSTODES <SHIELD HOST> model is your Warlord, they can have the relevant <SHIELD HOST> Warlord Trait instead of a Warlord Trait from *Codex: Adeptus Custodes* or another publication.

STRATAGEMS

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any ADEPTUS CUSTODES <SHIELD HOST> Detachments, the relevant <SHIELD HOST> Stratagem can be used in addition to those presented in this publication and in *Codex: Adeptus Custodes*.

SHADOWKEEPERS

The Shadowkeepers watch over the Dark Cells beneath the Imperial Palace and keep trammelled the dread entities and technologies sealed within. Should such potent and terrible manifestations appear abroad in the Imperium, it falls to the Shadowkeepers to capture and imprison them.

WARLORD TRAIT: LOCKWARDEN

The master of the Shadowkeepers is the Lockwarden, an especially stern guardian. He must be implacable in defence and unrelenting on the attack, a master gaoler feared by all his charges.

When resolving an attack made by a CHARACTER model against this Warlord, subtract 1 from the hit roll. When resolving an attack made by this Warlord against an enemy CHARACTER unit, subtract 1 from the saving throw (including invulnerable saves).

RELIC OF TERRA: STASIS DOUBLETTE

This unassuming, rune-inscribed piece of arcane technology entraps its victim in a shimmering stasis prison for capture and return to Terra.

At the start of the Fight phase, select one enemy CHARACTER unit within 3" of a model with this Relic. Until the end of that phase, halve the Attacks characteristic of models in that unit (rounding up) and when resolving an attack made by a friendly SHADOWKEEPERS model against that CHARACTER unit, re-roll a wound roll of 1.

1CP

GRIM RESPONSIBILITY

Shadowkeepers Stratagem

The Shadowkeepers' role requires superhuman resolve and a fortitude of will so unbreakable that it is like unto a monolithic fortress. When set to their task, the Shadowkeepers shrug off the worst that their foes can throw at them, ignoring the sorest wounds through sheer force of determination. For their already outmatched enemies, it is a terrifying spectacle.

Use this Stratagem in any phase when a SHADOWKEEPERS unit from your army is chosen as the target of an attack. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack against that unit, subtract 1 from the Strength characteristic of that attack.

AQUILAN SHIELD

Certain servants of the Emperor bear great responsibilities deemed directly relevant to the safety of Terra. Such esteemed figures are afforded the protection of the Aquilan Shield, at least until their usefulness is thought to be at its end. Bodyguards and protectors without equal, these warriors devote every iota of their strength and will to the defence of their assigned charge, be that an Indomitus Crusade Fleetmaster or a lowly Astra Militarum Guardsman turned visionary prophet.

WARLORD TRAIT: REVERED COMPANION

Years of interposing himself between his charges and the blades of their foes has left this warlord adept at turning and deflecting attacks.

When resolving an attack made against this Warlord, halve any damage inflicted (rounding up).

RELIC OF TERRA: PRAESIDIUS

Fashioned by the great Terran armourer Annah Tsvochakin in the latter years of M32, the stunningly worked storm shield named Praesidius is a singular artefact. Not only is its auramite surface finely worked and layered at a molecular level for greater durability, but nestled within its graven bulk are a series of micro-shield generators. Employing a never again replicated modification of displacer technology, the shield generates small localised displacement bubbles at the point of impact, literally beaming bolts, bullets and the tips of blades harmlessly away from Praesidius' bearer.

Model with a storm shield only. When resolving an attack against a model with this Relic, subtract 1 from the wound roll.

DREAD HOST

Fear is a familiar weapon to the Imperium, used to deter enemies and keep seething populations in line. There is no terror as pure and absolute as that invoked when the Emperor's own fury is unleashed to punish his foes. Such is the Dread Host, a weapon forged to strike at dawning threats and spread terror through absolute annihilation.

WARLORD TRAIT: ALL-SEEING ANNIHILATOR

The Dread Host employ a near-prescient intelligence network to foresee their enemies' plans and weaknesses. This warlord employs that amassed knowledge to best direct his comrades' attacks.

When resolving an attack made with a melee weapon by a model in a friendly **DREAD HOST** unit within 6" of this Warlord, an unmodified hit roll of 6 scores 1 additional hit.

RELIC OF TERRA: ADMONIMORTIS

This towering castellan axe was wrought for one purpose – to make a bloody example of those who dare to set themselves against the inviolate might of Terra.

Model with a castellan axe only. This Relic of Terra replaces a castellan axe and has the following profile:

WEAPON	RANGE	TYPE	S	AP	D
Admonimortis (shooting)	24"	Rapid Fire 1	4	-1	2
Admonimortis (melee)	Melee	Melee	+3	-3	3

1CP

SHIELD OF HONOUR

Aquilan Shield Stratagem

It is second nature to the warriors of the Aquilan Shield to place themselves between their charges and potential peril.

Use this Stratagem in any phase when an **IMPERIUM CHARACTER** unit from your army is chosen as the target of an attack made by a model in an enemy unit. Select one friendly **AQUILAN SHIELD INFANTRY** or **AQUILAN SHIELD DREADNOUGHT** unit within 3" of that **IMPERIUM CHARACTER** unit. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made by a model in that enemy unit, measure range to that **IMPERIUM CHARACTER** unit, but resolve attacks made by models in that enemy model's unit against the unit you selected. If the unit you selected is destroyed, any remaining attacks are lost.

1/2CP

GOLDEN LIGHT OF THE MOIRAIDES

Dread Host Stratagem

The Dread Host go to battle aboard the trio of terrifying pre-heresy warships known as the Moiraides. These potent vessels teleport their passengers straight into battle, their systems so precise that the Adeptus Custodes can begin their charge aboard their warship and complete it by surging at a full run from an explosion of golden light in the enemy's midst.

Use this Stratagem at the start of your Charge phase. Select one **DREAD HOST** unit from your army that teleported into battle this turn for 1CP, or up to three such units for 2CP. Until the end of that phase, when a charge roll is made for those units, roll one additional D6 and discard one of the dice.

SOLAR WATCH

The Solar Watch move fast and strike hard, launching their Talon Sorties to eliminate those threats in or around the Sol System itself. Their wrath is swift and terrible, delivered with a martial precision that few could match.

WARLORD TRAIT: SALLY FORTH

This warlord excels in directing fast and deadly offensives designed to close rapidly with the enemy, then overwhelm them with a devastating concentration of force.

At the start of your Movement phase, add 1" to the Move characteristic of all friendly **SOLAR WATCH** units within 6" of this Warlord until the end of that phase. Whilst their unit is within 6" of this Warlord, models in friendly **SOLAR WATCH** units that have Advanced can shoot with Rapid Fire weapons in the following Shooting phase, but must subtract 1 from hit rolls for those attacks.

RELIC OF TERRA: THE SWIFTSILVER TALON

Perfectly balanced, wrought from lightweight zephyrgeldt alloys, this remarkable spear is also imbued with a ferociously predatory and quick-thinking machine spirit.

Model with a Guardian Spear only. A model with this Relic can shoot and charge in a turn in which it Advanced or Fell Back. This Relic of Terra replaces a Guardian Spear and has the following profile:

WEAPON	RANGE	TYPE	S	AP	D
Swiftsilver Talon (shooting)	24"	Assault 4	4	-1	2
Swiftsilver Talon (melee)	Melee	Melee	+1	-3	D3

EMISSARIES IMPERATUS

In the days of the Great Crusade, the Emperor often entrusted crucial messages or artefacts to be borne by his Custodians. It is a duty they still fulfil now, speaking, acting and making war with the absolute authority of the Master of Mankind himself.

WARLORD TRAIT: VOICE OF THE EMPEROR

Where many amongst the Adeptus Custodes hold themselves remote and aloof from the lesser mortals around them, this warlord's booming oratory and inspirational rhetoric are meant for the ears and hearts of all loyal Imperial servants.

Whilst they are within 9" of this Warlord, friendly **IMPERIUM** units can use this Warlord's Leadership characteristic. Add 3" to the range of this Warlord's aura abilities (this has already been added to this trait's aura ability).

RELIC OF TERRA: VEXILLA DOMINATUS

The Vexilla Dominatus blazes with an arcane light that illuminates the battlefield like the rays of Sol itself. Bathed in such blessed radiance, the Emperor's servants stand tall indeed.

Model with a Vexilla Defensor only. Replace a model with this Relic's Custodes Vexilla and Vexilla Defensor ability with the following:

Vexilla Dominatus: Whilst they are within 6" of a model with this Relic, you can re-roll failed Morale tests for friendly **IMPERIUM INFANTRY** and **IMPERIUM BIKER** units. Whilst their unit is within 6" of a model with this Relic, friendly **EMISSARIES IMPERATUS** models count as 3 models for the purposes of determining who controls an objective marker.

0CP

THE EAGLE'S STRIKE

Solar Watch Stratagem

When the Solar Watch attack they prioritise the speedy elimination of their foes' command assets, swooping like a great eagle and tearing the throat from the enemy army with talons and beak. The foe are left reeling and confused, their command structure collapsing even as the Solar Watch ready themselves to strike the killing blow.

Use this Stratagem in any phase when an enemy **CHARACTER** unit is destroyed as a result of an attack made by a **SOLAR WATCH** model from your army. The next time your opponent wishes to use a Stratagem, they must spend one extra CP to use that Stratagem. This Stratagem can be used once per battle round.

1CP

THE EMPEROR'S HAND

Emissaries Imperatus Stratagem

Most Custodians who join the Emissaries Imperatus do so because they profess to see visions of the Emperor guiding them in their dreams. Some even find that this guidance flows through into their waking hours. They claim to feel the Emperor's own hands upon their weapons and voice in their minds, exposing the weaknesses of their foes.

Use this Stratagem in any phase when an **EMISSARIES IMPERATUS** unit from your army is chosen to shoot or fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made by a model in that unit, ignore any negative hit roll, wound roll and Armour Penetration characteristic modifiers and any benefit to the saving throw as a result of cover for that attack.

ADEPTUS CUSTODES STRATAGEMS

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any ADEPTUS CUSTODES Detachments (excluding Auxiliary Support Detachments), you have access to the Stratagems shown over the following pages and can spend Command Points to activate them. These reflect the unique strategies used by the Adeptus Custodes. If a Stratagem is used before the battle to upgrade a unit (e.g. Ten Thousand Heroes) and you have an army roster, you must note on it which Stratagems are used to upgrade which units.

1CP

TEN THOUSAND HEROES

Adeptus Custodes Stratagem

Every Custodian Guard is a storied hero; many amongst the ranks of their shield companies possess the most advanced mastery of war.

Use this Stratagem before the battle, after nominating your Warlord. Select one ADEPTUS CUSTODES CHARACTER model from your army that is not your Warlord and determine one Warlord Trait for it; it is regarded as your Warlord for the purposes of that Warlord Trait. Each Warlord Trait in your army must be unique (if randomly generated, re-roll duplicate results). You can only use this Stratagem once per battle.

1CP

ETERNAL PENITENT

Adeptus Custodes Stratagem

Custodians tainted by dishonour seek penance through voluntary entombment in a Dreadnought's sarcophagus.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one ADEPTUS CUSTODES DREADNOUGHT unit from your army. Increase that unit's Attacks characteristic by 1. You can re-roll charge rolls made for that unit. Each ADEPTUS CUSTODES DREADNOUGHT unit from your army can only be selected for this Stratagem once.

1CP

ANCIENT ARTIFICE

Adeptus Custodes Stratagem

The secrets of manufacturing Contemptor Dreadnought sarcophagi are long lost, but no less potent for it.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES DREADNOUGHT unit from your army is chosen as the target for an attack. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made against that unit, halve the damage inflicted (rounding up).

2CP

VENGEANCE OF THE MACHINE SPIRIT

Adeptus Custodes Stratagem

Not easily are the war engines of the Adeptus Custodes slain, and even then they do not pass quietly.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES VEHICLE model from your army with the Power of the Machine Spirit ability is destroyed. That model can either automatically explode (do not roll a D6), shoot with one of its ranged weapons as if it were your Shooting phase, or make one attack with one of its melee weapons as if it were the Fight phase (use the top row of that model's damage table when shooting with that ranged weapon or resolving that attack with a melee weapon).

2CP

ARCANE GENETIC ALCHEMY

Adeptus Custodes Stratagem

The Adeptus Custodes are individually engineered on a molecular level using secrets of genetic alchemy that render them virtual demigods in battle.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army that is not a VEHICLE is chosen as a target for an attack. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made against that unit, an unmodified wound roll of 1-3 always fails, irrespective of any abilities that the weapon or the model making that attack has.

2CP

SLAYERS OF NIGHTMARES

Adeptus Custodes Stratagem

In an age plagued by monstrous foes, when primordial horrors from the darkest void circle Humanity's dying light, still the Adeptus Custodes stand strong!

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army is chosen to fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a melee weapon by a model in that unit against a unit with a higher Toughness characteristic than its own, you can add 1 to the wound roll.

1CP**FORTRESS OF WILLPOWER***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

Unclean tendrils of witchcraft slither in futile frustration across the indomitable souls of the Adeptus Custodes, never finding a single crack to give them purchase.

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Psychic phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army is selected as the target of a Psychic power that was successfully manifested this turn. Roll one D6, adding 1 to the result if that unit is a CUSTODIAN WARDENS unit; on a 4+ that psychic power has no effect.

1/2CP**BLOOD GAMES VETERANS***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

What better way to defend one's master against assassins than to be one's self a masterful assassin?

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase. Select one ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army that contains five or less models for 1CP or six or more models for 2CP. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a ranged weapon by a model in that unit, an unmodified hit roll of 6 automatically scores a hit and successfully wounds the target (do not make a wound roll).

1CP**INDOMITABLE ENGINES***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

So indomitable are the war engines of the Adeptus Custodes that they can shrug off even the most devastating hits without any obvious harm.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES VEHICLE model from your army would lose a wound as a result of a mortal wound. Roll one D6; on a 5+ that wound is not lost. In addition, until the end of that phase, when this model would lose a wound as a result of a mortal wound, roll one D6; on a 5+ that wound is not lost.

1CP**ARCHEOTECH MUNITIONS***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

The Adeptus Custodes have access to stockpiles of ancient and incredibly rare weaponry and ammunition.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a ranged weapon with a Damage characteristic of D6 by a model in that unit, roll one additional D6 and discard one of the dice.

1CP**SUPERIOR FIRE PATTERNS***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

Combining advanced targeting cogitators and their own sublimely honed reactions, the Custodians lay down a hail of fire worthy of an army many times their number.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES INFANTRY unit from your army that did not Advance in your previous Movement phase is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, models in that unit make double the number of attacks with Rapid Fire and Pistol weapons.

1CP**AURAMITE AND ADAMANTIUM***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

Allarus Custodians have been known to stride unharmed from the blasts of anti-Titan weapons.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES TERMINATOR unit from your army is selected as the target of an attack. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack against that unit, an Armour Penetration characteristic of -1 or -2 is resolved as 0 for that attack.

2CP**THE EMPEROR'S AUSPICE***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

When the eye of the Emperor is upon his champions, no foul trickery of the foe can prevail.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, when an ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army is chosen as the target of an attack. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack against that unit, your opponent cannot re-roll any dice for that attack.

1CP**FRATERNITY OF HEROES***Adeptus Custodes Stratagem*

Any Custodian would place himself in peril to protect his brothers without a moment's hesitation.

Use this Stratagem at the end of your opponent's Charge phase. Select one ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army more than 1" away from any enemy models. That unit can immediately perform a Heroic Intervention as if it were a CHARACTER, but must finish that move within 1" of one or more enemy units.

LORDS OF THE SHIELD HOSTS

Those who command the Shield Hosts in battle are inhumanly skilled warriors and commanders who have earned the eternal respect of their comrades through exemplary deeds beyond counting.

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any ADEPTUS CUSTODES Detachments (excluding Auxiliary Support Detachments), you have access to the Stratagem to the right and can spend Command Points to activate it. If you do so and you have an army roster, you must note on it which selection you have made for your Shield-Captain.

CAPTAIN-COMMANDER TRAITS

- **Slayer of the Unclean:** When resolving an attack made by this model, on an unmodified wound roll of 6, double the Damage characteristic of the weapon for that attack (e.g. D3 becomes 2D3).
- **Swift as the Eagle:** Add 1 to Advance and charge rolls made for this model. Add 1" to the Move characteristic of this model.
- **Strategic Mastermind:** Whilst this model is on the battlefield, you can roll one D6 for each Command Point you spend to use a Stratagem; on a 5+ that Command Point is refunded. You can only have 1 Command Point refunded per battle round by this ability.
- **Bane of Abominations:** When resolving an attack made by this model against an enemy MONSTER unit or VEHICLE unit, you can re-roll the wound roll.
- **Indomitable Constitution:** Add 2 to the Wounds characteristic of this model.
- **Master of Melee:** Whilst this model is within 1" of any enemy units that contain six or more models, increase its Attacks characteristic by 2.
- **Unstoppable Destroyer:** When this model piles in, it can move up to D3+3" and can end the move closer to any enemy model within that distance of this model. When this model consolidates, it can move up to D3+3" and does not have to end the move closer to the nearest enemy model.
- **Defiant to the Last:** For each wound this model has lost, increase its Attacks characteristic by 1 (to a maximum of 3 additional attacks).
- **Inspirational Exemplar:** Add 3" to the range of this model's aura abilities.

1CP

CAPTAIN-COMMANDER

Adeptus Custodes Stratagem

Though an honorific more than an official rank, those named Captain-Commander richly deserve the accolade for their martial and strategic mastery.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one SHIELD-CAPTAIN model from your army that is not a named character. Select one Captain-Commander Trait from the list to the left for that model. You can only use this Stratagem once per battle.

ADEPTUS CUSTODES NAME GENERATOR

This section is a tool to help you forge the names of your Adeptus Custodes. If you wish to randomly generate a name for one of your Custodians, you can roll a D66 and consult one or both of the tables below. To roll a D66, simply roll two D6, one after the other – the first represents tens, and the second represents digits, giving you a result between 11 and 66. These names should be considered largely interchangeable in terms of their order, and for a Custodian you can roll up a string of as many names as you like!

CADRES OF THE SILENT SISTERS

This section provides rules for Sisters of Silence usable in any open play, narrative play or matched play game. These allow you to gather your cadres and unleash their specialised witch-seeking tactics upon the foe, either on their own or as part of a combined force with the Adeptus Custodes.

This section contains all of the datasheets and Stratagems that you will need in order to fight battles with your Sisters of Silence models. You will also find rules for including these models in your Adeptus Custodes and Imperium armies, and a name generator with which you can personalise your characters.

DATASHEETS

On pages 43–45 you will find background and datasheets for your Sisters of Silence units to use in games of Warhammer 40,000.

STRATAGEMS

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any **SISTERS OF SILENCE** Detachments (excluding Auxiliary Support Detachments), or any **ADEPTUS CUSTODES** Detachments that include any **SISTERS OF SILENCE** units, you can use the Stratagems on page 46.

POINTS VALUES

If you are playing a matched play game, or a game that uses a points limit, you can use the following to determine the points cost of your army. Simply add together the points costs of all your models to determine your army's total points value.

On page 47 you will find a useful tool to help you name members of your Silent Sisterhood.

ABILITIES

The following abilities are common to many Sisters of Silence units:

WITCH HUNTERS

When resolving an attack made by a model in this unit against a **PSYKER** unit, you can re-roll the wound roll.

PSYCHIC ABOMINATION

This unit cannot be targeted or affected by psychic powers. When a Psychic test or a Deny the Witch test is taken for an enemy model, subtract 1 from the total for each unit from your army with this ability within 18" of that model (to a maximum of -4).

BATTLE-FORGED ARMIES

TALONS OF THE EMPEROR

If your army is Battle-forged, units with the **SISTERS OF SILENCE** Faction keyword can be included in an **ADEPTUS CUSTODES** Detachment in your army, without preventing that Detachment from being an **ADEPTUS CUSTODES** Detachment. Note that this does not prevent **ADEPTUS CUSTODES** units in that Detachment from gaining any Detachment abilities (e.g. The Emperor's Chosen and the Sworn Guardians abilities), however **SISTERS OF SILENCE** units cannot themselves gain any Detachment abilities. Similarly, those **SISTERS OF SILENCE** units are ignored for any rules that state all units from that Detachment must have at least one Faction keyword in common (e.g. in a matched play game) and when determining your army's Faction.

NULL-MAIDENS

A **SISTERS OF SILENCE** Vanguard Detachment – that is, a Vanguard Detachment that includes only **SISTERS OF SILENCE** units – is treated as having HQ Battlefield Role slots of '0' and Command Benefits of 'None'. Note that this means there are no compulsory HQ selections for **SISTERS OF SILENCE** Vanguard Detachments.

SISTERS OF SILENCE

In an age of dark sorcery and empyric cataclysm, the Sisters of Silence have never been more important to the Imperium. Each of these Null-Maidens is not only a lethally skilled warrior, but also a psychic blank, their very presence anathema to the deviant witches they hunt in the Emperor's name.

To the common herd of Humanity, those who bear the incredibly rare Pariah gene are known as nulls, blanks, untouchables or a raft of yet more vitriolic names. Such individuals have no presence at all in the warp; to all intents and purposes they possess nothing that could be called a soul. As a result of this strange condition, Pariahs are surrounded by an intense and unsettling aura that causes others to dislike, distrust and soon turn against them. Yet they also possess a substantial advantage for all their apparently cursed nature; the presence of even a single Null chokes off psykers' connection to the warp, while in turn those witches' malefic powers cannot affect the Null in the slightest.

In the Sisters of Silence, this ability finds potent martial application. They are witch-hunters and psyker-slayers without compare, working alone as part of their own Cadres or alongside other Imperial agents to track down and neutralise the most dangerous psychic witches. Human or xenos, it does not matter – once the Null-Maidens have their target surrounded, even its most monstrously powerful psychic abilities are rendered as impotent as its despairing screams. Indeed, the sudden severing of a witch's connection to the warp can prove a devastating weapon in its own right; for many practitioners, the effect is as disorientating and as distressing as being rendered suddenly deaf, dumb or blind.

The Null-Maidens do not rely upon this effect alone to win their battles, of course. Many psykers will still fight back with every weapon at their disposal, even while reeling from the trammelling of their mental gifts. Others surround themselves with heretical cults or devoted armies that must be hacked and blasted apart before the Sisters of Silence can reach their primary target. To this end, every Null-Maiden is a lethal warrior, clad in masterfully crafted armour and wielding an array of potent weaponry with superb skill. Even a single squad of Null-Maidens is more than a match for entire warbands of lesser warriors; when they deploy at Cadre strength, they have the martial might to cut the heart from a rogue psyker's benighted empire.

Every Null-Maiden is trained from a young age. They begin their progression as novices and advance to the status of a full-fledged Sister of Silence only once they have proven themselves worthy. It is at this point that they take the lifelong vow of silence, the Oath of

Tranquility, that lends them their name. From this point onward they communicate with one another only through the use of Thoughtmark – a private and highly nuanced form of sign language – and Battlemark, its more declarative and robust battlefield cousin. Null-Maidens in battle thus make a truly unnerving spectacle, their Pariah's aura filling their enemies with dread, their lightning assaults carried out without a word spoken or a battle cry given voice. Only the thunder of their guns and the steely songs of their blades speak for the Sisters of Silence upon the battlefield, but these are more than voice enough.

Prosecutor Squads form the core of the Silent Sisters' armies, and they are lethal in both attack and defence. Wielding Umbra-pattern boltguns with terrifying precision, they lay down thunderous salvos of perfectly placed bolt shells that blast witches and their heretical followers into bloody ruin. Where psykers congregate or employ their unclean powers to augment their followers rather than assailing the Prosecutors directly, the Null-Maidens hurl glittering psyk-out grenades that assail the warp-senses of their enemies and set them reeling amidst a vortex of confusion and despair.

Vigilator Squads, by comparison, embody the swift and deadly sword-strike that severs witch's heads from their necks and ends their threat at a stroke. Armed with heirloom blades wreathed in potent disruptor fields, Vigilators train tirelessly in an ancient sword form that lays open their victim's guard before ending the fight with a single, decapitating blow. Even a single such Null-Maiden is a terrifying enemy in one-on-one combat, but when an entire band of Vigilators fall upon a single heretic psyker or xenos abomination with their blades questing for its neck, its doom is swiftly sealed.

Witchseeker Squads wield fire as their primary weapon. Each bears a thrice-blessed flamer capable to belching sheets of blazing promethium that engulf their victims and reduce them to charnel ash. The Witchseekers coordinate their fire with eerie precision, overlapping their cones of flame to utterly eradicate their victims or sending out expertly placed tongues of fire that ignite the cover or defences behind which their targets cower. Witchseekers often work in concert with Prosecutor and Vigilator Squads, the former flushing their prey from cover before the latter pounce upon their blazing, shrieking victims and strike the killing blow.

These reflect the unique strategies and fighting styles of the Sisters of Silence.

EMPHYRIC SEVERANCE

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

The mere presence of Null-Maidens is enough to quash the psychic manifestations of enemy witches.

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Psychic phase, when an enemy PSYKER manifests a psychic power within 18" of a SISTERS OF SILENCE INFANTRY unit from your army, after any Deny the Witch attempt. Roll one D6; on a 3+ that psychic power is resisted and its effects are negated.

1CP

CREEPING DREAD

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

Foes shrink from the Null-Maidens' unsettling presence.

Use this Stratagem at the start of any phase. Select one SISTERS OF SILENCE INFANTRY unit from your army. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made by a model in an enemy unit within 6" of that unit, subtract 1 from the hit roll.

1CP

TALONS

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

The Talons of the Emperor strike with deadly unity.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, after shooting or fighting with an ADEPTUS CUSTODES unit from your army. Select one friendly SISTERS OF SILENCE INFANTRY unit within 6" of that unit. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made by a model in that SISTERS OF SILENCE unit, you can re-roll the hit roll.

1CP

DECAPITATING STRIKES

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

Vigilators train to lop their enemy's heads from their necks, the better to separate witches from their powers.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase, when a VIGILATOR unit from your army is chosen to fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a melee weapon by a model in that unit, add 1 to the wound roll.

PUNISHMENT FIRE

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

Prosecutor squads train to pummel the enemy.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase, when a PROSECUTORS unit from your army is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, change the Range and Type characteristic of boltguns equipped on models in that unit to 18" and Assault 3 respectively.

1/2CP

PURGATION SWEEP

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

Enough flame can make a pyre of anything.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase. Select a WITCHSEEKER unit from your army that contains five or less models for 1CP, or six or more models for 2CP. Until the end of that phase, when determining the number of attacks made by flamer weapons that models in that unit are equipped with, any results of less than 4 count as 4.

DESPERATION'S PRICE

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

To overcome the Null-Maidens' aura, enemy psykers overstretch themselves with horrible consequences.

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Psychic phase, when an enemy PSYKER unit within 18" of a SISTERS OF SILENCE INFANTRY unit from your army suffers Perils of the Warp. That PSYKER suffers an additional D3 mortal wounds.

IMMATERIAL DISSONANCE

Sisters of Silence Stratagem

Psyk-out grenades leave their targets reeling.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase or your opponent's Charge phase, after resolving an attack made with a psyk-out grenade by a SISTERS OF SILENCE model from your army against a PSYKER or DAEMON unit that scored a hit. Until the end of that turn, that PSYKER or DAEMON unit cannot fire Overwatch and when resolving an attack made by a model in that unit, subtract 1 from the hit roll.

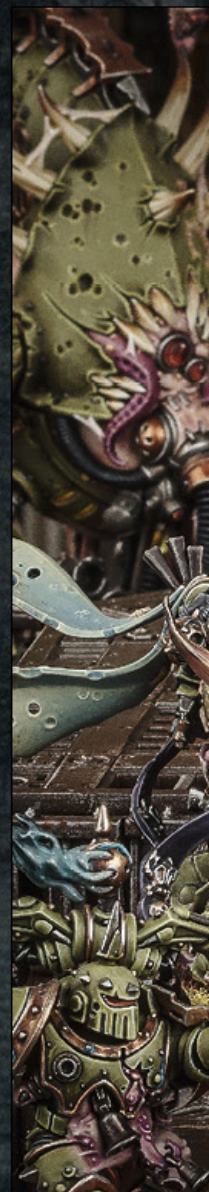


IMPERIAL AGENTS

EXECUTION FORCE

The rules in this section can be used in any open play, narrative play or matched play game. They facilitate the inclusion of these lethal paramilitary assets into your Imperial armies, and provide terrifying Stratagems designed to enhance their impact upon the battlefield even further.

This section contains all of the datasheets and Stratagems that you will need in order to fight battles with your Officio Assassinorum models. You will also find rules for including these models in your Imperium armies.

ABILITIES

The following abilities are common to OFFICIO ASSASSINORUM units:

Agent of the Imperium

If your army is Battle-forged, you can include 1 AGENT OF THE IMPERIUM unit in each IMPERIUM (excluding FALLEN) Patrol, Battalion and Brigade Detachment in your army without those units taking up slots in those Detachments. The inclusion of an AGENT OF THE IMPERIUM unit does not prevent other units from their Detachment from benefiting from Detachment abilities (e.g. Chapter Tactics, Defenders of Humanity etc.), and it does not prevent other units from your army benefiting from abilities that require every model in your army to have that ability (e.g. Combat Doctrines). An AGENT OF THE IMPERIUM unit included in a Patrol, Battalion or Brigade Detachment in this

manner is ignored for any rules that state all units from that Detachment must have at least one Faction keyword in common (e.g. in a matched play game) and when determining your Army Faction.

Execution Force

If your Warlord has the IMPERIUM keyword (excluding FALLEN), you can include this unit in your army as part of a Vanguard Detachment even if that Detachment contains no HQ units. If you do so, that Detachment's Command Benefits are changed to 'None' and its Restrictions are changed to 'This Detachment cannot include the same datasheet more than once.'

Independent Operative

This model can never have a Warlord Trait. During deployment, you can set this model up in concealment instead of placing it on the battlefield. At the end of any of your Movement phases, this model can reveal its position – set it up anywhere on the battlefield that is more than 9" away from any enemy models.

Lightning Reflexes

This model has a 4+ invulnerable save.

POINTS VALUES

If you are playing a matched play game, or a game that uses a points limit, you can use the following to determine the points cost of your army. Simply add together the points costs of all your models to determine your army's total points value.

IMPERIAL ASSASSINS

The shadowy agents of the Officio Assassinorum are amongst the most dangerous paramilitary assets available to the Imperium. Specialising in elaborate and arcane forms of murder, each assassin is a living weapon, conditioned to hunt down and slay their target no matter the cost.

Countless enemies of the Imperium have ended their days staring into the ghoulish skull mask of an Imperial assassin, gunned down from afar or pierced by their unseen blades. Be their victim a separatist leader, heretical demagogue, outspoken politico or alien warlord, the assassins will hunt them mercilessly to destruction. No matter what defences their target cowers behind, how big an army they surround themselves with or what unnatural wards and protections they conjure into being, once they have been assigned as a target, their days are numbered and few.

The Officio Assassinorum does not lightly deploy its assets. Every one is a carefully selected specimen, an exemplar of Humanity at the very peak of its mental and physical abilities, further enhanced through augmetic surgery, merciless training regimes and countless hours of hypno-indoctrination. Each Imperial assassin is fashioned into a merciless killing machine, whose only purpose and desire is to eliminate each new target they are assigned with the greatest possible efficiency. In this way do they serve the immortal Emperor of Mankind.

Beneath the shadowy umbrella of the Officio Assassinorum, there are numerous separate temples. Each one teaches its own singular method of murder, substantially different from the next. The Vanus Temple, for instance, engage in assassination through information. Their operatives penetrate the communications hubs and intelligence networks that surround their targets, and employ elaborate remote schemes to ensure their victim's demise. The Venenum Temple, by comparison, are master poisoners. Their agents employ toxins and venoms harvested from myriad sources across the galaxy, tailoring their alchemical murder weapons to their luckless victims to ensure they asphyxiate, haemorrhage, self-immolate or erupt like fleshy volcanoes after the slightest nick of a blade. Yet, perhaps the most broadly effective and universally deadly assassins are those that hail from the Vindicare, Callidus, Eversor and Culexus Temples.

Against the Vindicare Assassin there is no desperate battle for survival, no frantic flight or war of wits. There is only the muffled crack of the assassin's exitus rifle, the violent spray of pulped brain matter, then the graceless tumble of a puppet suddenly shorn of its strings. These lethal marksmen spend days, sometimes months, working their way into the perfect position from which to achieve their killing shot. This is not to say that the

Vindicare's only skill is in killing lone targets. Faced by large numbers of battlefield foes, this lethal killer can swiftly rack up a body count that would make a platoon of soldiers proud, snapping off one perfect shot after another until nothing remains but twitching corpses.

The Callidus Assassin is an architect of anarchy, mayhem and misdirection. She uses polymorphine drugs and subdermal implants to shift her shape and fool her foe. The Callidus combines subtle, shadowed killing with expertly sown misinformation to cripple enemy command structures and bring entire battle lines grinding to a halt. Yet, all of this is simply a cover, for first and foremost the Callidus is a killer. Only once the enemy are in utter disarray does the Callidus strike. With a single blast of her neural shredder, this agile assassin reduces the minds of her victims to bubbling soup, while those who fight back are cut to ribbons by the flickering blade of her phase sword.

Between their engineered physique and the combat stimms saturating their system, the Eversor Assassin can run as fast as a speeding skimmer. They can punch a bunker door from its hinges with a single blow, and tear a Chaos Space Marine in two with their bare hands. High Lord Roarch once claimed that the only difference between a cyclonic warhead and an Eversor was that the warhead was kinder, an assertion proved true every time one of these frenzon-fuelled berserkers is deployed. Sent in via drop pod, the Eversor is briefed on their target by subliminal inloads, then set loose to cause utter, bloody mayhem until the victim – and all those around them – are torn to shreds. Even should the Eversor be slain, the foe will not live to enjoy their victory, for the assassin's biochemistry explodes with the force of a plasma bomb.

Most terrifying of all the assassins is the Culexus, before whom panic spreads like a plague. Rendered soulless by their Pariah gene, this assassin projects an aura of absolute fear that can either be masked or amplified by their arcane wargear. One moment the Culexus may be all but invisible, nothing but a flicker of movement in the corner of the enemy's eye, the next they shudders into being, a skull-faced apparition radiating terror as they stalk ever closer. Psykers are racked with unspeakable agony from merely standing in a Culexus' presence, and it is these dangerous individuals the Culexus is sent to slay. Between the soul-searing blasts of their animus speculum and the lethal effects of their psyk-out grenades, no witch can long survive their attentions.

OFFICIO ASSASSINORUM STRATAGEMS

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any IMPERIUM Detachments (that is, a Detachment in which every unit has the IMPERIUM keyword), you have access to the Stratagems shown here, meaning that you can spend Command Points to activate them. These help to reflect the unique tactics used by assassins on the battlefield.

2CP

SHADOW ASSIGNMENT

Officio Assassinorum Stratagem

The enemy have decoded deployment orders for an Assassinorum operative. Yet this 'intelligence' is but another ruse, disguising the true identity of the killer that approaches...

Use this Stratagem before the battle begins. If your army includes exactly 1 OFFICIO ASSASSINORUM unit, remove that unit from your army and then add 1 OFFICIO ASSASSINORUM unit of your choice to your army. The unit that is removed does not count as being destroyed for any rules purposes. Unlike other units that are added to your army, this new unit does not cost any reinforcement points, even in a matched play game.

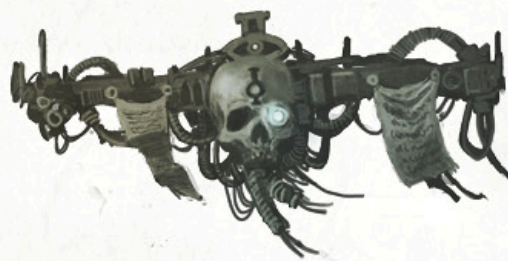

ACROBATIC

Callidus Stratagem

Callidus Assassins strike with such speed and grace that their targets rarely land a single defensive blow.

Use this Stratagem in your Movement phase. Select one CALLIDUS ASSASSIN model from your army. That model can Advance and charge this turn. In addition, until the start of the next battle round, subtract 1 from hit rolls for attacks that target the selected model.

TURBO-PENETRATOR ROUND

Vindicare Stratagem

Ripping through the densest armour before detonating, this ammunition is the bane of vehicles and beasts alike.

Use this Stratagem in any phase when a VINDICARE ASSASSIN model from your army makes an attack with an exitus rifle or exitus pistol that targets an opponent's VEHICLE or MONSTER unit. If a hit is scored, the target suffers D3 mortal wounds and the attack sequence ends. If this Stratagem is used then the Head Shot ability does not apply to that attack.

PARIAH'S GAZE

Culexus Stratagem

The pure negativity of a Culexus Assassin's soulless presence is focused through their wargear.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase, when you select a CULEXUS ASSASSIN model to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, change the Damage characteristic of that model's animus speculum to D3.

0CP

PRIORITY THREAT NEUTRALISED

Officio Assassinorum Stratagem

Eliminating the enemy's command elements allows a competent commander to seize the strategic initiative.

Use this Stratagem in any phase, when a CHARACTER model in an enemy unit is destroyed by an OFFICIO ASSASSINORUM model from your army. You gain 1 Command Point (or 2 Command Points if the CHARACTER was a Warlord). You can only use this Stratagem once for each enemy CHARACTER model destroyed.

1CP

DOUBLE KILL

Vindicare Stratagem

Vindicare Assassins have been known to fell a second foe before the body of the first has even hit the floor.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase, after a VINDICARE ASSASSIN model from your army shoots. That model can shoot one additional time this phase (this must be at a different target).

2CP**SUPREME DECEPTION*****Callidus Stratagem***

Operatives of the Callidus Temple are peerless infiltrators, able to disrupt any chain of command.

Use this Stratagem at the start of any battle round after the first. Choose one **CALLIDUS ASSASSIN** from your army (this can be one that is not on the battlefield). That model's Reign of Confusion ability is considered to be in effect until the end of that battle round. You can only use this Stratagem once per battle.

2CP**STIMM OVERLOAD*****Eversor Stratagem***

Dangerous levels of frenzon flood the Eversor's system, triggering a frenetic killing spree.

Use this Stratagem at the end of the Fight phase. Select one **EVERSOR ASSASSIN** model from your army that fought this phase; that model can fight an additional time this phase. After that model has fought again this phase, roll one D6; on a 1, 2 or 3 it suffers 1 mortal wound.

1CP**HYPERMETABOLISM*****Eversor Stratagem***

Chemically augmented in the extreme, the bodies of Eversor Assassins can weather injuries that would otherwise prove fatal.

Use this Stratagem at the start of any phase. Select one **EVERSOR ASSASSIN** model from your army. Until the end of that phase, roll one D6 each time that model loses a wound (excluding those lost as the result of a mortal wound); on a 4+ the wound is not lost.

2CP**SOUL HORROR*****Culexus Stratagem***

An aura of nameless fear surrounds operatives of the Culexus Temple, freezing the hearts of their foes.

Use this Stratagem at the start of the Fight phase. Select one **CULEXUS ASSASSIN** model from your army. Enemy units within 3" of that model cannot be chosen to fight with this phase until after all other units have done so, even if they charged. If one of those units has an ability that allows them to fight first this phase, they instead fight in this phase as if they do not have that ability.





DEATH GUARD

THE FECUND LEGION

In this section you will find new and revised rules for the Death Guard, including army-wide abilities and Stratagems. With Nurgle's blessings, the rules, Stratagems and Relics presented here will aid you in amassing your revolting plague-worshippers into a vectorium fit to rot the very stars from the withering heavens.

This section is a supplement to *Codex: Death Guard* – you will need a copy of that book to use the rules in this section.

This section contains Relics, Warlord Traits and Stratagems that allow you to field a force representing each of the Plague Companies of the Death Guard. You will also find additional Relics and Stratagems that can be used with any Death Guard army, and a name generator with which you can personalise your characters.

ABILITIES

All **DEATH GUARD** units from *Codex: Death Guard* without the **CHAOS CULTISTS** or **POXWALKERS** keywords gain the Hateful Assault and Malicious Volleys abilities, below.

HATEFUL ASSAULT

If this unit makes a charge move, is charged or performs a Heroic Intervention, add 1 to the Attacks characteristic of models in this unit until the end of the turn.

BOLT WEAPONS

A bolt weapon is any weapon whose profile includes the word 'bolt' (boltgun, bolt pistol, etc.), and any Relic that replaces a bolt weapon.

Rules that apply to bolt weapons also apply to the boltgun profile of combi-weapons (see *Codex: Death Guard*), and the bolter profile of Relics that replace combi-weapons.

MALICIOUS VOLLEYS

Instead of following the normal rules for Rapid Fire weapons, models in this unit firing Rapid Fire bolt weapons make double the number of attacks if any of the following apply:

- The firing model's target is within half the weapon's maximum range.
- The firing model is **INFANTRY** and every model in its unit Remained Stationary in your previous Movement phase.
- The firing model is a **TERMINATOR** or **HELBRUTE**.

For the purposes of this ability, a Rapid Fire bolt weapon is any bolt weapon with the Rapid Fire type.



PLAGUE WEAPONS

A plague weapon is any weapon whose profile includes the word 'plague' (plague knife, plaguesword, etc.), any weapon with the Plague Weapon ability (see *Codex: Death Guard*), and any Relic that replaces a plague weapon.

RELICS OF DECAY

It is said of Nurgle that he is a generous deity. Certainly, those champions who claim to work the Plague God's will bear a strange and horrible array of disease-ridden gifts, be they pox-seeping weapons of war, rust-caked slabs of warp-ensorcelled armour or weird arcana that seethe with the powers of plague.

If your army is led by a **DEATH GUARD** Warlord, you can give one of the following Relics of Decay to a **DEATH GUARD CHARACTER** model from your army instead of giving them a Relic from *Codex: Death Guard*. Named characters (such as **TYPHUS**) cannot be given the following Relics.

Note that some Relics are weapons that replace one of the model's existing weapons. Where this is the case, you must, if you are using points values, still pay the cost of the weapon that is being replaced. Write down any Relics your models have on your army roster.

THE AGUE STONE

This curse-iron pendant radiates contagious energies that cause the enemy to shake with feverish weakness.

LORD OF CONTAGION model only. Subtract 1 from the Strength characteristic of enemy models whilst their unit is within 3" of a model from your army with this Relic.

ALLWYTHER

The presence of this unholy blade causes reality itself to fade, shrivel and rot away. No armour, warding, arcane technology or witch's hex can stay its baleful touch.

Model equipped with a balesword only. This Relic replaces a balesword and has the following profile:

THE DAEMON'S TOLL

With each discordant note, this warp-forged bell sends Mortarion's sons shuddering out of sync with realspace. They quiver upon the cusp of the empyrean, allowing its unholy energies to flow forth and enfold them.

NOXIOUS BLIGHTBRINGER model only. Models in friendly **DEATH GUARD** units (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS** and **POXWALKERS** units) have a 5+ invulnerable save whilst their unit is within 7" of a model from your army with this Relic.

THE EPIDEMICYST BLADE

This revolting weapon squirms with fattened buboes that burst and spatter their filth across the foe with every blow. Its juices burn and corrupt, seeping through chinks in the enemy's armour and eating away at their flesh.

Model equipped with a hellforged sword only. This Relic replaces a hellforged sword and has the following profile:

THE PUTRID PERIAPT

Plucked from the gut of one of Horticultural Slimux's own Beasts of Nurgle, this revolting amulet reacts to dark witchery by releasing clouds of warp-spores that seed the flesh of Nurgle's faithful with fecund vitality.

PSYKER model only. A model with this Relic knows one additional psychic power. Once in each of your Psychic phases, after a psychic power is resolved that was manifested by a model with this Relic, that model can regain up to D3 lost wounds.

WORMSPITTER

This bloated bolt pistol fires shells that burst in showers of Daemon maggots. These squirm everywhere with squeals of glee, gnawing, vomiting and defaecating until their victims are crawling with corrosive rustpox.

Model equipped with a bolt pistol only. This Relic replaces a bolt pistol and has the following profile:

DEATH GUARD STRATAGEMS

If your army is **Battle-forged** and includes any **DEATH GUARD** Detachments (excluding **Auxiliary Support** Detachments), you have access to the Stratagems shown here, and can spend **Command Points** to activate them. These reflect the unique strategies used by the forces of the Death Guard on the battlefield.

1CP

PLAGUECHOSEN

Death Guard Stratagem

Many heroes of the Death Guard have favoured lieutenants who fight amidst their ranks.

Use this Stratagem before the battle, after nominating your Warlord. Select one **DEATH GUARD CHARACTER** model from your army that does not have a Warlord Trait and determine one Warlord Trait for it; it is regarded as your Warlord for the purposes of that Warlord Trait. Each Warlord Trait in your army must be unique (if randomly generated, re-roll duplicate results).

1CP

SOUL HARVEST

Death Guard Stratagem

The Daemon Prince swings its blade in scything arcs that harvest the enemies' souls from their bodies.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when a **DEATH GUARD DAEMON PRINCE** model from your army that is equipped with a daemonic axe or hellforged sword is chosen to fight with. Until the end of that phase, add 3 to that model's Attacks characteristic, and only **INFANTRY** units can be chosen as the target of its attacks.

HARBINGER OF NURGLE

Death Guard Stratagem

Those Death Guard lords believed to be marked by the Plague God inspire contagious vigour in their warriors.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one **LORD OF CONTAGION** unit from your army. Until the end of the battle, that unit has the following ability:

'Harbinger of Nurgle: Re-roll hit rolls of 1 for attacks made by models in friendly **DEATH GUARD** units whilst their unit is within 6" of this model.'

1CP

FOULGUSH

Death Guard Stratagem

The Blightspawn strains at the seams with churning slime before spewing it forth in a peristaltic gush.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase when a **FOUL BLIGHTSPAWN** model from your army is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, when rolling to determine the number of attacks made with a plague sprayer by that model, roll one additional D6 and discard one of the dice. In addition, until the end of that phase, when rolling to determine the Strength characteristic of that weapon, roll one additional D6 and discard one of the dice.

1CP

VIRULENT ROUNDS

Death Guard Stratagem

The Death Guard know countless revolting ways to render their bolt rounds lethally virulent.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase when a **PLAGUE MARINES** unit from your army is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, bolt weapons models in that unit are equipped with gain the following abilities:

'Plague Weapon (see *Codex: Death Guard*). When resolving an attack made with this weapon against an **INFANTRY** unit, on an unmodified wound roll of 6 the Armour Penetration characteristic of this weapon is -4 for that attack.'

1/2CP

RELENTLESS VOLLEYS

Death Guard Stratagem

Always have the Death Guard had a reputation as masters of the merciless close-range firefight.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase when a **DEATH GUARD INFANTRY** unit from your army is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, boltguns and the boltgun profile of combi-weapons (see *Codex: Death Guard*) models in that unit are equipped with have a Type characteristic of Rapid Fire 2. In addition, until the end of that phase, combi-bolters models in that unit are equipped with have a Type characteristic of Rapid Fire 3. If that unit contains 6 or more models, this Stratagem costs 2CP.

2/3CP**PUTRID FECUNDITY***Death Guard Stratagem*

These bloated warriors' wounds are staunched with rancid flesh as fast as the foe can inflict them.

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Shooting phase or the Fight phase when a **PLAGUE MARINES** unit from your army is chosen as the target for an attack. If that unit contains 10 or fewer models then this Stratagem costs 2 Command Points; otherwise it costs 3 Command Points. Until the end of that phase, when making a Disgustingly Resilient roll (see *Codex: Death Guard*) for a model in that unit, add 1 to that roll.

1CP**HYPERTOXIC TINCTURES***Death Guard Stratagem*

This foul plague-alchemist anoints his comrades' weapons with his latest batches of infectious toxins.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one **PLAGUE SURGEON** model from your army. Until the end of the battle, that model has the following ability:

'Hypertoxic Tinctures: Re-roll wound rolls of 1 or 2 for attacks made with plague weapons by models in friendly **DEATH GUARD** units whilst their unit is within 6" of this model.'

1CP**TRENCH-FIGHTERS***Death Guard Stratagem*

The Death Guard excel in the crush of close quarters, driving plague knives into their victims again and again.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when a **PLAGUE MARINES** unit from your army is chosen to fight with. Until the end of that phase, when a model in that unit fights, if it is equipped with one or more plague knives, it can make one additional attack with one plague knife.

1CP**NOXIOUS RUPTURE***Death Guard Stratagem*

Even in death, those blessed by Nurgle splatter, spurt and spew their god's foul gifts far and wide.

Use this Stratagem in any phase other than the Morale phase when the last model in a **DEATH GUARD** unit from your army is destroyed, before removing that model from play. Select one enemy unit within 3" of that model. Until the end of your opponent's next turn, when resolving an attack made by a model from the selected unit, subtract 1 from the hit roll.

1CP**CREEPING BLIGHT***Death Guard Stratagem*

This warp-plague spreads fingers of corrosion through armour, flesh, bone and even air with equal virulence.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when a **DEATH GUARD** unit from your army is chosen to fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a weapon by a model in that unit, add 1 to any damage roll made for that attack, and on an unmodified wound roll of 6 the Armour Penetration characteristic of that weapon is -4 for that attack.

1CP**ERUPTION OF FILTH***Death Guard Stratagem*

The slain warrior bursts like a fat, pox-laden bubo.

Use this Stratagem when a **DEATH GUARD TERMINATOR** model from your army is destroyed, before removing that model from play. Roll one D6 for each unit within 7" that does not have the **NURGLE** keyword. On a 4+ the unit being rolled for suffers 1 mortal wound.

1CP**MUTANT STRAIN***Death Guard Stratagem*

Unholy diseases warp and mutate, sending their carriers into a froth-jawed killing fever to the ruin of all.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when a **POXWALKERS** unit from your army is chosen to fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a melee weapon by a model in that unit against an **INFANTRY** unit, an unmodified wound roll of 6 inflicts 1 mortal wound on the target and the attack sequence ends, and on an unmodified hit roll of 1, that model's unit suffers 1 mortal wound.

1CP**WARP TOLL***Death Guard Stratagem*

Empyric energies imbue the tocsin's tolling with dread.

Use this Stratagem at the start of the Morale phase. Select one **NOXIOUS BLIGHTBRINGER** model from your army. ~~Until the end of that phase, when taking a Morale test for an enemy unit within 7" of that model, add 1 to the roll. In addition, if that Morale test is failed, double the number of models that flee.~~

2CP

MIASMAL AFFLICTIONS*Death Guard Stratagem*

Toxic clouds of unclean fumes and spores billow from every pipe and rent in the Plague Marines' foul armour.

Use this Stratagem at the start of the Fight phase. Select one enemy unit within 1" of a **PLAGUE MARINES** unit from your army. Until the end of that phase, subtract 1 from the Toughness characteristic of models in that enemy unit whilst it is not within range of **MORTARION**'s Toxic Presence ability.

1CP

LIFE-EATER*Death Guard Stratagem*

A strain of the daemonic life-eater phage infests these warriors' blades, aggressively reducing all it touches to drizzling filth and bubbling sludge.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when a **DEATH GUARD** unit from your army is chosen to fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a plague weapon by a model in that unit, an unmodified hit roll of 6 automatically scores a hit and successfully wounds the target (do not make a wound roll).

1CP

OVERWHELMING GENEROSITY*Death Guard Stratagem*

Unholy filth gushes from Nurgle's faithful into their guns until the armaments threaten to burst like bloated corpses.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase when a **DEATH GUARD** unit from your army (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS** or **POXWALKERS** units) is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, add 6" to the range of Plague Weapons (see *Codex: Death Guard*), excluding melee weapons, models in that unit are equipped with.

1CP

ACCELERATED ENTROPY*Death Guard Stratagem*

Enhanced with runic rot-stones from the Plague Planet itself, these cannons are rendered more lethal than ever.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one **PLAGUEBURST CRAWLER** model from your army. Until the end of the battle, entropy cannons that model, and all friendly **PLAGUEBURST CRAWLER** models within 7" of that model, are equipped with the following abilities:

'Plague Weapon (see *Codex: Death Guard*). When resolving an attack made with this weapon, a damage roll of 1 or 2 counts as 3 instead.'

1CP

FIRE FEVER*Death Guard Stratagem*

Empyric fever-heat burns through the Helbrute's brain, causing it to fire with ever more frenzied ferocity.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase after you have declared how you will split the shots of a **HELBRITE** model from your army that is equipped with two ranged weapons. Until the end of that phase, if that model shoots all of its weapons at the same target, when resolving an attack made by that model, you can re-roll the hit roll.

1CP

CONTAMINATED MONSTROSITY*Death Guard Stratagem*

Whether a seething flesh-hulk or blighted war engine, this foul horror pulsates with unclean fecundity.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. ~~Select one **DEATH GUARD** unit (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS** and **TITANIC** units) from your army with a Wounds characteristic of 12 or less for 1CP, or 13 or more for 2CP.~~ Until the end of the battle, if that unit does not have the Disgustingly Resilient ability (see *Codex: Death Guard*), it gains the Disgustingly Resilient ability.

1CP

PARASITIC FUMES*Death Guard Stratagem*

Gnawing, microbial Daemon-parasites swarm amidst the fumes that spill from the Blighthaulers' exhausts.

Use this Stratagem at the end of your Movement phase. Select one **MYPHITIC BLIGHT-HAULERS** unit from your army. Until the end of the turn, when an attack is allocated to an enemy model within 7" of that unit, improve the Armour Penetration characteristic of the weapon that attack is being made with by 1 for that attack (e.g. AP 0 becomes AP -1).



PLAGUE COMPANIES

Unusually for the Traitor Legions, Mortarion's Death Guard have retained much of their old cohesion and built upon it, their numbers proliferating like unholy bacteria within the Eye of Terror. Vectorium warbands from the seven Plague Companies bedevil the galaxy, each fighting in their own repugnant fashion.

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any **DEATH GUARD** Detachments, you can select which Plague Company each of those Detachments belongs to from the seven listed on the following pages. If you do, all **DEATH GUARD** units from that Detachment (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS** and **POXWALKERS** units, and named characters such as **TYPHUS**) gain the relevant **<PLAGUE COMPANY>** Faction keyword.

For example, if your army includes a **DEATH GUARD** Detachment containing a **LORD OF CONTAGION** unit, two units of **PLAGUE MARINES** and a unit of **POXWALKERS**, and you decide that Detachment is from the Ferrymen, all those units, except the **POXWALKERS**, would gain the **FERRYMEN** Faction keyword.

A **DEATH GUARD** Detachment that belongs to one of the seven Plague Companies has access to the rules described below.

WARLORD TRAITS

~~If a **DEATH GUARD <PLAGUE COMPANY> CHARACTER** model is your Warlord, they can have the relevant **<PLAGUE COMPANY>** Warlord Trait instead of a Warlord Trait from *Codex: Death Guard*.~~

PUTRESCENT RELICS

If your army is led by a **DEATH GUARD <PLAGUE COMPANY> Warlord**, you can give the relevant **<PLAGUE COMPANY>** Putrescent Relic to a **DEATH GUARD <PLAGUE COMPANY> CHARACTER** model from your army instead of giving them a Relic of Decay from *Codex: Death Guard* or elsewhere in this publication. Named characters (such as **TYPHUS**) cannot be given a Putrescent Relic.

Note that some Relics are weapons that replace one of the model's existing weapons. Where this is the case, you must, if you are using points values, still pay the cost of the weapon that is being replaced. Write down any Relics your models have on your army roster.

STRATAGEMS

You have access to the relevant **<PLAGUE COMPANY>** Stratagems, and can spend Command Points to activate them.



THE HARBINGERS

The 1st Plague Company is ruled over by Typhus the Traveller, and its forces are often called the Harbingers. This Plague Company's ranks are infested with hundreds of strains of the zombie plague, including Shamblerot, the Groaning and Biter's Pox.

If this Detachment contains Typhus, that model gains the **HARBINGERS** Faction keyword.

If this Detachment contains any **POXWALKERS** units, those units gain the **HARBINGERS** Faction keyword.

WARLORD TRAIT: SHAMBLEROT

With every blow this warlord spreads the dreaded Shamblerot, fallen enemies rising again like half-strung puppets with green fire burning in their eyes.

When an enemy **INFANTRY** model is destroyed as the result of an attack made with a melee weapon by this Warlord, add one model to a friendly **HARBINGERS POXWALKERS** unit within 7" of this Warlord. You must pay reinforcement points for each model that you add to that unit that would increase that unit above its starting strength.

PUTRESCENT RELIC: ROTSKULL BOMB

This balloon-like grenade contains gallons of virulent slop, crammed through sorcerous means into a bloated Poxwalker skull whose fixed grin constantly drizzles slime.

Model equipped with a blight grenade only. This Relic replaces a blight grenade and has the following profile:

WEAPON	RANGE	TYPE	S	AP	D
Rotskull Bomb	6"	Grenade 2D3	5	-2	2

Abilities: Plague Weapon (see *Codex: Death Guard*). When resolving an attack made with this weapon, do not make a hit roll: it automatically scores a hit.

1/3CP

FROM THE CARRION HEAPS

Harbingers Stratagem

One should always burn the bodies of the plague-slain, lest they rise again to assail those still living.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one **HARBINGERS POXWALKERS** unit from your army for 1 Command Point, or two **HARBINGERS POXWALKERS** units from your army for 3 Command Points. You can set up the selected units under the ground instead of setting them up on the battlefield. At the end of your Movement phase, for each of the units that are under the ground, you can set up that unit anywhere on the battlefield that is wholly within 9" of a battlefield edge and more than 9" away from any enemy models. You can only use this Stratagem once per battle.

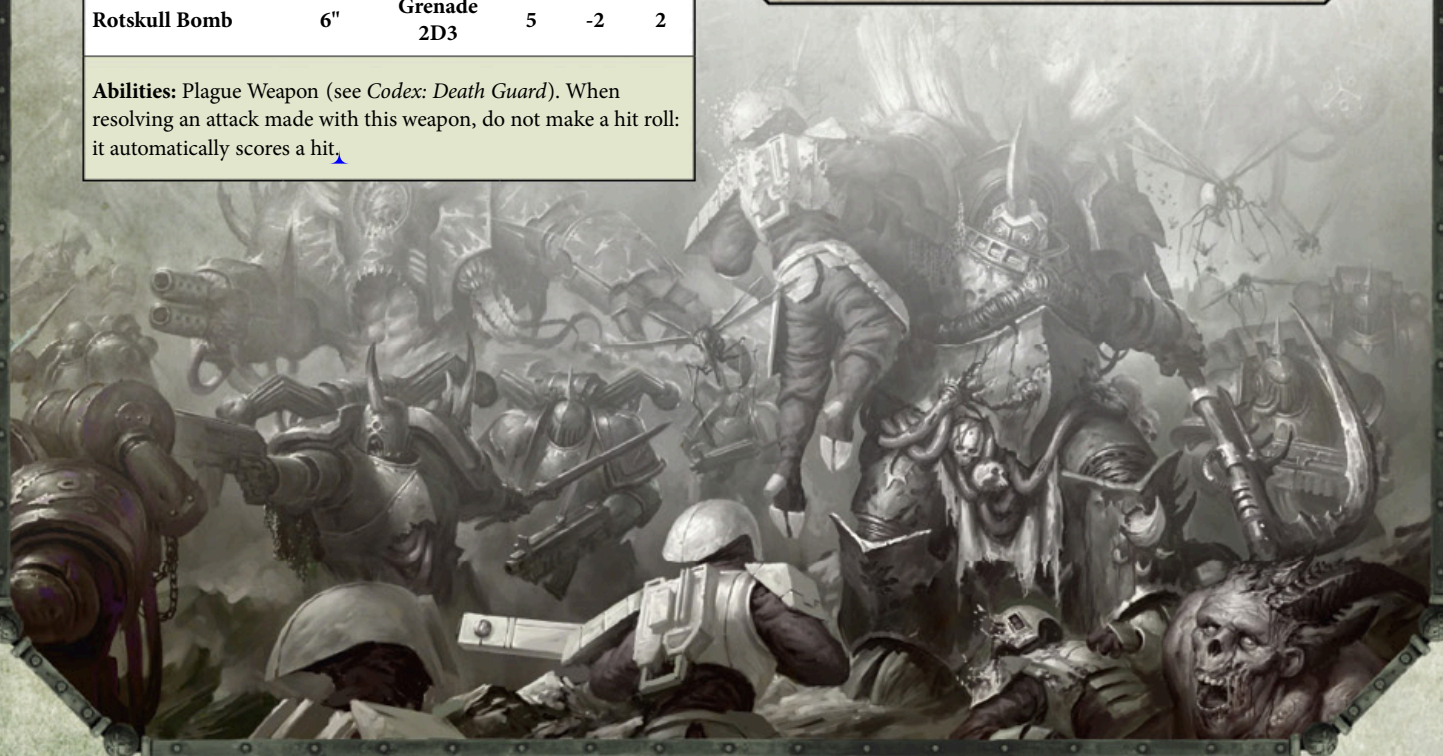

LIFE BEYOND DEATH

Harbingers Stratagem

The plagues infesting this warrior keep them clawing and biting for several moments even after their demise.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight Phase when the last model in a **HARBINGERS** unit from your army is destroyed as the result of an attack. The unit containing the model that made that attack suffers D3 mortal wounds.



THE INEXORABLE

The 2nd Plague Company favours mechanised assaults. Known as the Inexorable for the crushing nature of its advance, it boasts huge formations of lumbering battle tanks. Its warriors bear the Ferric Blight, which speckles their armour and vehicles with crawling rust that can swiftly infest the foe.

WARLORD TRAIT: FERRIC BLIGHT

The creeping plague-rust that makes this warlord's every movement creak and grate also lends his attacks the ability to rapidly infest the foe's war engines.

When resolving an attack made with a weapon by a friendly **INEXORABLE** model against an enemy **VEHICLE** unit within 7" of this Warlord, improve the Armour Penetration characteristic of that weapon by 1 for that attack (e.g. AP 0 becomes AP -1).

PUTRESCENT RELIC: THE LEECHSPORE CASKET

This armoured, rune-inscribed chest is borne to battle aboard the war engines of the Inexorable. Through unclean sorcery it is bound to the soul of a mighty plague champion; as that warrior reaps a tally amongst the foe, so the casket creaks open and spews fecund spores that use the enemy's parasitised life force to heal the vehicle's hurts with putrid mutant flesh.

When a model is destroyed as a result of an attack made with a melee weapon by a model from your army with this Relic, one friendly **INEXORABLE VEHICLE** model within 18" regains up to one lost wound. Each model from your army can regain up to three lost wounds per turn as a result of this ability.

1CP

UNHOLY ESSENCE

Inexorable Stratagem

The tanks of the Inexorable squirm with unnatural vitality and diseased vigour.

Use this Stratagem at the start of your Shooting phase. Select up to three **INEXORABLE VEHICLE** units from your army. Until the end of that phase, those units gain the Inexorable Advance ability (see *Codex: Death Guard*).

1CP

FERRIC MIASMA

Inexorable Stratagem

As the foe press forward they are engulfed in a whirling storm of flesh-rust flakes that clog lungs and eyes.

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Charge phase when a **INEXORABLE** unit from your army is chosen as a target of a charge declared for an **INFANTRY** unit. Subtract 2 from the charge roll made for that charge.



MORTARION'S ANVIL

Known as Mortarion's Anvil, the warriors of the 3rd Plague Company excel at digging in and letting their foes dash themselves apart against their defences. They carry the Gloaming Bloat, a plague of fever sweats that slicks their armour and causes them to speak in wet gurgles.

WARLORD TRAIT: GLOAMING BLOAT

Striking at this warlord is like piercing a drowned corpse; fluids and tattered flesh might spill forth in foetid clouds, but to do any real harm is tremendously difficult.

When resolving an attack made against this Warlord, an unmodified wound roll of 1-3 always fails, irrespective of any abilities that the weapon or the model making that attack has.

PUTRESCENT RELIC: TOLLKEEPER

This macabre device of rotwood, rust and bone was fashioned by the Great Unclean One Pedangrulox to help him tally the blights and plagues he unleashed. So saturated with those same plagues did the foul artefact become that now the mere act of tallying the slain with it causes unclean outbreaks to erupt amongst their comrades.

TALLYMAN model only. When resolving an attack made with a melee weapon by a model in a **MORTARION'S ANVIL** unit from your army within 7" of a friendly model with this Relic, an unmodified hit roll of 6 scores one additional hit.

2/3CP

FUTILITY MADE FLESH

Mortarion's Anvil Stratagem

No matter how much fire the foe pours into these indomitable warriors, it is never enough...

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Shooting phase when a **MORTARION'S ANVIL TERMINATOR** unit from your army is chosen as the target for an attack. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with a weapon against that unit, reduce the Damage characteristic of that weapon by 1, to a minimum of 1, for that attack. If that unit contains 5 or fewer models, this Stratagem costs 2CP; otherwise, it costs 3CP.

1CP

RELAPTIC ASSAULT

Mortarion's Anvil Stratagem

Like a sickness flaring back to life, these stolid warriors erupt from their dug-in positions to counter-attack.

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Charge phase. Select one **MORTARION'S ANVIL INFANTRY** unit from your army. Until the end of that phase, that unit can perform a Heroic Intervention as if it were a **CHARACTER**.



THE WRETCHED

The 4th Plague Company is ruled over by the gestalt Daemon known as the Eater of Lives. Its Legionnaires carry the Eater Plague, also called drizzleflesh, pockchewer and the endless gift. The Company is known as the Wretched, for its inhuman master favours Sorcerers and summonation in defiance of Mortarion's virtual taboo against such things.

WARLORD TRAIT: EATER PLAGUE

The flesh melting horror of the Eater Plague pours off this warlord in waves, reducing his foes to bubbling gruel that he daubs into his own wounds by the fistful to plug them.

When an enemy model is destroyed as the result of an attack made with a melee weapon by this Warlord, this Warlord regains up to one lost wound (to a maximum of 3 wounds per phase).

PUTRESCENT RELIC: THE DAEMON'S FAVOUR

This vile, crater-pocked poppet-doll is scrimshawed from diseased bone. It teems with the malevolent essence of the Eater of Lives himself, his power billowing forth in gnawing clouds to dissolve its bearer's foes.

MALIGNANT PLAGUECASTER model only. A model from your army with this Relic replaces its Pestilential Fallout ability with the following:

'Torrent of Putrefaction: After resolving a psychic power manifested by this model, if the result of the Psychic test for that power was less than 7, the nearest enemy unit within 7" of this model suffers 1 mortal wound. In addition, if the result of the Psychic test for that power was 7 or more, select one enemy unit within 7" of this model. That unit suffers D3 mortal wounds.'

1CP

THE ROTTED VEIL

Wretched Stratagem

The mere presence of this chanting, shambling champion causes the barriers of reality to wither and weaken.

Use this Stratagem at the end of your Movement phase. Select one **WRETCHED CHARACTER** unit from your army that has not performed a Daemonic Ritual this turn. That unit can perform a Daemonic Ritual (see *Codex: Death Guard*) as if it were your Movement phase and that model had not moved, regardless of whether or not it arrived as reinforcements this turn. In addition, until the end of the turn, when that unit performs a Daemonic Ritual, only roll one D6 for the summoning roll, and add 7 to the result.

1CP

SEVENFOLD BLESSINGS

Wretched Stratagem

This diseased sorcerer feels the rheumy eye of the Plague God upon him.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one **WRETCHED PSYKER** model from your army. Until the end of the battle, when a Psychic test is taken for that model, you can re-roll one of the dice. You can only use this Stratagem once per battle.

THE POXMONGERS

Known to many as the Poxmongers, the 5th Plague Company makes great use of diseased Daemon Engines when it goes into battle. Its forces carry the Sanguous Flux, which causes endless, half-clotted bleeding and leaves foul red-black trails behind them wherever they go.

WARLORD TRAIT: SANGUOUS FLUX

Foes near to this warlord feel their flesh and armour alike splitting open in wet, red rents and weals, through which the Poxmongers can more easily plunge their diseased blades.

When resolving an attack made with a melee weapon by a friendly **POXMONGERS** model against an enemy **INFANTRY** unit whilst that model's unit is within 7" of this Warlord, improve the Armour Penetration characteristic of that weapon by 1 for that attack (e.g. AP 0 becomes AP -1).

PUTRESCENT RELIC: IRONCLOT FURNACE

Comprising an ever-burning alchemical engine lodged within the bearer's armour and an array of rune-carved, coiling tubes and exhausts that spill from it, this foul artefact churns out warp-charged pollutants that coat nearby Daemon Engines.

Models in **POXMONGERS DAEMON ENGINE** units from your army have a 4+ invulnerable save whilst their unit is within 7" of a friendly model with this Relic.

1CP

BILIOUS BLOODRUSH

Poxmongers Stratagem

The diseased gore flowing through and across this Daemon Engine boils and bubbles as its rage burns hot.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase. Select one **POXMONGERS DAEMON ENGINE** unit from your army. Until the end of that phase, that unit can shoot in a turn in which it Fell Back.

1CP

THE FLUX ABATED

Poxmongers Stratagem

Worrying greedily at its victim, the Daemon Engine devours puissance to heal its ever bleeding hide.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when an enemy model is destroyed as the result of an attack made by a model in a **POXMONGERS DAEMON ENGINE** unit from your army. One model in that unit can regain up to D3 lost wounds.



THE FERRYMEN

Called the Ferrymen or the Brethren of the Fly, the 6th Plague Company garrisons the Plague Fleets, and acquires new ships for their suppurating armadas. It boasts large numbers of Blightlord Terminators riddled with the parasite known as the Droning.

WARLORD TRAIT: THE DRONING

A blizzard of fist-sized daemonic flies whirls around this warlord, biting, stinging and scrabbling madly to drive his enemies back in terrified revulsion.

When a Morale test is taken for an enemy unit within 12" of this Warlord, add 2 to the result.

PUTRESCENT RELIC: THE FERRYMAN'S SCYTHE

This grotesquely oversized weapon lops great chunks of armour and flesh from its victims, each lumpen gobbet taken as payment for ferrying the victim's soul through the veil and into Nurgle's malignant garden for all eternity.

Model equipped with a plaguereaper only. This Relic replaces a plaguereaper and has the following profile:

WEAPON	RANGE	TYPE	S	AP	D
The Ferryman's Scythe	Melee	Melee	+4	-3	3
Abilities: Plague Weapon (see <i>Codex: Death Guard</i>). When resolving an attack made with this weapon, an unmodified wound roll of 6 inflicts 1 mortal wound on the target in addition to any other damage.					

1CP

VERMID WHISPERS

Ferrymen Stratagem

The compound eyes and keening whispers of countless daemonic flies help guide these warriors' aim.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase when a **FERRYMEN BLIGHTLORD TERMINATORS** unit from your army is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made by a model in that unit, add 1 to the hit roll.

2CP

ON DRONING WINGS

Ferrymen Stratagem

Buzzing clouds of plague flies billow from these warriors, acting as vectors for their unholy gifts.

Use this Stratagem at the start of the Movement phase. Select one **FERRYMEN** unit from your army. Until the end of the turn, the range of that unit's aura abilities is increased by 7" (note that the Nurgle's Gift ability still only affects enemy units within 1" of an affected friendly unit).



MORTARION'S CHOSEN SONS

Those of the 7th Plague Company have the honour of being the Daemon Primarch Mortarion's Chosen Sons. They are plague brewers and dark alchemists, and are blessed by Nurgle with the Crawling Pustulance, also known as boilblight, lumpen splatter and Nurgle's fruit.

WARLORD TRAIT: CRAWLING PUSTULANCE

This warlord's flesh is thickly layered with pustules that absorb the fury of his foe's attacks, and which burst and spatter corrosive fluids across those who try to flee him.

When resolving an attack made with a melee weapon against this Warlord, subtract 1 from the hit roll. When an enemy unit (excluding units that can FLY) within 1" of this Warlord Falls Back, roll one D6; on a 2+ that unit suffers D3 mortal wounds.

PUTRESCENT RELIC: VOMITRYX

This gruesome weapon contains a microscopic warp portal that leads directly into the festering guts of the Great Unclean One Ku'Gath. When its nozzle is opened it spews ferocious gouts of the Daemon's highly corrosive bile.

Model equipped with a plague sprayer only. This Relic replaces a plague sprayer and has the following profile:

ALEMBICHAL NARTHECIUM

Mortarion's Chosen Sons Stratagem

Gifted to his sons by Mortarion himself, this arcane device invigorates their unclean physiognomies.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Select one MORTARION'S CHOSEN SONS PLAGUE SURGEON model from your army. Until the end of the battle, replace that model's Tainted Narthecium ability with the following:

'Alembichal Narthecium: When making a Disgustingly Resilient roll for a friendly MORTARION'S CHOSEN SONS INFANTRY model whilst its unit is within 3" of this model, you can re-roll a roll of 1 or 2.

PLAGUE BREWERS

Mortarion's Chosen Sons Stratagem

No Plague Company boasts a more gruesome array of potions, poisons and unclean fluids than the 7th.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase when a MORTARION'S CHOSEN SONS unit from your army is chosen to shoot with. Until the end of that phase, plague belchers, plaguespurt gauntlets and plague spewers that models in that unit are equipped with have a Damage characteristic of 2.



DEATH GUARD NAME GENERATOR

This section will help you to assign suitably revolting names to your diseased champions of Nurgle, to further build the background and personality of your army. If you wish to randomly generate a name for one of your Death Guard warriors, you can roll a D66 and consult one or both of the tables below. To roll a D66, simply roll two D6, one after the other – the first represents tens, and the second represents digits, giving you a result between 11 and 66.

CREATIONS OF BILE

In this section you'll find rules for Battle-forged armies that include Chaos Space Marine Detachments taken from the followers of Fabius Bile. With these vile tools you can take your collection of Heretic Astartes and twist it into something altogether more foul and terrible.

The rules presented in this section are intended to be used in addition to those presented in *Codex: Chaos Space Marines*.

This section contains an updated datasheet for Fabius Bile that replaces the one found in *Codex: Chaos Space Marines*, and rules for fielding Detachments of his creations. You will also find additional Relics and Stratagems that can be used with these Detachments.

KEYWORDS

If Fabius Bile is your Warlord, units from your army can replace their <LEGION> keyword with **CREATIONS OF BILE**. Note that you cannot replace the <LEGION> keyword with **CREATIONS OF BILE** unless Fabius Bile is your Warlord.

ABILITIES

Units in **CREATIONS OF BILE** Detachments gain the following abilities:

THE SPIDER'S WEB

If your army is Battle-forged, all Troops units in **CREATIONS OF BILE** Detachments gain this ability. Such a unit that is within range of an objective marker controls it even if there are more enemy models within range of it. If an enemy unit within range of the objective marker has a similar ability, then it is controlled by the player who has the most models within range as normal.

CREATIONS OF BILE LEGION TRAIT

If your army is Battle-forged, all **CHARACTER**, **INFANTRY** (excluding **CHAOS CULTIST** units), **BIKER** and **HELBRUTE** units in a **CREATIONS OF BILE** Detachment gain the Legion Trait below.

Note that, as per the Shadowy Allies rule in *Codex: Chaos Space Marines*, Fabius Bile himself – as well as **FALLEN** units – cannot benefit from the Experimental Enhancements Legion Trait.

Experimental Enhancements

All of Fabius Bile's Terata are chemically and physically altered by his experiments, elevating their abilities above those of similar beings – for now...

Add 1 to the Movement and Strength characteristics of models in units with this Legion Trait.

FABIUS BILE

Clonefather. Primogenitor. Spider. Fabius Bile has laboured under many epithets during his long and wicked life, but none truly convey the unrepentant evil of this heretic crypto-scientist. A twister of flesh and a sculptor of nightmares, Fabius Bile is one of the most abominable renegades to blight the Emperor's realm.

Fabius Bile is accursed throughout the galaxy. Formerly an Apothecary of the Emperor's Children, amidst the carnage of the Horus Heresy Bile aided his Legion in their journey into the embrace of the Chaos God Slaanesh. He altered their brain chemistry to sharpen their senses, tainted their bodies with xeno-surgery and connected their pleasure centres directly to their nervous systems so that every stimulus would bring them unholy joy. As Terra burned in the fires of Horus' final, doomed assault, Bile departed the Throneworld with a hand-picked cadre of altered servants, decrying the traitors' goals as prosaic and short-sighted and earning the eternal ire of his Daemon Primarch Fulgrim in the process.

Bile moved through the war-torn Imperium, selling his services to rebel commanders for prisoners, genetic samples and ancient technologies. Yet as their warriors degenerated into ravening monsters and their worlds burned in the fires of genetic apocalypse, Bile's customers came to rue the day they struck a daemon's bargain with the Spider. Eventually, Fabius Bile found his way to the Eye of Terror. There, he offered his services to the highest bidders. He set up a new base upon the benighted crone world of Urum and transformed it into a nightmarish realm of twisted horrors.

The shattered Traitor Legions who make their home in the Eye of Terror have particular need of Bile's skills. His augmented warriors and bio-magicks can give a warband a vital edge, yet it is the skills he learned as an Apothecary that are most precious. The Traitor Legions

need to extract the progenoid glands of the fallen in order to create new Chaos Space Marines and – while he is far from alone in being able to perform the requisite surgery – Bile is pre-eminent in this art.

There are some who have accused Fabius Bile of hiding always behind his armies of altered soldiers, but they are dangerously foolish. Bile is a surgically skilled warrior who has augmented his already post-human

biology with the very finest results of his experimentations. In one hand he wields the Rod of Torment, which causes sanity-blasting agony with the slightest wound, and in the other the gruesomely poisonous Xyclos Needle. Meanwhile, upon his back Bile bears the Chirurgeon, a mechanical harness of spidery limbs and life-preserving hypodermics which serves to heal its master's wounds as swiftly as his foes can inflict them.

Another Pair of Hands: If Fabius Bile is accompanied by a Surgeon Acolyte, after rolling the D3 for the Enhanced Warriors ability, you can add or subtract 1 to that roll result (e.g. a D3 roll result of 3 could be a roll result of 2 or 3). RELICS OF BILE

Over the millennia, Fabius Bile has amassed countless arcane treasures and twisted weapons – some of his own cunning artefacts – with which to gift his favoured creations. These foul devices are precious to Bile, and their use often proves to be an integral part of his latest twisted experiments.

If Fabius Bile is your Warlord, you can give one of the following Artefacts of Chaos to a **CREATIONS OF BILE CHARACTER** model from your army, instead of other Artefacts of Chaos presented elsewhere. Named characters, such as Fabius Bile, already have one or more artefacts, and cannot be given any of these artefacts. Note that some Relics are weapons that replace one of the model's existing weapons. Where this is the case, you must, if you are using points values, still pay the cost of the weapon that is being replaced. Write down any Artefacts of Chaos your models have on your army roster.

HELM OF ALL-SEEING

This baroque helm sports an array of additional sensors, allowing the wearer to take in a tremendous amount of battlefield information in a short space of time – providing, of course, they have the requisite additional sensory organs to process it...

Whilst a model with this Relic is on the battlefield, you can roll one D6 for each Command Point you spend to use a Stratagem; on a 5+ that Command Point is refunded.

HYPER-GROWTH BOLTS

These rounds contain small amounts of Bile's most unstable growth-inducing concoctions. When introduced into the bloodstream, armour splits as the victim's musculature rapidly swells before collapsing under its own weight.

When you give a model this Relic, select one bolt pistol, boltgun or combi-weapon (see *Codex: Chaos Space Marines* wargear lists) that model is equipped with. When a model with this Relic shoots with that weapon, you can choose for it to fire a Hyper-growth bolt. If you do, you can only make one attack with that weapon, but that attack always wounds on a 2+ (unless the target is a **VEHICLE** unit) and has a Damage characteristic of 4.

LIVING CARAPACE

This living armour moves seamlessly in concert with its wearer. With a thought, the wearer can secrete growth hormones into these plates, thickening them, repairing damaged sections and making them nigh invulnerable.

At the start of your turn, a model with this Relic regains 1 lost wound. In addition, when resolving an attack against this model, add 1 to the saving throw (invulnerable saves are unaffected).

CREATIONS OF BILE STRATAGEMS

If your army is Battle-forged and includes any **CREATIONS OF BILE** Detachments (excluding Auxiliary Support Detachments), you have access to the Stratagems shown below and on the following page, meaning you can spend Command Points to activate them. These help to reflect the unique strategies used by Bile's warriors on the battlefield.

1CP

VENOMOUS CLAWS

Creations of Bile Stratagem

These warriors unsheathe diamond-hard envenomed claws from their fingertips, ready to rend and tear the foe.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when you select a **CREATIONS OF BILE** unit (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS**) to fight. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made with the close combat weapon profile by a model in that unit, an unmodified hit roll of 6 automatically scores a hit and successfully wounds the target (do not make a wound roll).

1CP

MONSTROUS VISAGES

Creations of Bile Stratagem

Bile's experimental ministrations have left these warriors as freakish monsters. Cursed with clusters of compound eyes, distended, fang-stuffed jaws or myriad other grotesqueries, they are hideous to behold.

Use this Stratagem at the start of any phase. Select one **CREATIONS OF BILE INFANTRY** unit from your army (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS**). Until the end of the turn, when resolving an attack made by an enemy model within 6" of that unit, subtract 1 from the hit roll.

1CP

MACROTENSILE SINEWS*Creations of Bile Stratagem*

Injecting auto-stimulants into their enhanced muscles, these warriors leap and bound across the battlefield.

Use this Stratagem at the start of your Movement phase. Select one **CREATIONS OF BILE INFANTRY** unit (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS**) from your army. Until the end of the turn this unit can be chosen to charge with even if they Advanced this turn and when an Advance or charge roll is made for this unit, add 1 to the result.

1CP

THE MASTER IS WATCHING*Creations of Bile Stratagem*

Feeling Bile's expectant gaze from across the battlefield, his enhanced warriors strive slavishly to impress.

Use this Stratagem in your Shooting phase or the Fight phase, when a **CREATIONS OF BILE INFANTRY** unit from your army (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS**) that is visible to and within 12" of your Warlord is chosen to shoot or fight with. Until the end of that phase, when resolving an attack made by a model in that unit, you can re-roll the hit roll.

1CP

DERMAL CHITINATION*Creations of Bile Stratagem*

These fighters secrete a hardening resin through their skin, temporarily toughening their already resilient hides.

Use this Stratagem in your opponent's Shooting phase when a **CREATIONS OF BILE INFANTRY** unit from your army (excluding **CHAOS CULTISTS**) is selected as the target of any attacks. Add 1 to that unit's Toughness characteristic until the end of that phase.

1CP

TAKEN ALIVE*Creations of Bile Stratagem*

To be snatched away by Fabius Bile and his creations for experimentation is an altogether nightmarish fate.

Use this Stratagem in the Fight phase when a model from an enemy unit is destroyed as the result of an attack made with a melee weapon by a model from a **CREATIONS OF BILE INFANTRY** unit from your army. For the rest of the battle, when taking a Morale test for that enemy model's unit, each model in that unit that was destroyed that turn is treated as two models for the purposes of taking that Morale test. Each enemy unit can only be selected for this Stratagem once.

1CP

SUPREME CREATION*Creations of Bile Stratagem*

This warrior was already a dark champion of Chaos. Now, he is both more and less – monstrously powerful but yoked utterly to Fabius Bile's will.

Use this Stratagem before the battle. Choose one **CREATIONS OF BILE CHARACTER** model from your army that is not Fabius Bile. You can give that model one of the abilities from those listed below. You can only use this Stratagem once per battle.

Prime Test Subject

Whilst Bile has unlocked a portion of the mysterious bio-alchemy used in the creation of the warriors of the Adeptus Custodes, only the strongest test subjects survive the rampant cell transformations.

Add 1 to the Strength and Toughness characteristics of this model.

The Master's Hound

With enhanced sensory and aggressive instincts, this practically mindless creature is used by Bile to hunt down those he wishes to conduct further research upon.

Add 1 to Advance and charge rolls for this model. In addition, if this model made a charge move, was charged or performed a Heroic Intervention, add 1 to the model's Attacks characteristic until the end of the turn.

Ravenous Biology

Through a quirk of chemistry, this creation's cells repair at a tremendous rate, but require constant fuelling. This can only be achieved by devouring the flesh of their foes to satiate their physiology.

When this model would lose a wound, roll one D6; on a 6, that wound is not lost. In addition, at the end of the Fight phase, this model regains D3 lost wounds if any enemy models were destroyed within 1" of them this phase.

The Ynnari believe the former, and would see the slumbering god Ynnead rise to conquer the Aeldari's greatest nemesis: the Chaos God Slaanesh, who will stop at nothing to defeat them.

Now Yvraine, leader of the Ynnari, has dreamt of Slaanesh's huntress, who is bent on slaying her, feasting on her soul and ending the threat posed by Ynnead forever. Calling upon elements of the disparate Aeldari factions – Asuryani, Drukhari, Harlequins, Corsairs and Exodites – Yvraine stands on the verdant maiden world of Iathglas ready to meet her race's fate.

Ascension of Humanity

In the wake of the Great Rift's opening the galaxy is beset by nightmarish phenomena, from temporal distortions to apocalyptic visions, where terrors uncoil from fevered dreams. The tear in reality and the warp storms around it hide a dark scheme woven by the Imperium's oldest enemies, who intend to use these occurrences to bring about Mankind's damnation. But hope in these times is not yet dead, and wellsprings of faith have given rise to miracles and manifestations of the Emperor Angelic.

A shining beacon of faith in a galaxy beset by war, the Talledus System was a stronghold of the Imperial faith. Now it has become a war zone, through which the Adeptus Astartes and Sisters of Battle confront the foul Heretic Astartes. The Imperium has congregated here in armies of divine right, while zealous eyes view the worlds of the Talledus System with malignant intent.



PSYCHIC AWAKENING: BLOOD OF BAAL

A Shadow Deeper Than Night

In the wake of the tearing open of the Cicatrix Maledictum, the galaxy has been plunged into terror. Nightmarish psychic phenomena manifest in the Imperium Nihilus, the worlds there cut off from Terra and the guiding light of the Astronomican.

In the scarlet-lit region of the Red Scar, a deeper shadow coils its way through the Imperium's vulnerable worlds. The ravenous Tyranids of Hive Fleet Leviathan threaten the home world of the Blood Angels Chapter and hundreds of systems besides. Around them, the insidious Shadow in the Warp is making its presence known in the minds of those standing against the xenos swarms. Yet hope remains with the scions of Baal.

The Blood Angels and their successor Chapters are bloodied but unbowed. They continue to engage the questing tendrils of the Tyranid invasions, striving to ensure Humanity's future.



PSYCHIC AWAKENING: RITUAL OF THE DAMNED

Storm of Sorcery

Following the emergence of the Great Rift and its tearing of the galaxy in two, terror has beset the stars. Horrifying, reality-defying phenomena are commonplace. One individual embraces these portents with relish: the Daemon Primarch Magnus the Red.

Having brought the Daemon world of Sortarius, known as the Planet of the Sorcerers, into realspace from the Eye of Terror, Magnus seeks to enact a ritual to accelerate Humanity's psychic potential across an entire sector. The consequences for Mankind if he is successful are near impossible to imagine.

But the Imperium is not without hope. The Grey Knights, Daemon hunters supreme, are aware of his foul machinations, and seek to prevent the ritual from coming to its hellish conclusion. Calling upon the mighty Dark Angels Chapter for aid, the two forces will stop at nothing to defeat the Crimson King.
